Conscious bias in national media!

As I watched Monday night with RTE investigating abortion and followed by Katie Hannon's discussion proposing that Religious Formation be removed from schools, I was shocked by the extreme level of bias in both programmes. I pay for my TV licence along with the majority of the nation and am not happy that all that I hold most valuable is not just dismissed, but rubbished.

Human life, from the moment of conception is precious and with great potential and purpose regardless of viability or imperfect quality as judged in an increasingly material world. People are not material! We have responsibility to care for human life from the moment of conception. The conceived child is not the property of the parents or of lesser value than the mother or father. Nothing justifies the destruction of human life at any stage of existence.

Referring to an abortion as a 'delivery of a baby' makes is sound normal, but changes nothing in fact. For whatever purpose or by whatever means, abortion involves the killing of human life that is real and present and with purpose, even if we do not understand what that purpose might be. Did anyone really know the purpose of any conceived person until they had a chance to bring out what was/is within through the opportunity that life presents? The right of freedom of choice for the woman was mentioned a number of times. However, every freedom has a consequent responsibility.

The Catholic services exposed in the programme were of an extreme nature and reflected very harsh and judgmental response to the women who had abortions. Presenting the extreme, in any story, does not reflect the real truth or choices available. Yes, authorised Catholic organisations will seek to protect human life at all stages but not by control or by seeking to cause deeper guilt.

The call to remove Religious Formation from all schools followed on in perfect tandem with the investigation on abortion. The argument against Religious Formation/Education was strident, forceful, biased and aggressive. The purpose of Catholic education does not seek to oppress anyone or disregard any other faith or non-faith; it seeks to respect everyone.

If parents and teachers in indicate that they want their school changed from Catholic patronage, they will be supported and enabled. There is opportunity for change of patronage but most people are not opting for a different choice yet. That may change as time moves on, but let us not try to build a society that is without the beauty of different cultures, faiths, non-faiths, diversity and the freedom to live according to our chosen values.

Change is ongoing throughout time but let the change not grow out of anger, hatred, fear, selfishness or dismissal of any group of people or individual regardless of the person in early conception or any other stage of life. The dignity y of each person is linked with every person past, present and not yet even conceived. Meaningful decisions must be made in a meaningful way!

Travelling Abroad

Before you go on a trip, make sure to do a few essential things. First, check the rules and requirements for the country you are visiting. You might need a visa, or your passport may need renewing. You should think about getting travel insurance in case something goes wrong. If you plan to drive, ensure your driver's licence is valid. While you're away, it's good to know where the nearest Irish Embassy or Consulate is, just in case you need help.

Before you travel

Check travel advice and entry requirements for your destination

Check the travel advice and entry requirements for the country you are travelling to before you travel abroad.

You might need a visa, this depends on your destination. You can find out if you need a visa on the Department of Foreign Affairs website.

Is your passport in date?

Check that your and your families' passports are in date before you book. Passport Online is open to all applicants. You can get information on how to renew your passport or how to apply for your child's first passport on www.dfa.ie

The latest passport turnaround times are available on the Passport Service's website.

Do you have travel insurance?

You should get travel insurance for yourself and your family. If you have a travel insurance policy already, or travel insurance is included in your health insurance policy, you should check that you are covered for hospital treatment for COVID-19.

You should bring your European Health Insurance Card with you if you are travelling to the EEA or Switzerland. You cannot use your EHIC in the UK. But you can still get the healthcare you need. You will need to show your Irish passport to the GP or hospital. Make sure that it is in date, it must be renewed every 4 years and each family member needs their own. An EHIC does not replace travel insurance.

Ireland and Australia have a reciprocal health agreement. This means that Irish visitors to Australia will receive emergency services and assistance towards the cost of prescribed drugs and medicines on the same basis as persons ordinarily resident in Australia.

Irish citizens travelling in the UK are entitled to access healthcare through the Common Travel Area.

While abroad

Note the address, telephone number and opening hours of the Irish Embassy or Consulate in the country you are visiting. In countries with no Irish diplomatic or consular representation, you may seek emergency assistance from embassies or consulates of other European Union countries. On its website, the Department of Foreign Affairs provides advice on how to stay safe while abroad and what to do in an emergency.

