A Plea for help from Ethiopia

Many of you will remember Fr. Kidus Amanuel, who spent time with us in both St. Patrick's & St. Mary's several years ago. At that time Fr. Kidus was studying in Dublin at the former All Hallows College. Since then, he has returned to his native Ethiopia. Ethiopia has been in the turmoil of a civil war for several years since his return. Life there has been dangerous, and great hardship has been imposed on the innocent people caught up in the war. All aspects of normal life have been disrupted and weakened by the mayhem all around.

Fr. Kidus is based in Tigray and he describes his situation in his own words: "In November 2020, conflict broke out in Tigray, and has resulted in loss of lives, severe injuries, displacement, hunger, gender-based violence and trauma. Many schools, service centres and many other things that form part of normal daily life have been weakened or destroyed due to the conflict. All of us I would say, have been traumatised by the evil war. Thank God, a peace deal and cessation of hostilities was signed and we are hopeful that our lives will slowly return to some level of normality.



As a priest working in these difficult circumstances, I felt obliged to remain among my people, and thank God I am still alive. I now want to continue to do all that I can to support children and families to rebuild their lives. I can do this by providing material support like food and clothing, and through group support, training, helping to rebuild a community ravaged by war. I need your support.

Fr. Philip has kindly designated the proceeds of the "Giving tree" in St. Mary's this Advent / Christmas season for the support of my work in Ethiopia and I am deeply grateful to him, and for any support that you can offer. May God reward your kindness.

I greatly enjoyed my time among you in Ireland and I thank you for your ongoing friendship and support."

Will I be cut off if I can't pay my electricity or qas bill?

Feeling the cold this winter? Do you know about the winter ban on electricity and gas disconnections?

If you're struggling with bills, you can't be disconnected during winter during the following periods:

1 Nov 2024 - 31 Mar 2025 - if you are a vulnerable customer.

9 Dec 2024 - 17 Jan 2025 - all other domestic customers.

Paying your electricity and gas bills

When you sign up to an electricity or gas supplier, you should get regular and accurate bills. Suppliers must give you a range of options for paying your bills.

Increases in energy costs have had a big impact on the cost of living for households. If you are worried about paying your electricity bills, help is available. You can contact your energy supplier to explore payment options or contact MABS for help and advice.

Help with rising electricity bills Budget 2025

It was announced in Budget 2025 that all domestic electricity customers will get €250 off their electricity bills.

The Electricity Account Credit will be paid in 2 instalments of €125. The first payment will be made before the end of 2024, the second will be made in the new year.

Changes to VAT rate

Since 1 May 2022, the rate of VAT on gas and electricity bills reduced from 13.5% to 9%. It was announced in Budget 2025 that the reduced rate will be extended until 30 April 2025.

If you are struggling to pay your bills

Help is available if you are worried about paying your electricity bills.

You can:

Make an appointment for free confidential advice with the Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS).

Contact your supplier to discuss payment options. Contact your local Citizens Information Service. Your electricity or gas supply could be cut off if you do not pay your bills. MABS has more advice if you have problems paying your bills.

Ban on disconnections during winter

Customers having problems paying their bills cannot be disconnected during the winter months.

Vulnerable customers

Vulnerable customers who are registered as priority services customers cannot be disconnected at any time.

You are a priority service customer if you register with the CRU as being critically dependent on electrically powered assistive devices. More information is available on our website.



Christmas is a special occasion in all Murphy family homes, yet we make time to meet up prior to Christmas for family *fun*, this includes sharing memories, a competitive quiz, Kris Kindle swapping followed by some tasty treats to keep the hunger at bay, and concluding with the regulatory Carol singing. This year we have two new additions to our family, the big question is how will Sinéad and Julia cope when all the Murphys gather together and the room echoes to their voices. As in all stories there can be a twist or turn, so returning to Christmas Day 1973, being responsible for cooking my first Christmas dinner, I followed the example of my late Mother including warming the plates...... However, in my enthusiasm I forgot I had heated the plates, lifted a hot plate and immediately dropped it onto the floor.....Luckily we did enjoy sharing the plate of Christmas Dinner that remained.
