Thank you once again for your kind wishes and warm welcome. May I take this opportunity to impart God's blessing upon you and all your loved ones, and may the Light of the World fill your hearts with hope, peace, and joy this holy season.

250th Anniversary of the Founding of the Presentation Sisters

Tribute from the Presentation Sisters in Lucan

On Christmas Eve, 1775 the Presentation Sisters were founded by Nano Nagle and three companions in a small mud cabin in Cork city. This year is the 250th Anniversary of that event which will be celebrated throughout 2026.



In 1867 the Sisters arrived in Lucan to serve the people as educators in both Primary and Secondary schools. This community of teaching sisters said good bye to Lucan in 1994. The legacy and spirit of Nano Nagle lives on in the schools through the dedication and leadership of wonderful school staffs.

Today the convent has a new name, 'Mission House,' and a new community of Presentation Sisters whose work is to support and care for the Presentation Missionaries who come to Ireland for rest and renewal from all five continents.

As we approach the 250th Anniversary, we thank the people of Lucan and its surrounds for your support and companionship down through the years. We will remember you especially in our prayers on Christmas Eve. Website: www.pbvm.org

Congratulations & Gratitude to the Presentation Sisters from the Lucan Parish Community

The Presentation Sisters were founded 250 years ago by Nano Nagle in Cork. Nano Nagle founded seven schools in Cork in her lifetime despite the fact that Catholic education was suppressed and warranted imprisonment for any providers. Nano was innovative and very brave in her endeavours. She didn't throw it in the face of the authorities but instead found ways of gathering schools of boys and girls quietly.

Nano Nagle was born to a wealthy family and could have lived a very different and comfortable life. She was urged into her educational mission by her experience of God's call through the poverty of families and children of the time for whom she knew education could be transforming.

Today, there are over 2,000 Presentation Sisters worldwide, carrying on the Mission of Nano. Her recognition as one of the greatest women of Ireland derives from dedication to the poor and oppressed. Her mission between the cutting edge of the gospel and the miseries of her day inspires the Presentation Sisters to minister in joyful service, responding to current needs throughout the world in faithfulness to the gospel.

The Universal Church recognized Nano on October 31, 2013, as a woman of faith, hope and heroic virtue by declaring her **Venerable**. Once evidence of

an authentic miracle is attributed to Nano's intercession with God, she acquires the title Blessed. Another miracle initiates canonization and public recognition of Nano as a Saint.

The Presentation Sisters arrived in Lucan in 1867 for the expressed purpose of providing education for the girls of Lucan and surrounding areas. They were welcomed with a joyful and a loudly applauding crowd as they entered the community in horse drawn vehicles. As in many other parts of the country, this provision of education was made available by the Presentation Sisters (along with other religious orders) long before the state was to follow suit. We have two Presentation schools in our community of which we are very proud: Scoil Mhuire Girls National School and St Joseph's Girls Secondary School. While there are no Presentation Sisters working in the school the gifts (charism) of the foundation is protected and supported by CEIST, the Trust in which the schools are now vested. The values of Faith, Justice, Education, Hospitality and Compassion are core to the vision of every Presentation school.

Nano Nagle was often called the Lady of the Lantern as she carried gentle light to guide her steps through the alleyways encouraging families to engage in education and avail of charitable services when

needed. She shone a light of hope and of courage in a time when it could cost dearly to step out of line.

We offer a heartfelt congratulations and gratitude to the Presentation Sisters as we all celebrate the 250 years since the foundation of the congregation in 1775. Each member gave/gives of themselves

generously so that they are both free to serve God in prayer and in service to those who need their services. While the number of sisters active in service in Ireland is relatively small now, the numbers are growing rapidly in other parts of the world in response to both vocation and needs. We are fortunate that Presentation Sisters continue to live among us here in Lucan where we enjoy their companionship and their contribution to parish life. As the sisters remember us in prayer, we will remember them in prayer also.

The legacy of Nano Nagle and the Presentation Sisters continues to be relevant today. We need to continue to hold up shining the lantern of hope into the dark corners of today's world. May we be inspired by the courage of Nano Nagle to stand up for what is truly needed in order to always seek to preserve the dignity of every person in our community, particularly those on the margins.

Visitors in the school: This week we welcomed Shane Moynihan TD and Barry Andrews MEP by Zoom to talk with students. Shane Moynihan came into our senior Politics classes for a Q&A. They covered a wide range of topics on the economy, foreign policy, transport, migration, misogyny and studying Politics in university. The students really enjoyed it and several are considering a career in Politics. Our TY European Ambassadors attended a webinar from Barry Andrews MEP all about the key issues in European Politics. They will now use this information to spread awareness across the school year.

Basketball: Huge congratulations to our U16 basketball team who are now regional winners, after defeating Manor House in the final on Thursday

last. It was a very tight match, with St. Joseph's only going ahead at the very end of the 3rd quarter. The team will now go on to play in the National playoffs in January. Thank you to Manor House for a great game and to all our supporters. Special shout out to Saoirse O' Dowd, MVP on the day.

Our proposal to address the many flaws in the C-Spine bus route will be launched this Saturday 20th December 2025, at 11am Spar Green Dodsboro. This proposal is to facilitate users with a disability, elderly, local access to nursing homes and other areas such as Chapelizod, St. Mary's Hospital and Phoenix Park. The bus route could be called C25 with a bus every hour, serving areas omitted in C-Spine.

Route would begin at River Forest Leixlip serving Confey rail station, Leixlip Village, Leixlip Park, Young's Garage, onto R403 to new link road beside Shackleton Estate to Lucan Adamstown rail station, via Dodsboro, Lucan Village, Liffey Valley, Chapelizod, Island bridge, Parkgate St. to city centre terminating at Custom House Quay or Connolly rail Station.

Our research shows this is the most feasible route to address many of the problems of C-Spine.

Direct bus access to Blanchardstown Hospital is still a major part of our campaign. We are grateful for the continued support from our local representatives, and we are always glad to meet you.
