During her time as principal Scoil Mhuire has continued to build on the solid foundations laid by the Presentation Sisters in years past. She has carefully fostered the ethos of the school while also making it a place of welcome for girls from different faith traditions and backgrounds. It has also been a time of renewal of the school buildings and facilities, and she leaves behind a well-run and highly organised school to be proud of, which will serve the Lucan community well in to the future.

Also retiring this year is Mrs. Mary Lohan the Deputy Principal. Mrs. Lohan (*Pictured on right*) is another long serving dedicated member of staff with some 34 years' service; she has made an enormous contribution in maintaining the high standards that characterise the school. For many years Mrs. Lohan was also involved in the provision of religious education classes for the catholic children attending St. Andrew's Church of Ireland School, a task to which she brought the same dedication and commitment that she brought to her role in Scoil Mhuire.



Schools are central to the life of a parish and local community, and as we bid farewell to the two Marys we thank them both profoundly for the very considerable contribution their combined service has made through the years. May they both have many years of health and happiness to enjoy the retirement they so richly deserve.

We wish all the members of our school communities across the Lucan parishes, teachers, SNA's, secretaries, caretakers, cleaners and members of the Boards of Management a happy summer break. May the batteries be fully recharged! September won't be long in coming around!

The Back to School Clothing and Footwear

Allowance (BTSCFA) helps you meet the cost of uniforms and footwear for children going to school.

The BTSCFA scheme is open from 20 June 2022 until 30 September 2022.

The BTSCFA will be paid automatically to many families in the week beginning 13 July 2022. If you are paid automatically you don't have to apply for the BTSCFA. You will get a letter before 20 June 2022 to let you know that you will be paid automatically. If you do not get a letter confirming that you will get the payment automatically, you must apply for the BTSCFA online on www.MyWelfare.ie.

The closing date for applications is 30 September 2022.

Regularisation of Long-Term Undocumented Migrants Scheme

The scheme is for people who have been undocumented in Ireland for at least 4 years at the start of the scheme, or for at least 3 years for families with children under 18.

You apply online, upload documents to prove your identity and residence history, and pay an application fee. If your application is approved, you will get a Stamp 4 residence permission. You can apply just for yourself, or you can apply as a family.

International protection applicants - In addition, international protection applicants, who have been waiting for a decision for 2 years or more, can apply through a separate application process. Applications opened on 7 February 2022 and will close on 7 August 2022.

Who can apply?

You may qualify for the scheme if:

You are undocumented in Ireland, or you are an international protection applicant.

You meet the residence rules.

You have the documentation and identification needed.

You have not been convicted of serious criminal offences.

You are not a threat to national security.

You pay the application fee (if required).

Undocumented - You are undocumented if you are from outside the EU or EEA and you do not have permission to be in Ireland. You may have had permission previously and it expired, or you may never have had legal residence in Ireland.

You can apply for this scheme if you are undocumented (and meet the other criteria) regardless of the reason why or how you became undocumented.

You can apply if you have been issued with a Deportation Order, or you are in the 'Section 3' process. The Section 3 process is when you have been sent a notification that the Minister for Justice intends to make a Deportation Order, and gives you the chance to set out reasons why you should be granted residence.

The scheme also applies to former student visa holders.

International protection applicants -

International protection applicants are not undocumented, but can apply for residence through the scheme. You are eligible if it is at least 2 years since you made your international protection application. The International Protection Office will write to people who are eligible to apply. If you are not contacted by the IPO, you can still apply if you meet the qualifying criteria.

If your application is approved:

You do not have to withdraw your application for international protection, but you can choose to withdraw it if you want to.

Residence rules

Undocumented applicants:

You can apply for yourself, or you can make a family application. You, as the primary applicant, must have been undocumented for at least 4 years on 31 January 2022, unless you have dependent children.

You can include your family on your application. If you have children under 18, the length of time that you must be undocumented is reduced to 3 years.

We would like to thank everyone for the very good turnout at our save our bus campaign at Dodsboro on Saturday last the 18th June.

We had several contacts from people who could not attend. There is no doubt we have the support of most residents in Lucan to restore former routes 25 and 239.

It was harrowing to hear the complaints and concerns from senior citizens, users with a disability and people with young children. Having to get three buses to get to Blanchardstown, long wait between connections and not able to visit loved ones in hospital. Blanchardstown is the main hospital for the whole Lucan area. We have already taken preliminary action in immediately writing to the Taoiseach having heard first hand some appalling stories which on a human and compassionate level demand action. There is widespread support also for the return of the 25

route which completely disappeared with Bus Connects which obliges people from Dodsboro, Airlie Heights, Woodview Heights, Woodview, and others to take a local bus to the village in the hope of getting a Maynooth or Celbridge bus to the city centre which are full during peak times.

