Join the protest!



I always feel that this time of year marks the beginning of a kind of huge protest. All around our housing estates colourful lights appear. festooning usually sober house fronts, and shops and shopping centres become great beacons of colourful light, in sharp contrast with the dull grey cold drabness of these December days. It's right that we should protest against the creeping darkness that envelops us with inch by inch

stealth until it peaks on December 22nd. There's something about darkness that we humans naturally abhor, and coupled with the plunge in temperature, it tends to drag our mood down too. Colourful lights and Christmas trees always seem to me as a sign or our refusal to give-in, a shout of protest and of hope, while nature does its worst.

For Christian believers of course these weeks are much more than a cry of protest, they are a celebration of joy. These four weeks of December, known as Advent in church terms, offer a time and an opportunity to reflect anew on 'The light that the darkness could not overcome' (John 1:5) The light that Christ's coming brings to the earth is not something that shines for December alone and is packed into boxes in the attic for the rest of the year, no, it is a light that guides us in all the moments of our lives, when we embrace it in true welcome.

These four weeks of Advent challenge us to find time amid the frenzy that the build up to Christmas brings, to reflect quietly on the meaning of it all.

The birth of Christ is something that happened in history a long time ago, and generations before us have faithfully passed on that living light through the millennia to our present age. Each year, Advent invites us to renew our faith in that central mystery, and in turn to become the 'passers-on' to those coming after us.

Winter will pass, the darkness will yield to spring light, colour will return to what seems a dull and drab December landscape, for thus is God's wonderful creation. Darkness to light, new life from death. He spells it out quite clearly.

So join the protest. But keep in the mind the mystery at the heart of it all. An Advent and Christmas without Christ is all too much like 'Hamlet without the Prince."

Gift Vouchers

A gift voucher is a voucher, usually given as a present, which you can use instead of money to pay (or pay in part) for goods and services.



Gift vouchers can be paper gift certificates, electronic cards or gift cards. They can be issued by a single business or for a group of shops (such as a shopping centre). There are many benefits to gift vouchers but there are also some risks, for example, if you lose the voucher, it expires before you use it, or if you're unable to spend the remaining balance. It is important you know the conditions and rules that apply before buying a gift voucher.

Irish law introduced extra protections for gift vouchers sold on or after 2 December 2019, under the Consumer Protection (Gift Vouchers) Act 2019 (pdf).

The following rules apply to gift vouchers sold after 2 December 2019:

Gift vouchers must either have no expiry date or be valid for at least 5 years The seller cannot make you spend the gift voucher in one single transaction

The seller cannot charge a fee to change the name on a gift voucher (if you must register a name on the voucher)

If the balance remaining on a gift voucher is more than €1 after you buy something, the seller must refund the balance to you. They can give you cash, make an electronic transfer or give you another gift voucher

Exceptions to the rules The rules do not apply to:

Vouchers you can only use to buy goods and services at a discounted price, from a specific seller on a set date, or for 3 months or less. For example, vouchers from deal websites such as Groupon or Pigsback

Vouchers you got as part of a customer loyalty or promotion scheme

Vouchers you got as a refund for goods you returned to a seller

Vouchers and gift cards sold before 2 December 2019. The expiry period and the terms and conditions that applied at the time of purchase still apply to these vouchers

The rules do not apply to electronic money gift cards.

What is an electronic money gift card?

In general, electronic money gift cards (for example, One4all gift cards), are cards that can be used in different shops.

Rules that apply to electronic money gift cards:

Before you buy the card, you must be told about the conditions for using the e-money card, including any fees

Fees must be proportionate and in line with the costs actually incurred by the business who issues the card to you

Electronic money gift cards are regulated under the European Communities (Electronic Money) Regulations 2011. The Central Bank is responsible for enforcing these regulations.

