We can be proud in Lucan that our schools reach these high ideals. We hope that summer will bring well-deserved rest and relaxation to all who make up our school communities and that they will return with batteries recharged for a new school year beginning in September.

To the boys and girls moving on to pastures new, we wish you every happiness and success. May the Lord who has seen you safely this far, walk with you through the years to come.

Registering to Vote


If you want to vote in an election or referendum in Ireland you must be: Eligible to vote and Registered to vote

Information on our website explains how to register to vote, and what to do if your situation has changed since the last election or referendum took place.

Changes to the registration system

You can now register for the first time and update the register throughout the year. If you provide your PPS number, you do not need to have your identification and forms witnessed at a Garda station. Applications to register and to change the register can be made online at checktheregister.ie.

If you are already registered, you should check your details and add your PPS number, date of birth and your Eircode on checktheregister.ie. Everyone is



How to register to vote

Each local authority is legally obliged to maintain, update and publish its Register of Electors. The Register must be maintained and updated on an ongoing basis.

To be eligible for inclusion in the Register of Electors, you must:

Be at least 18 years old

Be ordinarily resident at an address in Ireland If you have no address, you can register with 'no fixed address.' You can give an address where you can get correspondence.

If you have more than one address, you should give the address where you want to be registered. You can only be registered at one address.

You can register to vote:

Online at checktheregister.ie
By filling in an application form
If you do not give a PPS number, you must get
your form and ID witnessed at a local Garda
station.

Anonymous electors

The Register of Electors can be inspected at local authority offices. If you are concerned that having your details available for inspection would put you in danger, you can apply to be an anonymous elector. You can get the form to make this request at checktheregister.ie.

The Register of Electors is a public document. Your PPS number and your date of birth will not be published.

A recent Sunday walk in Lucan Demesne - we watched canoeists schooling and kayaks slalom, while a jazz twosome played on, near the swing gate.

The National Gallery's Exhibition of Lavinia Fortuna's paintings is a celebration of colour in fabric. Intricate lace and skin tones, her themes being mythical and religious.

A Merchant's House 17th – 18th century at 18 Ormond Quay has been restored by Graham Hickey and team of Dublin Civic Trust, so artisan crafts such as joinery, stonemasonry and plastering (Dublin wigging), are much needed for future projects.....

Signage in elegant continuous scripts once enhanced the ancient façade as follows:

Walking through the Wallace Italian Quarter "Blooms Lane" from the Centennial Bridge, we find Da Vinci's Las Supper with its Irish recreation. The tableau set against images of St. Michael and Johns Church (*now Smock Alley Theatre*), is produced in enamel on steel and placed at an alfresco dining area, the table is dressed with leaves of soda bread, fruit, a red teapot etc





The round tower was used for about 1000 years, but was left in ruins by the 17th century. The early church was built in 1831 and abandoned 40 years later.

The Round Tower and church are national monuments in State care.