There were several protest measures put forward on Saturday to highlight mainly the problem of our most vulnerable people in the community, we will let you know soon what community action we will take and invite you to take part. For this campaign we need more people to help us in this fight to save Lucan bus services, and we know from a show of hands on Saturday there is a willingness there to give time to this. You can include your spouse/partner and dependent children aged 18-23 on your application if they have lived with you for at least the last 2 years. You must have proof that they have been undocumented for the past 2 years. Children aged 24 and over must make their own application and cannot be included in a family application.

For children aged 24 and over who cannot live independently because of a mental or physical disability, you may be able to include them in your application. You should contact undocumented@justice.ie before making your application.

International protection applicants

You can only apply if you are currently an international protection applicant. Each member of your family must be an international protection applicant. Each member of your family must make a separate application.

You must have been in the international protection process for at least 2 years on 7 February 2022.

You do not qualify for the scheme if you have a deportation order.

Documents you need

You must be able to prove your identity and that you have lived in Ireland for the required period. You do not need to prove that you have a particular level of income or savings. The list of documents is now available for undocumented applicants and for international protection applicants.

Criminal record and national security

You could be refused if you have been convicted of serious criminal offences. You must declare all criminal convictions as part of your application. Your application could be refused if you are deemed a threat to national security.

Application fee - The application fee is: €700 for a family; €550 for an individual. No fee for international protection applicants. You must pay the full fee at the time when you make your application.

How to apply

Undocumented applicants –

You apply online. Guidance on how to complete the online form for single people (pdf) and for family applications is available. You can also watch a video to help you complete your application.

You can upload your documents as part of the online application.

International protection applicants –

Fill in an application form and email it to IPRSU@ipo.gov.ie.

Decisions and appeals

If your application is approved, you will get a letter granting you permission to remain in Ireland for 2 years. This can then be renewed. Each member of your family that was part of your application will get a separate letter.

You must register your permission and get an Irish Residence Permit. You will get a Stamp 4, which means you can work without an employment permit. Children under 16 do not have to register.

Refusals

If your application is refused, you will get a letter which will tell you the reasons why it was refused. You can appeal this decision. If your appeal is successful, you will be granted permission to remain in Ireland.

If your appeal is not successful, your case will be referred to the Repatriation Unit of ISD. If you have a current outstanding application for international protection, or some other residency, that will still be processed if you are refused residence under this scheme.

You can read more about the Scheme on the ISD website.

The International Protection Office has frequently asked questions about the scheme for international protection applicants.

Cost Of Living Protest:

The cost of living protest last Saturday was well attended. Inflation in May was 7.8% the highest increase in 38 years. Heating oil by 101%, electricity by 41%, rents by 11% and basic food stuffs like bread, milk and butter by 10%. This is obviously unsustainable and the government need to do more than some of the measures they have introduced. Up to March a worker on an average full-time wage was down €2500 in spending power but it's now estimated that you could be out of pocket by €3500 a year as prices keep going up. Nearly a third of household are now in fuel poverty. More targeted measures are needed particularly those that find themselves in fuel poverty which will be acute this winter.



St. Mary's Camera Soirée

We met in the Parish Centre for the last time yesterday before the summer break. I am sure that field trips will be organised on an ad hoc basis during the summer and we will of course keep the Newsletter team supplied with photographs until they break for their holidays.

Photos submitted this week show that Kilgar Gardens near Kilcock and the Walled Garden at Farmleigh are in full bloom and well worth a visit.

Farmleigh was once a small two-storey Georgian house built in the mid-18th century. In 1873, the house and estate were purchased by Edward Guinness, a great-grandson of Arthur Guinness, when he married his cousin Adelaide Guinness. Between 1881 and 1884 Edward commissioned a major renovation and extension programme of the house and added a third floor. A ballroom was added in 1896 and a conservatory was added in 1901. The house and estate were bought by the Irish State in 1999.



Butterflies and moths are beginning to appear and Conor submitted photographs of several. He points out that the six spotted Burnet Moth has evolved into a particularly clever creature. The red spots on its wings indicate to its predators, birds and lizards that if attacked it will emit a liquid containing cyanide!
