Hospital Fees

Public in-patient and day service hospital fees were abolished on 17 April 2023. This means that the daily charge for staying in hospital for public patients no longer applies from this date.

Social Welfare

An extra payment of €200 will be paid to anyone who gets a social welfare payment that qualifies for the Christmas Bonus or the Working Family Payment in the week starting 24 April 2023.

Carer's Support Grant

What is the Carer's Support Grant?

The Carer's Support Grant is paid to carers once a year by the Department of Social Protection (DSP). It used to be called the Respite Care Grant.

You can use the grant in whatever way you like. You can use it to pay for respite care if you wish, but you do not have to. There is information on our website about respite care facilities.

In June of each year (usually on the first Thursday of the month), the DSP pays the grant automatically to carers getting Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit, or Domiciliary Care Allowance. Only one Carer's Support Grant can be paid for each person getting care.

The Carer's Support Grant will be paid on 2 June 2022.

Rules for getting the Carer's Support Grant: The grant is paid automatically to people getting Carer's Allowance (both full rate and half-rate), Carer's Benefit or Domiciliary Care Allowance. If you are not getting one of these payments, you can still qualify for the Carer's Support Grant.

To get the Carer's Support Grant, you must be: Aged 16 or over; Ordinarily resident in Ireland Caring for the person on a full-time basis Caring for the person for at least 6 months - this period must include the first Thursday in June Living with the person being cared for (or if you do not live with them you must meet certain criteria, for example the person must be able to contact you quickly and directly)

During this 6 month caring period, you cannot: Work more than 18.5 hours per week as an employee or self-employment

Take part in an education or training course for more than 18.5 hours a week

Get Jobseeker's Allowance or Jobseeker's Benefit Sign on for credited contributions

Live in a hospital, convalescent home or similar institution

If you are caring for more than one person, a grant is paid for each of them.

Rate of Carer's Support Grant: In June 2023, the Carer's Support Grant is €1,850. It is paid once a year for each person you are caring for. It will be paid on 1 June 2023. It is not taxable.

How to apply: If you are getting Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit or Domiciliary Care Allowance, you do not need to apply for the Carer's Support Grant. It will be paid automatically paid to you in June. If you are not getting one of the above payments, you should fill in an application form CSG 1 (pdf) for each person you are caring for.

When to apply: You can apply for a Carer's Support Grant for any given year from April of that year until 31 December of the following year.

For example: You can apply for the Carer's Support Grant for 2022 at any time from April 2022 up until 31 December 2023. The grant rate for 2022 was €1,850.

Where to apply: You can get a Carer's Support Grant application form from your Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office or Citizens Information Centre.

FUNERAL OF THE LATE COLONEL VESEY, D.I.

Yesterday the remains of the late Churles Colthurst Vesy, D.L., J.P. Colonel Commanding the 5th Battalion Royal Dublin Fusiliers, were interred in the family mortuary chapel within the demesne of Lucan House, Lucan. The Kildare and Lucan tenantry of deceased attended and assisted by the labourers on the estate, bore the remains of their deceased landlord from his late residence. A guard of honour composed of seventeen sergeants of the Royal Dublin Fusiliers under the command of Captain Mansell, took part in bearing the remains to the grave. The remains were encased in a rich brown oak sarcophagus with brass fittings and breastplate, the latter bearing the following inscription

Colonel Charles Colthurst Vesey Born 18th June 1826 Died 11th May 1885

The burial service was conducted by the Rev C W Benson Incumbent of Lucan. The following were the chief mourners EC Vesey(son), Colonel Colthurst, M.P. (brother): Sir George Colthurst, Bart (nephew). Colonel GW Praser and HC Warren.

The following noblemen and gentlemen attended-The Duke of Leinster, Lord Annally, HL Barton, General Brooke, Arthur Hamilton, Charles Hamilton, Alex Kirkpatrick of Goolmine, Wm Moran, John and James Wills, John A Walker. Colonel Vernon Quartermaster Lowery etc, etc.

> The funeral arrangements were entrusted to Messrs Arthur Jones and Son, 135 Stephen's Green.

