### **Public Holidays**

There are 10 public holidays in Ireland each year (increased from 9 in 2022). Public holidays may commemorate a special day or other event, for example, Saint Patrick's Day (17 March) or Christmas Day (25 December).

From 2023, there is a new annual public holiday in early February to mark St Brigid's Day. The public holiday is the first Monday in February,

except where St Brigid's day (1 February) happens to fall on a Friday, in which case that Friday 1 February will be a public holiday.

On a public holiday, sometimes called a bank holiday, most businesses and schools close. Other services (for example, public transport) still operate but often have restricted schedules.

Upcoming public holidays: Christmas 2023 Christmas Day, Monday 25 December 2023 Saint Stephen's Day, Tuesday 26 December 2023 New Year's Day, Monday 1 January 2024

When a public holiday falls on a day which is not your 'normal working day', you are still entitled to benefit for that public holiday.

For example, you may get an extra day of annual leave, or an additional day's pay, or a paid day off within a month of the public holiday. However, you do not have any automatic legal entitlement to have the next working day off work. See 'Public holidays and your entitlements' on our website.



### **Bah Humbug!!!**

### James Gandon 1743 - 1823

This Christmas Eve 2023 will be the bicentenary of renowned architect James Gandon's death. Famed for several Dublin buildings, including the Custom House, the Four Courts, King's Inn, and the portico of the House of Lords at College Green (*now Bank of Ireland*), his work was not always well-received by Dubliners, deeming the Palladian style not suitable for the times. Gandon's view was that these special buildings should be grand and stand out as being very important – all are popular landmarks today.

In 1805, Gandon purchased the Canonbrook estate on Esker Hill in Lucan, and following renovations, he took up residence in 1808. He also acquired the Pettycanon area of Lucan – *ie* the area between The Hollow on the Lock (Adamstown) Road, and Main Street, which is bordered by Primrose Lane to the west and to the east the border is roughly where the Esker Lawns/Lucan Heights estates are.

Although coming to the end of his career when he took came to Lucan, the architect's influences are to be seen in several local buildings including St. Andrew's Church which was designed by his pupil, Henry Aaron Baker. Dating back to 1823, the church is on a site donated by James Gandon in return for a leather-bound prayer book annually, and on condition that there would be no burial ground at the site.

The old Lucan Garda Station and Primrose Hill House have also seen some influences connected to Gandon.

Born in England, he was married and had family there, but spent most of his later life in Ireland. One of his sons, Captain James Gandon, an army physician, lived in Griffeen Lodge, just behind Courtney's Bar.

On his death in 1823, hundreds of Lucanians attested to his popularity when they walked to his funeral in Drumcondra where the great man was laid to rest on Christmas Eve. It would not be unreasonable to assume that James Gandon was a wealthy man when he died, but on the contrary, he was financially

broke, and ended up sharing a grave with antiquarian Francis Grosse, in Drumcondra Churchyard.



James Gandon's portrait hangs in the National Gallery. Two artists were involved, Tilly Kettle who painted the head, but fled Dublin from his creditors, with the picture being finished by William Cuming.



An Post recently issued two stamps to commemorate the bi-centenary of James Gandon's death.

From his home in Canonbrook House, Gandon would have viewed Lucan's Main Street across the fields, with the farms of Westmanstown in the distance. One wonders what he would think of the view today! *M.M.*

Both students are highly deserving of this as they applied themselves to the programme from the outset with the support and care of their teachers and SNA's in the classroom. Congratulations to both students.

Ty Charity Committee: Transition Year Charity Committee have gathered boxes for Team Hope. These will be delivered to the local representative of the charity ahead of Christmas. Thank you to all who contributed.



Work Placements: All our students were fortunate to get placements for the first session of Work Experience and many had glowing reports from employers. We are always so proud of the way our students represent the school and indeed themselves and their families with Work Experience. I would like to thank you all for your efforts to secure the placements and to extend my thanks to all employers.

The students engaged in a reflection session after session 1 and it was interesting to see the broad variety of placements that the students took part in and how they had learned from the experience. They had a new appreciation for the demands of

working life and the efforts parents and guardians make on their behalf.

The next session is from the 22nd of January until February 2nd - students need to return their completed forms to me by the 15th of January. A reminder that Garda vetting is required in some work settings and needs to be applied for weeks in advance to ensure it is available for a particular date. Students need to be 16 before vetting can be applied for.

Some of our students were lucky enough to get placements at Microsoft for an extra week of Work Experience. To be fully insured and allowed to accept such positions, it is vital to ask for permission in advance and to provide an email with confirmation of such placements. Other students attended placements at The Defence Forces, An Gardai Siochana, Trocaire, Jigsaw's Walk in my Shoes, DCU, TCD and SAP Technologies.

Gaisce Awards: Five of our sixth year students took on the challenge of completing the Silver Gaisce Award last year. They dedicated a minimum of 1 hour per week for 26 weeks to each of the three challenge areas; personal skill, community involvement and physical recreation. They completed their adventure journey in Glendalough in February 2023. The awards were recently presented to students by Gaisce Development Officer, Ger Brady. Both winners were presented by lovely chess sets by tournament organiser Mr. Moran.

Winter Fair: The Coláiste Phadraig Winter Fair was held in the canteen on Thursday 14th Dec and it proved to be a huge success with all stock completely sold out! The TY students decorated the canteen with Christmas decorations and then set up their own stands packed with an assortment of goods and wares for sale. There was a wide selection of tasty treats available to students and staff on the day from popcorn to cinnamon rolls, homemade cookies to multi-cultural meals! The Spice Fusion stall was a huge attraction on the day with students lining up for the delicious South Indian snacks, the home cooked Chicken Shawarma (a tasty Middle eastern dish) biryani, a mixed rice dish from Modern India, Samosa, a fried South Asian pastry with a savoury filling and freshly sliced onion bhaji on offer.
