On Tuesday night last St. Mary's hosted a choral concert in aid of displaced people within Ukraine. A visiting Choir from Davenport, Iowa in the USA gave us a splendid evening of beautiful pieces to a very high standard. Tuesday was one of those super-muggy evenings with soaring temperatures, and I really feared that nobody would venture to the concert. However my fears were in vain and a very respectable crowd turned out for the event. In total, the event raised just over €5,000 and was a resounding success. The money raised has already been sent to the Bishop of the Diocese of Chernivtsi in Ukraine, and will be used to feed people impoverished by the appalling war. Thank you to everyone who supported. The people of Lucan are generous as ever.

The following is a reply to a recent Parliamentary Question by the Minister for Social Protection, Minister Heather Humphreys TD, 21 June 2022, in response to PQ 31880/22 about Recognition payment for those offering accommodation for people fleeing the war in Ukraine.

"The Government has approved a monthly flat rate recognition payment of €400 per property in respect of individual properties (shared or vacant) to those who provide accommodation for people fleeing the war in Ukraine. My Department will administer the payment on behalf of the Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth.

The recognition payment will be conditional on a minimum time commitment for hosting (6 months), with payments continuing for hosting arrangements beyond this timeframe. Payments

will be backdated for those providing accommodation since the outbreak of the conflict.

The payment is a 'recognition payment', that is, a financial contribution that recognises the generosity of those who have opened their homes to those fleeing the war in Ukraine. The payment will be available to all people hosting those who have arrived here from Ukraine, irrespective of whether this arrangement was made privately and directly or made through the Irish Red Cross pledge process.

The rate is not related to any specific named additional costs or category of costs incurred. The payment will be exempt from income tax and excluded from any means testing for other schemes of State supports. It is intended to have the necessary legislation to enable the payment in place by mid-July.

Officials in my Department are working with the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth and the Department of Justice to input to the necessary legislation and are developing the administrative and IT systems to support this important payment. People will be able to apply for the payment online through my Department's MyWelfare.ie service once the necessary legislation is in place. Payment will be made monthly in arrears, and it is intended that the first payments will issue in August."

LPC received a response from the NTA. In an unsigned email they tell us at a cursory glance it does not appear to them Lucan residents need direct access to the city for the former users of the 25 route and for thousands of new households in the extended vicinity of Dodsboro, Woodview, Meadowview, Hillcrest, and those in newer estates in the Adamstown direction.

We are preparing a response. A small interim survey tells us by far the vast majority are in favour of LPC's suggestion of a direct route to the city and everyone without exception is in favour of the L52 going to Blanchardstown Hospital.

Unsigned responses from the NTA make it more difficult for us to identify who is writing to us and for us to make the point Lucan needs more from the NTA than a cursory glance regarding the need for a direct route to the city by former 25 bus users. Nevertheless, changes are needed for the welfare of all and in particular older people, those with a disability, and those with small children trying to use public transport on a daily basis to meet their needs.

Those on the former 239 route now need to get three buses to our local public hospital. It's difficult to understand why the NTA have no apparent insight into the human difficulty this causes. Further action will be taken. We are pursuing on your behalf.

Please note a public meeting will be held on Saturday 30th July at 11am on The Green at Sarsfield Park regarding extending the former 239 bus (L52) by one stop to enter the grounds of Blanchardstown Hospital.

Further action will be taken regarding the 25 route also and the need for direct access to the city. We will keep you informed.

My travels on pilgrimage with Fr. Tom

As we say a sad farewell to Fr Thomas Kennedy and wish him well in his new appointment as parish priest of Castledermot I reflected on the pilgrimages that I have undertaken with him over his years in St. Mary's Parish.

My first pilgrimage with Fr. Tom was in May 2010 when a small group of 5 parishioners set off to venerate the Holy Shroud in Turin. It was a time of air travel disruption caused by the ash from the Icelandic volcano eruption and our travel plans were thwarted many times because of cancelled flights but we finally got going. In September that year a group of 50 parishioners set off with Fr. Tom on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. The time of our pilgrimage coincided with the Jewish feast of Yom Kippur, one of the holiest days of the year for the Jewish people. In October 2011 a group of 17 parishioners travelled with Fr. Tom to Rome and Assisi.

