Free solar PV (Photovoltaic) if you're medically vulnerable

Did you know?

Do you use life support equipment such as a dialysis machine, ventilator or similar device? The Solar PV Scheme for Medically Vulnerable Customers is for people who depend on life-protecting electrical medical equipment and technology.

Since October 2025, the scheme has been extended to all homeowners who are registered under the life support category of the Priority Services Register with their energy supplier. If you qualify for the scheme, a Solar PV company will visit your home to assess if your home is suitable for a solar PV system and install it for free if it is.





The Lost Village Green

Further to recent correspondence in the Lucan Newsletter about the lost village green, your readers might like to know the amount of money that is being spent by South Dublin County Council on what amounts to the destruction of something that made Lucan village special. The earliest photographs of the village that I have seen feature the Green with its trees!

I understand that in all something in excess of €8 million is being spent by the Council on "works" in our village and that the cost of the work, if it is ever finished, on what was our village green is of the order of €3 million. I understand that a further €1.3 million is being spent on whatever is being built in the space opposite MacDonalds. It is legitimate to ask the question if this expenditure is an appropriate use by the Council of tax payers' and rate payers' money. It would be helpful to have formal confirmation or otherwise of these figures from our local representatives on the Council who have been strangely silent in relation to these works.

It would also be reassuring to have confirmation from our local representatives that there is no truth in the rumour circulating in the village that these works are a form of revenge because the Council's earlier proposals in relation to parking in the village were rejected by the people of Lucan.

Courtney's thatch still stands today, But poor Old Willow's gone away.


Residents watch with weary eyes, The cost too high, the loss unwise, A village changed beyond repair, Its gentle heart now stripped and bare.

The forwards, led by the work rate of Henry Greene, Oscar Brennan and Micheal O'Brien, pressed relentlessly, while backs Killian Costello, Karl Quinn and Danny Ryan delivered quality ball forward, even if that early dominance was not fully reflected on the scoreboard. In the 10th minute, a long free from Costello caused chaos in the Judes square and Paidi Murphy reacted quickest, kicking and then pulling on the ball on the ground to find the net. Lucan mixed long and short puck-outs

effectively through goalkeeper Evan Flynn,

with Patrick Cosgrove and Brian Whelan taking several short restarts and using possession well. Lucan closed out the first quarter with a Mills free after good link play by Brennan and Charlie Mooney to find Sam Curran, who drew a foul. A crucial moment came when Judes broke through. only for Flynn to produce a big save and Danny Ryan to clear the danger. At the other end, the halfforward line of Brennan, Greene and O'Brien dominated in the air, and the inside trio of Mills, Coakley and Murphy always looked threatening, though a series of wides and shorts meant Lucan did not fully capitalise. Meeting with Garda Superintendent: This week,

TDs meeting with Council CEO: A number of issues were highlighted including the pool delay (now due by Spring hopefully), village works (Feb/March with easing of road works for Christmas lead-up) and multiple land rezoning proposals (directed by Government) including St Ed's housing, going to consultation in new year. I described this as an abomination, but there are other proposals that make no sense especially with our traffic problems, no tie-ins of infrastructure and facilities, and of course the recent delay of DART+ South West for a further five years.

On a related matter, CEO Colm Ward said that SDCC is looking at a system to prevent concurrent road works being carried out in an area. This must have been informed by Lucan as we have suffered recently.

ReZoning: The Government has instructed all local authorities to reopen their County Development Plans and re-zone land for housing. Under the revised 2025 guidelines for South Dublin County Council the baseline requirement is now 3,217 new dwellings per year up to 2034. I have raised serious concerns about proposed zoning changes in Adamstown (an Adamstown extension) and other local locations. While councillors may not be able to prevent the Minister's push for re-zoning I will ensure any rezoning does not proceed without proper planning, public services and robust safeguards for residents.

The church was in ruins from the 1630s but the graveyard continued in use into the 20th century. Josie also submitted a photo of the Prospect Tower, also known as the Tyrconnell Tower, which is in the grounds of Carton



House and which was allegedly built by Richard Talbot, the 1st Earl of Tyrconnell (c.1630 to 1691). Richard was an Irish politician, courtier and soldier who was made Viceroy, or Lord Deputy of Ireland, by James 11 of England. Richard was one of 16 children!



Donal submitted one of his efforts from our recent workshop on still life photography and a nice photo of autumn leaves which he calls "Gold Leaf".

Finally, Joe submitted a photo of a branch of a tree laden with red berries that he found in Chalet Gardens last week. Not being a gardener, I cannot identify the tree.
