A light has been shone on my path so far and I've had good company at all stages. Regarding the Lucan parishes!-it would have been truly tragic to have missed this step! In case you didn't notice, I'm more than happy, so any challenging steps before this (they were very few and minor) were worth it to arrive here!

To all in transition, follow the right steps for your own journey and may you enjoy the trip and each arrival point. Life's journey is not without its' surprises.

Working Family Payment (WFP)

How does the Working Family Payment support parents in employment?

Working Family Payment (WFP) is a weekly taxfree payment for parents in low-paid employment.

You must have at least one child that you support financially and who normally lives with you. If your children do not live with you, you must be wholly maintaining your ex-spouse, ex-civil partner, or ex-cohabitant with whom the children are living.

The child must be under 18, or under 22 and in full-time day education. Whether you qualify for the payment and how much you get depends on your average weekly income and your family size.

I work part-time do I still qualify?

Yes, but you must work as an employee for 38 or more hours per fortnight. You can combine your weekly hours with your spouse, civil partner or cohabitant's hours to meet this condition. Time spent on Community Employment, Tús, JobBridge or the Rural Social Scheme cannot be used to meet this condition.

Does being self-employed count?

No. You must be an employee to get the WFP and time spent working in self-employment does not count towards hours worked for the WFP.

What happens if my working hours are reduced after I qualify?

Once your application has been approved and you get the WFP, it is paid at the same rate for 52 weeks and then you must apply again. It does not change if your earnings from work go up or down during that year.

If your hours are reduced, but you still work at least 38 hours per fortnight, then your WFP payment will not change until the 52 weeks are up and you are reassessed.

If your hours are reduced and you no longer work at least 38 hours per fortnight, then you are no longer entitled to WFP.

What if I have another child?

If you have another child your claim for WFP will be reassessed and you may get a higher payment.

How to apply?

You can apply online at MyWelfare.ie if you have a MyGovID verified account. Alternatively, you can fill in an application form for Working Family Payment. You can get a copy of this form in your Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office or CIC office.

You can get help filling it in at an Intreo Centre, Social Welfare Branch Office or Citizens Information Centre.

Letter to the Editor

I have noticed the increasing use of the word "Volunteer" both in St. Mary's Parish and elsewhere to describe parishioners who are members of the



various ministries associated with parish life. As a member of a Parish Ministry, I have to say that I find this word offensive and I was comforted to find recently that I am not alone.

A reader of the English catholic magazine "*The Tablet*" wrote recently in that journal that he is increasingly annoyed at the use of this term. He points out that Christians, even though unpaid, are working in the vineyard of the Lord. They demonstrate their commitment to the faith community by taking on such duties and responsibilities using their God-given gifts. He points out that those who take on such roles are not "volunteer" Christians and he concludes by saying that those who partake in Parish Ministries cannot be likened to enthusiasts involved in the running of, for example, a vintage steam railway.

Remember when....



A dip in the Archives 1974 – *Continued from last week* Lucan 50 years ago

7th April 1974

"Bulldozers in Action: Big bulldozers have been very busy in Lucan last week. At Dodsboro they have levelled the ground at the Hatchery and eventually the Hatchery itself, to make way for 64 houses to be built by Lucan Green Homes Ltd.

The bulldozers are also at work at Esker, between esker Glebe and the graveyard. It could be for 48 two-storey houses and seven bungalows planned to be built by P. L. Holdings Ltd.

It seems that the speculators have been very busy. Lucan village and the Lucan people have not been considered except when exploiting them. But one thing is a little bit clearer and that is the Lucan by-pass. Taking a line on the map from Ballydowd through the housing estates like Rose Lawns, Beech Park, Esker Glebe, Vesey Park, Hillcrest Ardeevin, it seem that the way is clear. But when will it start? If ever?"

14th April

"New Shopping Centre: These plans show the layout of the new shopping centre at Hillcrest near the Dodsoro Road. It consists of a Public House, Clinic, 8 small shopping units, Petrol Station and a Supermarket. Planning permission was granted to Messrs. Gallaghers earlier this year and work has already started.

We can see plenty of parking the supermarket is big, the smalls hopping units are essential to make a shopping area, the Clinic seems very small and the pub well it's a necessary evil.

It is a pity that the shopping centre was not on the Newcastle Road and be nearer to Lucan village, thus being more beneficial to the rest of Lucan."

6th January 1974:



More than that, we have just been enduring and feeling the bitter effects of the oil embargo imposed by Arab nations. We have all been led to be very much dependent on oil for energy and heating for home, office and industry and we have been caught napping at t time when we were not prepared for it......


How unpredictable the future is! It is quite possible that very drastic measures will be taken here in line with the directives laid down by the British Government, who have reduced working to three days each week. Already there are signs that some such measures have been in the offing: some persons have been issued with protective notices and face the threat of redundancy."

31st March
