Local Property Tax

What is Local Property Tax and who has to pay it?

Local Property Tax (LPT) is an annual tax charged on residential properties in Ireland.

The tax is based on the value of your property on 1 November 2021 – the value of the property on this date is used to calculate your LPT for the years 2022-2025.

If you own a residential property on 1 November 2024, you must pay LPT for 2025. If your property was not liable on 1 November 2023 but is liable on 1 November 2024, you need to submit an LPT return by 2 December 2024.

How do I pay my LPT?

If you already pay LPT by a recurring method such as direct debit, this automatically continues for 2025 unless you change it. Recurring methods include deductions from your salary, pension or social protection payment.

If you pay with a method that does not automatically repeat, you need to confirm your payment method for 2025. You need to do this by:

- 2 December 2024, if you spread the payments over the year
-

- 10 January 2025, if you pay in a single payment

If you have changed bank, you may need to update your direct debit.

How much do I have to pay?

The LPT you pay is based on the market value of the property on the valuation date, which is 1 November 2021. This valuation continues to apply for LPT until 2025.

If you are making an LPT return for the property for the first time, you must assess the value of your home. You can do this by:
Using Revenue's online valuation tool.
Using the Residential Property Price Register.
Using information sources about local property values, such as newspapers, local estate agents or property sales websites, such as daft, myhome.ie and geowox.

Having your property professionally valued

When you have worked out the value of your property, you must submit this to Revenue with your LPT return by 2 December 2024.

LPT exemptions and deferrals

Some properties are exempt from LPT. If your property is exempt, you still need to assess its value and submit an LPT return. You may also be able to defer payment of LPT.

In certain circumstances, you can delay paying some or all of your Local Property Tax (LPT) until a later date. This is known as a deferral.

You may qualify for a deferral if:

Your income is below a certain amount.

You are the personal representative of a deceased person who was liable for LPT.

You have a Debt Settlement Arrangement or Personal Insolvency Arrangement.

Paying would cause you too much financial hardship.

If you meet the deferral requirements, you can choose to defer the LPT until your financial circumstances improve or the property is sold. However, this does not mean that you are exempt from the LPT. Interest is charged on the deferred amount and the deferred amount remains a charge on the property.

If you qualify for partial deferral, you can defer 50% of your LPT and pay the other 50%.

Soccer: Our 1st yr soccer team continued their fine run of form with a comprehensive 3-0 win against Firhouse CS last Thursday in the 1st rnd of the Leinster Cup. Lucan took a deserved lead right on half-time when Jack Palmer poked home from close range after bit of a goalmouth scramble.

In the 2nd half, Firhouse began to play through Lucan's press a little more, but ironically this actually suited our 1st yrs more and they began to launch their trademark lightning fast counterattacks. Finn O' Sullivan in particular came alive as he revelled in the extra space to run in to out wide. It was no surprise when he doubled Lucan's lead mid-way through the half with a low, stinging strike from the angle of the box that swept across the Firhouse goal and into the bottom corner. Ryan Webb added third goal with the final play of the game, as he raced onto a brilliant through ball from the influential Alex Deegan, held off the attentions of the Firhouse centre back, before guiding the ball home with a sweetly struck right-footed strike into the near corner.

The team will now travel to Drogheda later this week to face St. Mary's DS in the 2nd round of the competition.

Our **u15 soccer team** defeated Hartstown CS 3-2 last Thursday in their 3rd group stage match of the Dublin League. Both teams knew beforehand that qualification from the group was no longer possible as the top two spots were out of reach. Nevertheless, it was still a highly competitive game with both teams going all out for a confidence-boosting victory. James Dillon gave Lucan the perfect start with a clinical finish inside the box in the 1st minute of the game. Harstown equalised mid-way through the half before Omar Ibrahim restored Lucan's lead soon after with a fizzing right-footed strike across the keeper into the far corner. Hartstown equalised again in the 2nd half before Finn Garner netted the winner for Lucan with 15mins remaining.

Well done to 6th yr Eoin Maher, who represented Leinster Schools in the six match series Interprovincial Tournament held at the AUL Complex in Clonshaugh over the weekend. Eoin played at right back for Leinster in their 2-1 defeat to Connacht and right wing as they defeated Ulster 3-1 and drew 1-1 with Munster, to finish in joint 2nd place overall. The tournament is used as the key recruiting process for the u18 Republic of Ireland International squad at schools' level. International head coach, Derek O' Brien, was present at the Interprovincial tournament and he will select an



extended panel to attend the 1st assessment day, which is scheduled for next Saturday in the AUL Complex.

Football: Our 1st yr football team were beaten 6-18 to 2-05 by Maynooth PP team last Wednesday in their 2nd and final group stage match of their Dublin League campaign. Maynooth opened up a commanding lead by half-time but Lucan gave a much improved 2nd half display. Eolann Maher scored two well-taken goals from wing-back while Daniel Kavanagh scored 5 points from midfield.

Our **senior footballers** played their 2nd and final group stage League match against Coláiste Choilm, Swords on Monday. Unfortunately, a poor 1st half left the team with a mountain to climb as they trailed by 15 points at one stage. Lucan rallied towards the end of the half but still were down by 9 points.