The above are some of the Vesey family buried in the ruins of the original and first Lucan church which be seen in the grounds of Lucan House.

On **Saturday 9th September** you can view these graves, and also the magnificent **Lucan House**, **Sarsfield Monument** and **Bath House**.

There will also be musical entertainment and kiddies attractions. To top it all, Sam will be there with his Birds of Prey.

All the above is due to the kind permission of H.E. The Italian Ambassador Mr. Ruggero Corrias and his wife, Ms. Vania Lorenzo.

A young man who notes down his wishes for his day plus his regrets for yesterday, crunches the paper in his fist, shakes a little incense, and burns his offering under an old oak tree – an eager prayer between earth and heaven.

A recent I.F.I. archival film gave a fascinating glimpse of Lucan Spa Hotel, its under-road tunnel to the pump house etc, plus a sweep of the cascading weir, and later a film of Fr. Payton, the Rosary Priest at prayer.

Could anyone identify the history of 2 broken arches in a keystone with 2-3 cut stones occurring in the walls of both the Italian Ambassador's property, and opposite in the wall of the now Ardeevin development? A rainwater grating near Tandy's Lane junction gives a line of sight to both inserts – Would gateways have existed between Agmondisham Vesey and the old Lucan Lodge properties??

English: As part of the English Department's literacy programme, a *Drop Everything And Read* (DEAR) week was held in the school recently. All Junior Cycle students took part and the principal announced the 20 minute periods every day where the students stopped working in their classroom and took the time to read quietly a book that they had brought in.

Some of the more popular tiles read by students included *The Everything Stone*, *Artemis Fowl and the Artic Incident*, *The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas*, *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*, *The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde*, *The Hunting Party*, *Private Peaceful*, *The Hunger Games* and *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. Some other students preferred such literature classics as *Robinson Crusoe*, *Lord of the Flies*, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, *Animal Farm*, *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* and *The Hobbit* so it was great to see such an eclectic mix of reading material in the different classes.

Well-being: Just before the Easter holidays, as part of Well-being in Coláiste Phádráig, our students took part in the "Hello, how are you?" campaign. This initiative by Mental Health Ireland, dedicated Thursday, 30th March as the day to practice saying Hello and asking the question How are you? with true meaning. The unique premise of this campaign is to encourage people to not just ask the question but to support people in knowing what to do next. In Well-being classes, students were introduced to the 5 step process (Hello, Engage, Listen, Learn, Options) as set out by Mental Health Ireland. Since the beginning of the school year, first year students have been working continuously on developing the skill of mindful listening and the process of 'reflecting back' during their wellbeing classes. The skill of paying attention & listening attentively is such an important life skill to develop and grow! When we feel seen, heard and listened to, we connect with others and we feel supported and valued. Asking the very simple question: How are you? with true meaning, can make a big difference to someone's day. Creating, maintaining & staying connected with others can help tackle loneliness, create a sense of belonging

and purpose and help us build and maintain relationships. It really is so powerful! Well done to the students who practiced saying *Hello* & asking *How are you?* with such true meaning, attention and care!

Awards: Well done to 5th yr **Calum Conway** who won the *Mark O' Neill Student of the Month* Award for March in recognition of his outstanding work with the Greens Schools Committee.

Congratulations to 2nd yr **Ciarán O' Sullivan** who won the *Sports Star of the Month Award* in recognition of his excellent displays for the school's 2nd yr basketball, hurling and football teams

The figures were released as part of the Capital Programme Progress Report at the April meeting of South Dublin County Council. 80 new households were added to the homeless register as a result. GP services and public health nurses:

I've again been raising this issue with both the HSE and the Minister for Health. GP services are private operations but there's not enough proactive supports to help GPs set up in developing areas, such as Adamstown, Lucan has been hit due to several retirements and while there are several new services, there is still a deficit. Meanwhile, many parents of young children are affected by a shortage of public health nurses in the Lucan area. I acknowledge that recruitment is a national issue, but some areas are more impacted than others and there should a better way to equalise existing resources.
