Electricity Account Credit

It was announced in Budget 2024 that domestic electricity customers will get €450 off their electricity bills.

The energy credit will be paid in 3 instalments of €150. The payments will be made in the December 2023, January 2024 and February 2024 billing cycles.

The Commission for the Regulation of Utilities (CRU) is overseeing the scheme.

Text scam warning

A scam alert has been issued to warn people about receiving text messages that tell them to click on a link to claim an energy credit. These texts link to a site that looks like gov.ie.

The Government is not offering any such scheme and people are warned not to click on the link or enter any personal details.

If you are unsure how to avoid scams when online shopping, you can use CheckMyLink to verify the authenticity and safety of the website. This website is managed by Cyber Skills, in partnership with ScamAdviser and An Garda Síochána.

Fire Safety in your Home

The three Golden Rules to follow to make sure that you and your family are safe from fire are: Prevention: The best way to be "fire safe" is to make sure that fires never happen.

Detection: A fire alarm that works will give you time to get everyone out of the house.

Evacuation: Help very young, old or sick people to leave the house. Get out and stay out.

Domestic Violence Leave

If you are experiencing domestic violence and abuse, you may need to take time off work for urgent and essential matters relating to your situation.

This could be for medical visits, legal proceedings, counselling, looking for alternative accommodation or accessing domestic violence services. It might not be possible to do these things outside your work hours or you may need to keep them hidden from your abuser. From 27 November 2023, you have a legal right to 5 days' paid domestic violence leave if you need to take time off work because of the abuse. There is no minimum service required to qualify. The leave can be taken if you are directly experiencing domestic violence and abuse, or if you are supporting a 'relevant person'. The domestic violence can be ongoing or have occurred in the past.

You do not have to give your employer notice to take the leave in emergency circumstances. You should give notice if you are able to.

The entitlement to domestic violence leave comes from the Work Life Balance and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2023.

Dear Local Representatives,

I trust this message finds you well. I am writing to draw your attention to the planning application SD23A/0292, which pertains to the proposed construction of an electric crematorium at Esker Lawns Cemetery.

Having thoroughly reviewed the application and the observations submitted thus far, I earnestly urge you to consider objecting to this development based on several compelling reasons that render it unsuitable for Lucan. These concerns include, but are not limited to:

Inappropriate Location: The proposed construction site is situated in a cul-de-sac residential area, which raises significant questions about its compatibility with the surrounding community.

Air Quality and Health Considerations: Given the nature of the facility, there are valid concerns regarding potential impacts on air quality and public health, which demand careful consideration.

Noise Pollution: The operation of a crematorium introduces the risk of noise pollution, posing a potential disturbance to residents and the serene atmosphere of the neighbourhood.

Environmental Impact: The development could have adverse effects on the local environment, and it is crucial to assess and address these implications thoroughly.

Impact on Proposed Greenway: The proposed crematorium's proximity to the greenway raises concerns about the potential disruption and degradation of this important community asset.

Traffic Impact: The increased traffic, not only in the vicinity of the cemetery but also in Lucan village, particularly during school times, poses a serious concern that warrants thorough examination.

Impact on Local Foot Traffic: The development may adversely affect local foot traffic, potentially disrupting the natural flow of pedestrians in the area.

I kindly request that you thoroughly investigate these concerns and strongly consider objecting to the proposed development. Your careful consideration and advocacy for the best interests of the Lucan community are vital in ensuring the preservation of our community's quality of life.

Thank you for your attention to this matter, and I trust you will give due diligence to the community's concerns.



Lucan Planning Council

Traffic in the village and M50 toll increases:

Lucan village is being suffocated by traffic avoiding the M50 toll, and further increases announced this week will make matters worse. Transport Infrastructure Ireland is responsible for tolls on the M50, and it is now time to move the position of the toll further north, beyond Castleknock. Lucan cannot take any more transit traffic avoiding the toll.

We are calling on all Local Election candidates, and TDs to unite on this issue and to put aside political interests for the sake of the community and the village. Lucan has borne the brunt of traffic avoiding the M50 toll for far too long and it's time to have a united voice calling for fair play and for relief. Moving the toll position northwards makes sense and is a fairer solution than burdening Lucan with transit traffic beyond our capacity.

This issue must be dealt with together with the planning for the village in the light of SDCC acquiring Lucan House and grounds as an amenity and a place of historical interest. We are calling for a united front on this.

Bus routing: Thank you for ongoing support for LPC bus petition and NTA meeting. There is now overwhelming support for our initiative. More details next week.

These are not litter bins!


We are asking residents to leave them alone and don't place anything green or otherwise into them.


