# Midsummer Night's Dream! Bonfire Night!

Midsummer's night/St John's Eve/Bonfire Night was the highlight of our year, second only to Christmas, as children. The tradition of Bonfire Night was celebrated in the west of Ireland until the late seventies when 'more modern' activities began to take over. We prepared for it for weeks by gathering burnable rubbish from neighbours and friends building the pile in a safe place round which there was space for a few families to picnic, sing, play music, tell ghost stories and dance. We referred to the night as both Bonfire night and St John's Eve with both names commonly applied.



Families tended to gather in clusters around the various townlands. Our tiny farm was the centre for a few families every year as my father was a master, understated organiser with a calm and ever positive outlook. He did everything in such a way that it all seemed so effortless despite the vast number of work, local community and farm tasks he carried out every day. The stack ready for fire was symmetrical and beautiful in structure and usually burned evenly due to good planning. Therefore, after long days during which hay was cut, turned and stacked; the turf cut and turned; the potatoes, onions, carrots, peas, cabbages and corn were watched and treated for infestations before harvesting time arrived, this evening of family and village fun and relaxation was more than welcomed by all and engaged in with wholehearted childlike enthusiasm.

With the bonfire light shining as light diminishes in the evening, we prepare to celebrate the birthday of St John the Baptist on 24 June; the one born to shine the light before Jesus, his cousin. For those whose birthday it might be this weekend, we take light from you as you bear the light of St John! In whatever gathering we might find ourselves this weekend let us take stock of the bright lights in our lives; make some effort to connect with others and family; celebrate the everyday new birthday celebration of life and dance with some carefree abandon with those who accept us as we are. We celebrate what we have sown in daily life and remain ever ready to harvest what we can from the fruits of life with the inner and surrounding fire-stack energy of life providing all that we need for today!

# Is your dog a restricted breed?

Do you own a dog? 😭

If your dog is a restricted breed (or a strain or cross of one), they must be:

- Kept on a short strong lead (under 2 metres)
- With someone over the age of 16, who is able to control them
- Muzzled when in a public place
- Wearing a collar with the name and address of their owner, at all times

## Restricted breeds of dog in Ireland

Restricted breeds of dog in Ireland No breed of dog is currently banned in Ireland. But, if you have certain types or breeds of dog, there are additional rules you must follow. This applies to the following types of dog, as well as strains or cross-breeds of these breeds:

American pit bull terrier English bull terrier Staffordshire bull terrier Bull mastiff Dobermann pinscher German shepherd (Alsatian) Rhodesian ridgeback Rottweiler Japanese akita Japanese tosa

# In Ireland restricted dogs (or strains and crosses of them) must be:

Kept on a short strong lead (under 2 metres) With someone over the age of 16, who is able to control them.

Muzzled when in a public place

Wearing a collar with the name and address of their owner, at all times

The rules on muzzling and leashing do not apply to dogs used by the:

Gardaí

Dublin Harbour Police State Airport Police

Rescue teams in rescue operations

The rules on muzzling do not apply to guide dogs for the blind.

#### Rules about selling dogs in Ireland

There are rules about the sale and supply of pets, including dogs.

If you sell or supply 5 or more pets in a calendar year you must:

Register with the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine

Keep records about pet animals for sale or supply Include certain information if you are advertising an animal for sale. For example, if you are advertising a dog for sale, you must include its microchip number.

Not sell or supply pets under a certain age. This is 8 weeks for dogs.

If you are advertising a dog for sale, the advertisement must have the dog's microchip code.

These rules are set out in the Animal Health and Welfare (Sale or Supply of Pet Regulations) 2019. There is a Code of Practice (pdf) for people who sell and supply pet animals.

# **Guard dogs**

A guard dog used at a non-residential business premises must be with a handler or secured so that it cannot roam freely around the premises or escape. A notice must be displayed at the entrance, informing the public that a guard dog is on the premises.



# **Lucan House**

At a time when Lucan House has is coming into public ownership, it's interesting to reflect on some events of the past....



The Rt. Hon. Agmondisham Vesey really shaped the Lucan we know today. He inherited the old Sarsfield castle with its damp cold walls – described nearly two hundred years previously as being held together by the tapestries.

