Historical population of Lucan

Older people will often remark on how small Lucan was when they were children going to school, and indeed many generations of Lucanians lived through very little change in their lifetimes — until the late 1960s / early 1970s, when the modern estates began to appear.

The first government census of Ireland was taken in 1821, and at ten-year intervals after that up to 1911. No census was taken in 1921, because of the War of Independence. The first census of the population in the Irish Free State was taken in 1926. While many of the early documents were destroyed in troubled times, we still have a good picture of the past.

From older rolls, we know that the population of Lucan back in the 17th and 18th centuries averaged around 500 souls, mostly working on the Lucan Estate and surrounding farms.

There was a gradual increase up to 1831, and then the numbers more than halved, for some reason we haven't yet discovered. The famine ran from 1845 to 1852, while the population was more or less static over those years.

The late 1800s proved a boom time for Lucan with Shackletons and Hills flour and milling industries bringing new families to the area, which saw two new national schools built in St. Mary's Church Yard in 1864. In 1867, the Presentations Sisters took over the girls school, with the numbers of children ever increasing.

Since 1926, the numbers increased gradually, gathering pace during the 1970s/80s, and simply exploding in latter years. While the 2021 national census has been deferred for a year, we can only imagine what the number might be.

I can safely say that I grew up in the same Lucan as my mother and grandparents, but my children and grandchildren are having a much different experience.

Booking a 'staycation' this summer

Under current public health advice, you can travel between counties. Public transport is running at 50% capacity.

Hotels, B&Bs, self-catering and hostels have reopened. If you are an overnight guest or resident, you can use the hotel's leisure facilities, indoor restaurant and bar services.

If you are booking a staycation, make sure you know the cancellation and refund policies before you book and pay a deposit. Check the terms and conditions carefully to see what your rights are if you have to cancel closer to the time (for example, because you have tested positive for COVID-19).

Introduction

Under current restrictions, you can travel outside your county. However, you cannot travel abroad for non-essential reasons (such as a holiday).

From 19 July, government advice to will be to travel safely, in line with public health guidance and restrictions. Ireland will operate the EU Digital COVID Certificate for travel within the EU/EEA. These plans are subject to the public health advice on that date.

This page has information about planning a 'staycation' in Ireland, the EU Digital COVID Certificate as well as your consumer rights if your travel plans are disrupted because of COVID-19.

You can get more specific travel information about travel bans, COVID-19 testing requirements and quarantine on arrival in Ireland.

Ambasciata d'Italia in Irlanda

Press Release from the Embassy of Italy in Ireland

Landslide and subsequent collapse, in June 2019, of a section of the wall of Lucan House Demesne.

As Lucan residents will know, in June 2019 part of the retaining wall (a section of approx. 50 mts) of the Residence of the Ambassador of Italy, Lucan House, collapsed as a result of a landslide. In the month of October 2019 the South Dublin County Council (SDCC) provided an inspection report on the reasons for the collapse which were ascribed simply to the age of the wall. The Embassy of Italy requested a report on 20th November 2019 from a specialised Irish Engineering Firm. The reasons for the collapse of the wall were ascribed to the vertical laying under the wall of different types of pipes (water mains, electrical, eircom, fibre optic, ESB poles) - laid in the past by previous Administrations of the SDCC, which are therefore responsible for creating the situation which lead to the collapse of the wall - as well as the illegal parking of trucks and heavy vehicles on the footpath opposite the petrol station, where the wall collapsed.

The Embassy of Italy requested another report in the month of July 2020 from an authoritative Irish Architectural Firm. The same reasons for the collapse were given. Ambassador Paolo Serpi had two meetings at the SDCC in the months of October and December in 2019 to put forward the Embassy's position. An interim response was sent by the SDCC in the Autumn of 2020 on the tender and schedule for the repair works. However, works could not proceed until such a time as the SDCC agreed on its responsibility in recognising the real reasons for the collapse, in the interests of the public in Lucan Village.

On the 26th of May 2021 Ambassador Serpi extended an invitation for a visit to Lucan House Demesne to the Mayor and 5 elected Councillors of the SDCC to request again the reconstruction of the wall, together with the footpath, and an acknowledgment of responsibility, with a friendly proposal of making available for the use by the public, of part of the grounds of Lucan House from the area of the collapsed wall to the boundary with St. Catherine's Park, including the Old Spa.

It's hard to believe how different times were in the 1800s, when Rose Kelly went into the woods to gather sticks for her fire. The above summons was among those retrieved from Lucan Garda Barracks when renovations took place many years ago.

Lord Annaly, of Woodlands (*now known as Luttrellstown*), was the Complainant

Rose Kelly, of Laraghcon, was the Defendant

It reads: On 15th Feb, You did steal and had in your possession is said district a quantity of branches or brushwood out of complainant's demesne at Woodlands, his property.

This is to command you to appear as a Defendant on the Hearing of said Complainant at Lucan Petty Sessions on 23rd day of Feb, at 12 o'clock.

Signed, Charles C. Vesey, Justice of said County, this 17 Day of February 1875.

Charles Colthurst Vesey, Justice of the County, lived in Lucan House and Demesne at the time. *m.m.*

St. Mary's Camera Soirée

Last Friday members of the Soiree took themselves off on another field trip. This time they went to the National Botanic Gardens in Glasnevin, described on the Garden's website as an oasis of calm and beauty, just three kilometres from the centre of the city.

It wasn't a great day for taking photographs as the sky was grey but that did not deter the group.







The flower beds, including the rose garden, were looking spectacular and the beds of wild flowers were beautiful to behold. Not surprisingly therefore this week many of the photographs come from that trip. Scattered throughout the gardens are sculptures which add to the pleasure of the visit as did the fact that the café was open for take-away.

The Gardens, which date back to the end of the 18th century boast some wonderful glass houses but because of COVID restrictions it is not possible to go inside at present.

The great Palm House was built in 1883, replacing an earlier wooden structure and was beautifully restored in 2002/2004.





It is the last known pre-fabricated Palm House of its period surviving in Western Europe and its restoration received a Europa Nostra award. The Curvilinear Range was completed in 1848 and was extended in the late 1860s.

This structure was restored in the 1990s and, again, according to the Garden's website, is the most important buildings in the Gardens.

Affordable Housing: The Government's Affordable Housing Bill passed with the support of most opposition TDs. The Digital Covid Certificate will play a key role in this temporary measure. I believe this reopening plan should be extended to Community Centres, Bingo Halls, Men's Sheds and Parish Centres to allow older people get back to socialising, exercising and playing bridge.