Travel tips and information about driving abroad is available on our website including what to do if your passport is lost or stolen.

Everyone here at Lucan Drama are delighted to announce that we have another great evening of 1 act plays which will be showing Upstairs at Courtney's in Lucan Village.





We hope to conclude with an exhibition in the Library at May along with displays and a video displaying the journey of the students in their project.



Manchester to Liverpool Ultra Marathon

Anne McGrane completed the Manchester to Liverpool Ultra Marathon on Good Friday in a time of 10 hrs and 31 minutes. This is a 50 mile race (just over 80km) that follows the Trans Pennine Trail, the Manchester Ship Canal and the River Mersey from Manchester to Liverpool.

Anne came 1st in her age category and was 44th lady in a field of 112 females.



Anne had a great race. She executed her race plan to perfection on the day and felt strong throughout. Club colleagues Lorraine Heffernan and Bernie Stapleton travelled to support Anne and she described them as the best support team ever.

Quest Glendalough Multisport Adventure Race April 6th. A wet and blustery morning awaited participants in the quaint village of Laragh, Co. Wicklow. At the race start line, the steep Derrybawn mountains acted as a shield to the 50km/ph winds and lured many into a false sense of security, a calm before the storm. However, once participants hit the roads, they were exposed to the full force of what Storm Kathleen had to offer, transforming the day into a gruelling endurance test for all involved. Storm Kathleen certainly added to the experience with at one point a gust of wind being so strong it caused bikes to pretty much come to a standstill, but also assisting those participating giving a little welcome boost when hiking up the various trails! Some trivia on who this particular storm was named after; not only after one Kathleen but two Kathleen's - both from Ireland! Kathleen Kay McNulty who is remembered as one of the mothers of computer programming Kathleen Lonsdale was a respected scientist in the area of crystallography Quest Glendalough Multisport Adventure race consists of a mix of mountain trail runs, road cycling and kayaking. Unfortunately (or fortunately) the kayak was cancelled due to the extreme weather conditions and yellow wind warnings. The 5 Lucan

Harriers Brian Haverty, John Rabbett, Fiona Allen, Aileen Coughlan and Geraldine Lavin, tackled two distinct routes: the Challenge Route (21km, 317m elevation gain) and the Sport Route (43km, 950m elevation gain), both commencing (on bikes).

Challenge Route. Leaving the Laragh GAA pitch we passed Claravale Church and bridge & then started a 300m long climb (which felt longer!), but what goes up must come down and we enjoyed some nice downhills on the R755 before dismounting as instructed by marshals for a steep downhill taking us to a narrow bridge. We all started to cycle over the bridge, and we were faced with a very steep hill, so everyone promptly dismounted (no marshal instruction needed, just common sense!) and we'd a straight road back to Laragh GAA transition area. The weather played ball and apart from occasional crosswinds we did well. We then started in to an 8k trail run or run/walk. My legs always feel heavy when I get off the bike and it was comforting to see the majority of participants walking the first 200 metres of so. We went out and back 4k to the Upper Lake, passing close to the Glendalough round tower and treated with spectacular views the whole way. A final run around the Laragh GAA pitch brought us to the finish line and welcome food & refreshments.

Sport Route. Meanwhile, the Sport Route ascended the notorious Shay Elliott climb. From there, participants dismounted for a demanding 6km trail run around Braigue and Cullentra mountains. Following this, it was time to get back on the bikes with an enjoyable and welcome descent down into Glenmalure with stunning views of the Glenmalure Valley, returning to Laragh. This week the Irish Cancer Society were before Health Committee. In their statement they stated that one in two people in Ireland will be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime. Since the commencement of the National Cancer Strategy in 2017 the ICS identified that due to the failure of funding the implementation of the strategy has stalled and is having a detrimental effect on those relying on cancer services. One of the issues that I spoke on was the lowering the age of the Brest Screening Programme. Currently the age of screening for women is from the age of 50 to 69. I argued that the breast screening programme should be offered to women from the age of 40 onwards. A quarter of breast cancer diagnosis are women are under the age of 50.


University of Ireland, Maynooth" under the 1997 Universities Act.