Que Sera, Sera! Whatever will be will be

I just listened to Doris Day singing Que Sera, Sera which opens with 'When I was just a little girl, I asked my mother what would I be'. I'm sure that like all mothers, my mother, Marcella Kenny, would have advised that the future was not ours to see. Coming into this Christmas season I am gobsmacked by the role that consumerism has infiltrated the meaning and character of Christmas, spreading its message globally. This message is nuanced with suggestions that glitz and glamour, the latest fashions and must-haves are essential to ensuring a happy Christmas for our families and friends. While the arrival of November's Black Friday. which now extends to Black Friday week, is an opportunity to bag the best bargains early, alleviating the nightmare of last-minute shopping!!!!

My sister Veronica, recently recounted to me her experience of spending Christmas in Ecuador. She felt that despite the creeping influence of wealthier nations to the north, the message for most was coming together as family sharing food.

They also have an astounding mania for dressing their Baby Jesus, there were market stalls devoted to selling clothes for the baby with a general feeling of



happiness everywhere. They witnessed the most amazing parade. A group of about thirty extremely elderly people dressed in snow white sheets with homemade angel wings, kept together

by holding onto a long rope, reminiscent of the old French school lines. They were so happy and so proud when we asked if we could take their picture, while many family



groups pulled carts with live nativity tableaux mounted on them. Veronica reminded me that we need to do better at promoting the good.

Gathering together, storytelling, sharing memories and the Murphy Family Quiz are all hallmarks of our Christmas. Stories as, when our promised turkey hadn't arrived by Christmas morning, a neighbour donated her turkey's legs to



ensure we had turkey to accompany the ham, my brother lamenting that he didn't have a proper

Christmas dinner in 1972 as my eldest daughter decided to enter the world earlier than expected, the year the chimney went on fire, plus stories from the older generation as, when Grandad

Murphy would cycle from Longford to Erra and back to collect the goose to grace their Christmas

table or the goose that escaped from my Grandad Kenny arms as he carried it into their home in Manor Street. Can you imagine the glee of my aunts and uncles as they watched



their Dad chasing the goose round the yard before being recaptured and prepared for the oven. These stories are told and retold and never lose their enchantment.

Society today benefits from legal advancements, so many made over our lifetime, to our rights and entitlements as citizens. Yet, I believe, there is a poverty to our thinking. I know that children are often more inquisitive about the box that contains a gift, rather than its contents. Christmas has a clear message to offer all of us, it is a message of



Hope. The custom of placing a lighted candle in the window, as a welcome to our home, reminds us of Mary and Joseph seeking shelter. A clear connection can

be made to those tents that are housing our homeless throughout our cities and counties, yet a solution hasn't been found to address this matter. The traditional image of the Crib, the baby laying in the manger with the Ox and Ass keeping watch must surely be confined to the archives of history and storytelling rather than being replicated time and again in the twenty first century.

Having a coffee in Earl Street recently, it was wonderful to witness the buzz of a busy capital city, a city welcoming its citizens and tourists alike. The GPO looked resplendent, in the weak November sunshine, encouraging the shoppers and visitors to come inside and explore their interior, and we accepted that unspoken invitation. The concourse itself echoes the grandeur of a bygone era, while the statue of Cú Chulainn symbolises, as President Eamon de Valera said, the dauntless courage of the Irish people. I would suggest that it is worthwhile to visit the GPO and walk in the footsteps of history, visit the Museum and enjoy their Christmas tableaux. The traditional way we express such a hope is through the lighting of a candle. Symbolically, the candle represents the little goodness in a world of overwhelming evil and darkness. Above all as I recount my Christmas meanderings my wish is that we all take a moment or three to think about the true meaning of Christmas and that we are not shy of spreading that message of hope and goodwill.

Scores from Lewis, Paisley and Alseny in the final 1-4 secured a welldeserved 19-point victory for the team. Both the u16s and u19s will now play their Plate "A" Finals at the Obalte Basketball Club in Inchicore this Friday 1st December. The 16s are 1st up at 10:30am against either Castleknock College or Oatlands College while the u19s will play directly after them. Some players play for both teams so these players are going to have to be carefully managed to ensure maximum performance levels on the day! It would be a sensational achievement to win both Finals on the same day so we wish the two teams and Ms. Gough the best of luck and hopefully there will be double celebrations in the school afterwards!

Soccer: Our senior soccer team stage a remarkable comeback last week in their opening Dublin League group stage match against Hartstown CS.
