## **A Thick Skin**

I drove west during the week and enjoyed the abundance of the lovely spring colour of yellow on the verges all the way. Huge bunches of daffodils filled the middle of the motorway from Dublin to east Westmeath and a mixture of furze and primroses from there westwards. The lower temperatures of the western border delays to flowering of daffodils!

I remember saying to someone, some years ago, how lovely it was to see the flowering furze in Spring! The person concerned looked askance at me when I asked if he had the same burgeoning of yellow on his farm. When he left the room, his wife laughingly reminded me that they had a farm where growth was lush and the land was very fertile and that the acreage was extensive! I had just insulted my friend's husband unintentionally! Gulp! Yes, I come from a part of the country where furze and rushes grow in abundance as both thrive in acidic and water logged.

My association of memory with furze, rushes and bogs is wonderful! As children we played in fields among the furze, so that we were permanently covered in scratches during the summer. Furze bushes are great for hide and seek, as going over a bush is too painful so that escape time is given while the seeker runs around. Rushes were great for weaving and making whistles. The bog was a place where everyone came together to share the task of cutting turf, turning it and footing it before bringing it home.

How we perceive anything is based on our own experience and on judgments expressed by others. Both the so called 'good' land and 'bad' land had something to offer. Turf is produced from the bog. The furze flowers may be used to make beautiful and delicious syrup or whin wine. Furze is used as hedging and for decorative purposes also. Beef cattle grow best and in greater numbers on more fertile land. Wheat and corn favour good well drained land also.

We grow what is possible in each particular situation in that particular time.

Having recently experienced loss in my own life, almost nothing of advice given by others is helpful to me. I've had to find my own way along this unique journey, consequently with lots of great learnings, healings and kindnesses gained. The place where the thorns grow and are felt can be given a purpose that produces fruit. Life is not a smooth run of experiences so when given lemons, it's best to try to make lemonade. I'll always look fondly on the furze bushes and see the beautiful flowers and associated fun rather than the thorns. I've got a skin thick enough to deal with the thorns. I've got shelter in good friends!

## Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit

What is Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit?

Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit (JPRB) is a new social welfare payment you can get if you lose your job. It is linked to your previous earnings and will be available from 31 March 2025. You must be fully unemployed to get JPRB.

## What happens to the existing Jobseeker's Benefit?

Jobseeker's Benefit (JB) is still available if you are not eligible for JPRB because:

You are a part-time, casual or seasonal worker Your employment is based around the school or academic year

Your last day of employment is before Friday, 28 March 2025

If you are unemployed or your last day of employment is before Friday, 28 March 2025, you can apply for JB. If you were self-employed, you can apply for Jobseeker's Benefit (Self-Employed).

If you are getting JB when the new JPRB starts, you stay on JB until your entitlement ends.

## How much is Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit and how long can I get it for?

The amount of JPRB you get depends on how much you earned from employment previously.

You can get JPRB for up to 9 months if you have 5 years of PRSI contributions from employment. If you have 5 years of PRSI contributions, the rates of JPRB in 2025 are:

60% of your earnings up to a weekly maximum of €450 for the first 3 months.

55% of your earnings up to a weekly maximum of €375 for the next 3 months.

50% of your earnings up to a weekly maximum of  $\in$ 300 for the last 3 months.

You can get JPRB for up to 6 months if you have between 2 and 5 years of PRSI contributions. If you have between 2 and 5 years of PRSI contributions, the rate of JPRB in 2025 is: 50% of your earnings up to a weekly maximum of  $\in$ 300 for 6 months

The minimum weekly payment is €125.

#### Unemployed before 28 March 2025

If you are unemployed or your last day of employment is before Friday 28 March 2025, you can apply for the existing Jobseeker's Benefit scheme. If you are getting Jobseeker's Benefit (JB) when the new Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit starts, you will stay on JB until your entitlement ends. You will need to return to work before you can qualify for JPRB.

#### How to apply for Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit

You should apply for Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit (JPRB) within 6 weeks of losing your job. A late application could affect your entitlement.

#### Apply online

If you have a verified MyGovID account, you can apply online on MyWelfare.ie.

If you have a basic MyGovID account and a Public Services Card, you can verify your account on MyGovID.ie.

#### If you cannot apply online

You can apply for Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit at your local Intreo Centre or Branch Office.

#### Appeals

If you do not agree with a decision on your JBRB application, you can appeal the decision.



## St. Joseph's College

#### **Red-Light Camera:**

My motion requesting the installation of a redlight camera at the Hillcrest, Newcastle Road junction has been passed. Following the completion of national trials and the establishment of guidelines by the NTA/RSA, South Dublin County Council will consider implementing this measure to improve enforcement and road safety.

#### **Water Concerns:**

My motion addressing concerns over discoloured water has been passed, continuing my efforts to highlight water-related issues. The latest reports of unlicensed hydrant use affecting residents' supply are deeply concerning. Additionally, I have raised the issue that Irish Water has yet to implement a licensing system similar to the one previously managed by the local authority. ## St. Mary's Camera Soirée

This week we have some more photographs involving reflection and refraction submitted by Brendan.

Joe got a lovely photograph of evening in St. Edmundsbury last Tuesday evening.







Donal submitted a photograph of Malahide Estuary. This photograph reminded me of the collapse of the Malahide Viaduct into Broadmeadow Estuary almost 16 years ago on 21st August 2009. At about 18.30 that evening passenger train, travelling from Balbriggan to Pearse, passed over the Malahide Viaduct and its driver witnessed a section of the viaduct beginning to collapse into Broadmeadow Estuary. Within minutes of the report of the accident by the driver Pier 4 of the Malahide Viaduct had collapsed into the Broadmeadow Estuary. Miraculously, there were no fatalities or injuries to any members of the public or staff.





Anna was in Waterford and submitted photographs of the quay and Reginald's Tower which is located in area which today is known as the Waterford Viking Triangle. The tower was built by the Anglo-Normans after their conquest of Waterford, replacing an earlier Viking fortification. The tower has been used as a mint, a prison, and a military storehouse and it currently houses the Waterford Viking Museum.

There are two other museums in the Viking Triangle which is collectively known as the Waterford Museum of Treasures - The Medieval Museum and The Bishop's Palace Museum. Quite close by are the recently opened "Wake Museum" located in a 15<sup>th</sup> century Alms House, which explores themes of life and death, and the Irish Museum of Time.
