

The Lucan Newsletter is now in its 56th year of publication. It must rank as one of the oldest community newsletters in the country. The newsletter team consists of 4 office volunteers, Mary Mulhall, Anna Nolan, Rose Fitzgerald and Catherine Hennessy. Each Thursday this team take over St. Mary's Parish Office where the publication is prepared and printed. What began on an old Gestetner duplication machine in black and white, back in 1967, has evolved to a full colour edition, produced and printed entirely in-house. Sales of the newsletter enabled the purchase of a high-end colour printer and each Thursday the presses roll.



There are also post-production volunteers, and this small and faithful group assemble and fold the finished product which is then delivered by other volunteers to the sales outlets around Lucan.

Although produced at St. Mary's Parish Office, the Lucan Newsletter is much broader than just Parish News; indeed, it has an ecumenical dimension, carrying news and notices from the other Christian Churches in Lucan. It also covers a diversity of news and information from local schools, politicians and a range of sporting organisations and community groups. It's always gratifying to see local sporting successes celebrated in the newsletter.

The ever-popular adverts provide a space for local trades and services to lay out their stalls, and many people have found a valuable resource through these pages.



Without the dedicated service of the volunteers, the Newsletter could not be published. So, as they take the customary summer break until September, I take the opportunity to say a sincere word of thanks to them for their dedicated service to the community, week in week out.

Voluntary Social Insurance Contributions

Paying social insurance can help you to qualify for social insurance payments, such as the State Pension (Contributory). If you are an employee Pay Related Social Insurance (PRSI) deductions are made from your earnings each week.

If you are no longer an employee or if you are self-employed and you are no longer making compulsory PRSI contributions, you can opt to make voluntary contributions. If you are getting a social welfare payment or signing for credits you may get credited contributions which will also keep your social insurance record up to date.

Voluntary contributions can help maintain your social insurance record and help you to qualify for social insurance payments in the future. They cover long-term benefits such as pensions. They do not cover short-term benefits for illness, maternity or jobseekers.

You can choose to pay voluntary contributions (if you are under 66 and meet the other conditions) if you:

Are no longer covered by compulsory PRSI in Ireland

Are no longer covered by PRSI on a compulsory or voluntary basis in another EU country
If you are working outside the EU and not subject to Irish or EU social insurance contributions you may also opt to pay voluntary contributions.

If you are taking time off work to care for children under 12 years of age, or a disabled child or adult, the Homemaker's Scheme may be a better option than making voluntary contributions.

Since 6 April 2015 you need 520 paid PRSI contributions (10 years) to be eligible to make voluntary contributions.

Rules apply to the making of voluntary contributions and more information is available on our website including combining social insurance contributions from abroad.



Report on Sol School Tour of Medieval Graveyard, Lucan Village

Last month, Elaine, Niamh and Helen of SOL were delighted to host the fifth-class children from Esker Educate Together school at a workshop at BVM graveyard in Lucan village. Helen showed the group "archaeological finds" from field walking locally and explained the background of the site, including the history mysteries of BVM!

Elaine, assisted by Niamh, led the children in a hands-on activity (using carbon-paper to make a copy of the engravings and decoration on the memorials in a safe and sustainable way) to explore the images and lettering on some of the memorials. The children also went searching for the famed "skull & crossbones" grave marker – a memento mori – the oldest standing marker left in the BVM graveyard.

Everyone got thoroughly stuck into all the activities, including trying on a replica jacket to see what the wealthy people in Lucan House might have worn several hundred years ago.

In feedback, teacher Sarah told us *'The children learned so much about the history of their local area. They really related their learning to their experiences of other local historical sites which was a thrill to see!'*

Helen and Elaine both remarked on how engaged the children were with many asking interesting questions – perhaps there are some budding historians and archaeologists in the making! Thanks to the teachers and SNA who were equally interested, and to the children who were a credit to their school. The Bell in the Orchard



A few weeks ago, Jonathan Cully and I visited the Orchard apartments in the village for a bit of a guided tour from one of the residents and to see what remains of the old Orchard on the site.

As we walked up the back of the apartments on the left-hand side, you were shown an old bellcote with the bell still intact. This would have been used for letting the workers (in Lucan Demesne) know the start of the day, lunch break and home times. It was said people in the village would hear the bell ring at 8am, 12pm and 6pm every day.



If you take a close at the bell you will notice it was made in Dublin by Murphy Foundry who also made a bell for Christ Church Cathedral, but these were recast around 1979 by another bell marker. He also made eight bells for St. Patrick's Cathedral in Melbourne, Australia.



John Murphy was originally a coppersmith started his business in James's Street around 1837 and moved into casting bells in 1843. He was one of many bell founders in Dublin and won many prizes for his bells in Dublin and London and won a first-place prize in Paris.

This fantastic piece of history is a little hidden gem in The Orchard and as you can see is still in good condition and hopefully can be restored to protect it for many more years.

Blue sky – yes, it really does exist – deepens into dusky purple in the twilight, and the clouds reflect the sunset’s vibrancy. No gusty breeze disturbs my thoughts; all is calm, still, serene the city traffic is finished for the day, and I am left with blackbird calls, pigeon murmurs and, if a stay out late enough, the fluttering of bats. With the wind gone, scents of this month’s growth settle around me – the last of the linden blossoms, a variety of rose that looks like a giant version of the wild roses back home, heavily sweet honeysuckle. Stars begin to appear; the same moon rises over here as it always did there. Peace



descends, and I am reconciled to my adopted home. And if the greyness returns tomorrow, I will smile and wait for evening.



This week Joe visited the Dublin Zoo which opened its doors on 1st September 1831. Today it attracts over 1 million visitors a year.

Josie submitted some photos of the immaculately manicured gardens of Áras an Uachtaráin the official residence of the President. Since 1938 there have been only 9 Presidents. The gardens date back to the construction of the house in 1751. The Áras was intended as the temporary residence of the President while plans were made to build a new presidential palace on the grounds. The outbreak of the Second World War saved the building from demolition as

plans for its demolition and the design of a new residence were put on hold.

By 1945 it had become too closely identified with the Presidency of Ireland to be demolished.
