The lockdown continues.....

There were no surprises is the Taoiseach's announcement on Tuesday evening last, the level 5 lockdown is set to continue until April 5th when it will be reviewed. Businesses already stretched to the limit must now face weeks more of closed doors and no earning potential. Families already stretched financially must continue to try and make do on the special payments in place. At least our schools will partially reopen, and for Leaving Cert students this must surely be good news.

For the Churches of all denominations the extended lockdown will mean empty pews right through Lent Holy Week and Easter. We would all dearly love a return to normality but the common good has to take precedence over all other considerations. Until the numbers signal that it is safe to do so we simply have to be prudent and follow the scientific medical advice.

The arrival of the vaccines heralds hope on the horizon and we can only pray that as more and more of the vulnerable receive their dosage the numbers will continue to recede and the death rate fall, so that our gatherings will no longer pose a danger to one another. In the meantime, the churches have their Internet presence, which while no substitute for our gathering in faith physically, does at least provide a point of contact for us all. In fact this week the clergy of the four main denominations in Lucan Village had a Zoom meeting to chat and pray together as we face the future.

In many ways these are stressful times which will undoubtedly have long term consequences in every area of our lives. It's unlikely that everything will return to the way it was, and that will mean some uncomfortable adjustment to the new realities that will inevitably emerge.

Cardinal Jean-Claude Hollerich of Luxembourg has written that the pandemic may have accelerated the secularization of Europe by 10 years. In an interview with the Vatican Newspaper L'Osservatore Romano the Cardinal said he believed that the number of Catholics going to church would decrease as a result of COVID-19.

Asked whether he thought the Church in Europe would emerge stronger or weaker from the pandemic, he said: "I think about my country: we will be reduced in number. Because all those who no longer came to Mass, because they came only for cultural reasons, these 'cultural Catholics,' left and right, no longer come. They have seen that life is very comfortable. They can live very well without having to come to church. Even First Communions, the catechism for children, all this will decrease in number, I am almost certain." "But it's not a complaint on my part. We would have had this process even without a pandemic. Perhaps it would have taken us 10 years longer."



It's difficult to know with any certainty the long-term effects of what we're going through on the life of the churches; but it does seem certain that it won't simply be a case of 'As you were.' It will be down to the choices of individuals.

Online safety

The internet and our computers, smartphones and other devices are crucial to our way of life. Although the internet has many benefits, it also has some risks. Online safety is essential for both children and adults.

How to keep your child safe online

If your child spends time online, you should understand the risks that could put them in danger. Online dangers include:

Loss of privacy: Sharing information in public that should be kept private (after information is posted online, it is outside your child's control). Inappropriate content: Adult material, hate speech, violence, dangerous dares or challenges Cyberbullying: Bullying in the form of abusive and threatening texts or emails, messages on social media and chat rooms, or the posting of photos or video clips

Online grooming: Individuals targeting children through sexual coercion or extortion, usually on social media or gaming platforms.

The most important thing is to communicate with your children about what they are doing online. Familiarise yourself with the apps and websites they are using.

Talk to your child about the important features and settings they can use, including: How to adjust the security and privacy settings. How to block or unfriend someone. How to delete their own profile and account. How to deal with inappropriate content (such as: turn off the screen, use the back button, tell a trusted adult, or report the content to the website or app where they found it).

There are also practical ways to safeguard your child online. These include using:

Parental controls: Allowing you to manage your children's use of online services and devices. *Filters:* Restricting access to specific content by using services such as SafeSearch on search engines.

Time tracker tools: Keeping track of your child's social media use through tools available on social media apps.

Learning about the internet is the best way for you to protect your child from online dangers.

Primary): Has a helpline for parents on internet safety issues and also provides online and face-to-face training courses

Safer Internet Day (SID): Is an EU-wide initiative to promote safer internet use for all, and is promoted in Ireland by PDST Technology in Education and Webwise

Spunout.ie: Provides information on online privacy, safety and security – enter 'online safety' in its search box

How to protect yourself online

Adults should also be aware of potential threats and take measures to stay safe online. Cybercrime is increasingly common and comes in many different forms, so it is important to protect yourself.

Right of Reply

Dear Editor,



In last week's Newsletter you published a letter that contained

inaccurate statements regarding a proposed development at the top of Esker Hill and implied a link between this development and the entirely unrelated removal of damaged trees along a section of the Lucan Road between St Joseph's school and Lucan village.

The author of the letter wrote '...*the full details of the permission sought is on a pillar*...'. This claim is seriously inaccurate as there is only a very brief description of the proposed development in the notice on the pillar; just 75 words with no details of the myriad reports, drawings and maps that make up the planning application.

The author further wrote 'Bad enough magnificent trees are being felled, but houses being put in place of them on such an impressive stretch of road that some may have taken for granted!'. This is a bogus suggestion. The current planning application for 8 houses at Esker Hill does not encompass any of the forest land, it involves a wholly separate section/folio of land and even a cursory inspection of the planning application file would have shown this. It is seriously misleading to imply that houses might be erected in place of recently felled trees along the Lucan Road.

The forested land along this stretch of Lucan Road had not been maintained for at least 50 years up to 2020 and many of the trees were/are in poor condition. Following arborist's tree survey of a section of this land a significant number of trees that posed a hazard to people and vehicles walking or driving along the Lucan Road were felled & removed last year. Other trees were reduced (i.e., reduced in height) as their condition required. The arborist's survey report was copied to the Council's Parks and Roads departments and they supported its conclusions. There has been a reduction in the number of trees in this section of the forest but more importantly there has been a huge improvement to the safety of pedestrians and vehicles using this section of the Lucan Road.

Lastly, it is disappointing that inaccurate statements and bogus suggestions were published when even a modicum of checking on the internet could have provided the facts. Housing Advice and Supports for Renters in Lucan



Coaching Forum