In 1773, much against his wife's wishes, he knocked down the castle and built Lucan House. Mrs. Vesey feared she would miss "the dear old castle with its riches

and thousand other Gothic beauties", but she was delighted with her new house especially with the room Vesey had especially designed for her, with its rounded exterior wall, overlooking the river and beautifully landscaped grounds.

Rear view of Lucan House – Mrs. Vesey's room was on the first floor, from where she could look out in several directions over their magnificent estate.

Beneath it was the drawing room, now the dining room. It is believed that the design of the Oval Office in the White House was taken from the plans for this room in Lucan House.

Vesey worked for years on his masterpiece leaving a wonderful legacy to Lucan.



Having no children, the estate passed to his nephew Col. George Vesey in 1785, and was held by his descendants – Vesey / Colthursts – up to 1921.


The Cromer family then had possession for a few years.

In 1930 the house and the land around it, including part of the Demesne as far as the car park at the Old Celbridge Road entrance, was purchased by Charles O'Conor Don, a direct descendent of Rory O'Connor, the last High King of Ireland. On his death in 1939 the property was taken over by Flight Lieutenant L.W.B. Teeling, M.P. for Brighton, who married Mary O'Conor in 1942.

# The Wedding and the President......

In 1942, a curious situation arose at Lucan House on the occasion of the Teeling/O'Conor wedding.

Four years earlier, Douglas Hyde was installed as first President of Ireland. At the time, the British National Anthem still featured in some ceremonies involving the Church of Ireland. As Dr. Hyde was a member of this Church, there were always fears that the said anthem would be played at events, thus causing a snub to the office of the Presidency of Ireland.

No stranger to Lucan, President Hyde was a great friend and acquaintance of the O'Conor Don Family, and was invited to the nuptials.

The bride was Miss Molloy O'Conor, eldest daughter of the late Charles O'Conor Don of Lucan House, who was marrying Mr. Luke Teeling, an R.A.F. Flight Lieutenant. Best Man was the Marquess of Donegal, and the O'Conor sisters were bridesmaids. The President's secretary, Mr. Michael McDunphy, was also invited, as were many of Mr. Teeling's R.A.F. colleagues.


Dr. Hyde's secretary noted: "..... I was concerned to ensure that no attempt would be made by these officers to do what had been done recently on a number of festive occasions, viz to avail of the opportunity to state a pro-belligerent demonstration either by toasting the King of England and/or the singing of the British National Anthem".

He discussed the matter over the telephone with Miss O'Conor, who reassured him that there was no need to worry, as she herself would be totally against any such activity. *Continued over.....* 

Mr. McDunphy recorded: "There were some 400-500 guests present at the wedding, and I felt sure, on studying the individuals comprising it, that a demonstration of the type which I had taken steps to prevent would have met with the approval and vocal support of at least 50 per cent of those present".

However, the celebrations went off without any such incidents. Locals remember the wedding when Miss Molly rode up to St. Mary's Church on a white horse.

The only son in the family, Charles, became a priest and so ended the male line of descent from our last High King.





# St. Mary's Camera Soirée

Work continues on developing our project around the photographs of old Lucan. This week there is only one photograph because I think the story surrounding the image is fascinating. The image is of what is known today as the Brendan Boat which is on view in the

grounds of Craggaunowen Castle, County Clare.

The British explorer Tim Severin and his four companions built this boat using only techniques and materials available in the sixthcentury A.D., when St. Brendan was supposed to have sailed to America. The vessel comprised forty-nine ox hides stitched together and stretched over a wooden frame made of Irish Ash and Oak. The skin of the boat was only a quarter of an inch thick. Severin and his crew set sail from the Dingle peninsula on 17th May 1976 and completed their historic journey across the Atlantic to Newfoundland in a little more than 13 months. They took a "stepping stone" route, stopping at the Hebrides and the Faroe Islands, and spending winter in Iceland on the way. This was the same route taken by the earliest explorers.

Severin did not prove that St. Brendan crossed the Atlantic but he did show that it could have been done at the time with the techniques and materials available and that it was therefore possible that St. Brendan discovered America 1,000 years before Christopher Columbus.



The orchestral suite "*The Brendan Voyage*" composed by Shaun Davey in 1980 depicts Tim Severin's adventure in reconstructing St. Brendan's possible 6th century Atlantic crossing to America. The work is the first musical meeting between an Irish solo uilleann piper and a classical symphony orchestra.