In September 2013 there was another pilgrimage to the Holy Land again coinciding with the feast of Yom Kippur. This time we also took in Jordan. This was at a time of high political tension in the Middle East. Some said we were foolhardy to go at this time to a region where on one occasion we were within minutes of the point where Jordan, Israel and Syria touch! But we went, trusting in the Lord. Jordan for me is the "undiscovered" Holy Land. The ministry of Jesus encompassed both side of the river Jordan which today marks the border between Jordan and Israel and there are also sites in that country of great significance to Judaism. We visited the site which today archaeologists agree is probably the actual site where Jesus was baptised by John the Baptist and we celebrated a renewal of our baptisms there. We also visited Mount Nebo where Moses first viewed the Promised Land.

The Shroud of Turin was on display again in 2015 and off some of us went again with Fr. Tom! My final pilgrimage with Fr. Tom was in September 2015 when a group of parishioners went on the pilgrimage entitled "The Shrines of Italy". We took in San Giovanni Rotondo (Padre Pio), Lanciano where the "Miracolo Eucaristico" took place, Loreto, the great Marian shrine of Italy, Padua (St. Anthony) and Venice. Unfortunately the advent of Covid in March 2000 meant that it was not possible to travel. I hasten to add that this record of the pilgrimages I have undertaken with Fr. Tom does not attempt to record all Fr. Tom's travels while he has been with us in Lucan.

How to use a Ringbuoy

Holding the ringbuoy, swing back, then release forward with an under-arm throw, shouting: Ringbuoy! Ringbuoy! Ringbuoy!

Aim to land the ringbuoy beyond the person, so that the ringbuoy can be pulled into their grasp

Instruct the person to hold the ringbuoy. Slowly pull them to land, reassuring them

The *Barber* must have visited the Willow Tree on the Village Green last week, as it got to shed its load for the very hot weather.


While on the subject of trees, it was very upsetting to see all the young trees either snapped in two or pulled from the ground near Castle Riada – Shame on those responsible!

The Coffee House

The Coffee House was a wooden sylvan type building situated across the bridge at the entrance to the modern Laraghcon estate.

Built by Hills and Shackletons in the late 1800s, it was hoped it would serve as an alternative to the pubs of Lucan.

It seems not to have worked, but the building became a sort of 'community centre' – long before the term was ever invented.



Christopher Ledwidge, who was born in Lucan in 1901, referred to it as the 'Band House' – where the local Fife and Drum band had their practices and was often used for dances in his day. He also recalled bread being handed out from here during the great 'Lock Out' of 1913.

Lucan's first Vocational School had its beginnings here before moving to The Forge at Dodsboro, and to the building on Esker Hill in 1953. This was the pre-runner to Lucan Community College.

For a time in the 1950s, it was home to the Gannon family, and later housed Trade Union Offices. Eventually it yielded to scavenges of time and fell in to disrepair being demolished in 1984.



LUCAN FESTIVAL


In 1922 the Garda took possession of Lucan RIC barracks and the attached drawings show what they found.

Passing of a Legend

The Racing Post described **Georgie McGrath** as “top class – dual Irish champion jockey”, listing a string of victories throughout his career spanning the ‘60s, ‘70s and ‘80s.

Back in those days, locals kept a keen eye on the success of the local boy from Esker, who was associated with many great names in the horse racing world.

He was twice Champion Jockey, having ridden 4 classic winners including Weaver’s Hall in the 1973 Irish Derby. He also rode Furry Glen (1974) and Sadler’s Wells (1984) to victory in the Irish 2000 Guineas, and had a string of successes on famed courses across the pond, and indeed as far as India where he won the Indian Derby in 1971.

Wetlands Progress Update – Griffeen Valley Park:

The construction of the wetlands project is underway in Griffeen Valley Park since July 4th and is set to be completed by the end of August. Diggers are on site and have removed the soil, and this will be relocated to the upper end of the park. Planting will occur in August and the wetlands will take 2 years to mature. This is the first of 5 new county-wide wetlands projects in support of biodiversity.

St. Mary's Camera Soirée

I hope you all have recovered from the heatwave at the beginning of the week. We are clearly not designed to live in such temperatures. Maybe it was because of the heat but photographing butterflies seems to have become a craze last week with the members of the Soiree. Michael G, Conor and Joe got in on the act. About a dozen photographs of butterflies were submitted. As there are about 34 butterfly species found in Ireland the Soiree has a long way to go to photograph them all.



Apart from butterflies there were photographs of the Sugarloaf Mountain, Damselflies of various hues and the highlight of the week for me, Joe's photograph of a Kingfisher (Irish name Croidín) taken in St. Edmundsbury. Life as winged adult damselflies is relatively short, with most living just a few weeks.

The Kingfisher with its very distinctive brightly coloured plumage is widespread in Ireland. The bird resides on Irish streams, rivers and canals. The species is very sedentary and the bird rarely moves from its territory but is still very difficult to photograph.
