# Celebrating St. Patrick

The feast of St. Patrick is a great moment to remember the gift of faith brought to our shores in the early centuries. St. Patrick was one among a few missionaries to Ireland who brought the message of Jesus Christ as an invitation to the people of Ireland. Saints Brendan, Ciarán, Enda, Brigid, Senan and Columba arrived with the message of the Gospel during the early centuries also. Through the combination of the knowledge and skills of each of the Irish saints and their followers the emergence of monasticism, the ordination of priests in Ireland and wide range apostolic activity, in God's name, grew.

The image of St Patrick which is widely presented currently is of a secular and comic nature which has nothing to do with a day which is fundamentally Christian and rooted in celebrating the gift of faith in God. The question of faith is one which is often silenced by current society while the fact of belief is one for all to confront, question and examine. Everyone has some belief, even if it is presented in the negative as non-belief. It may be a non-belief in God, but that in itself is a belief.

The fundamental purpose which we have for life, rooted in faith or some existential purpose, is an important lynchpin for us when life pulls us in times of great stress, as happens inevitably. It is easy to sway happily when all is going well, but when the strong winds of challenge hit hard, it is important to have roots of purpose and meaning which hold us firm while the storm passes! What's it all about!? — is something that every human being asks at many stages of life often when moments of great change occur.

As we celebrate St. Patrick, who knew that he was rooted firmly in Jesus Christ and the values of the Gospel let us consider ourselves as individuals in current times and know where we have set our roots. If we don't know and have never considered what purpose we lean into when the going gets tough, or the purpose towards which we give gratitude, perhaps we could take a moment to look at the path we tread and see what it is on which we depend.

What sustains us, holds us firm and gives a meaning in life that is not transient? Are there questions of faith/non-faith that we need to ask ourselves as St. Patrick's Day presents before us again? What is the rooting truth of our lives!

# **Travelling Abroad**

Check travel advice and entry requirements for your destination

Check the travel advice and entry requirements for the country you are travelling to before you travel abroad.

You might need a visa, this depends on your destination. You can find out if you need a visa on the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade website.

#### Is your passport in date?

Check that your and your families' passports are in date before you book. Passport Online is open to all applicants. You can get information on how to renew your passport or

how to apply for your child's first passport. The latest passport turnaround times are available on the Passport Service's website.

#### Do you have travel insurance?

You should get travel insurance for yourself and your family. If you have a travel insurance policy already, or travel insurance is included in your health insurance policy, you should check that

you are covered for hospital treatment for COVID-19.

You should bring your European Health Insurance Card with you if you are travelling to the EEA or Switzerland. You cannot use your EHIC in the UK. But you can still get the healthcare you need. You will need to show your Irish passport to the GP or hospital. Make sure that it is in date, it must be renewed every 4 years and each family member needs their own. An EHIC does not replace travel insurance.

Ireland and Australia have a reciprocal health agreement. This means that Irish visitors to Australia will receive emergency services and assistance towards the cost of prescribed drugs and medicines on the same basis as persons ordinarily resident in Australia.

Irish citizens travelling in the UK are entitled to access healthcare through the Common Travel Area.

#### Driving abroad

If you plan to drive while abroad, make sure that your Irish driving licence is valid and that you bring it with you.

Always make sure you are properly insured for driving while overseas.

Get more information on driving abroad from the Road Safety Authority and on our website.

#### While abroad

Note the address, telephone number and opening hours of the Irish Embassy or Consulate in the country you are visiting. In countries with no Irish diplomatic or consular representation, you may seek emergency assistance from embassies or consulates of other European Union countries. On its website, the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade provides advice on how to stay safe while abroad and what to do in an emergency.

#### Travel tips

Check if you need any vaccines or immunisations before you travel (at least 8 weeks in advance).

Make a note of the 24-hour emergency number of your bank so you can cancel your credit card or debit card if it is stolen.

Check your mobile data allowance with your mobile phone service provider. (For travel outside of the EEA).

Do you need a special adapter to plug in your electrical devices?

A second new version of the Safe Harbour story book, has

been developed and is now available. In this new version, the child's mother dies and is supported by their father. Having two versions of the book allows us to provide a resource that better aligns with a child's experience.

There is also an Irish version of the original book (where the child's father dies and is supported by their mother).

The accompanying guide for Parents and Carers has also now been updated to support both books.

Both versions of the book – Book A (where the dad dies) and Book B (where the mother dies) – are now available to download on childhoodbereavement.ie/safeharbour

In Italy cardiac screening is mandatory for those who play competitive sport and this has reduced incidents of SADS by 89% in the past 25 years. The students will get their personalised results in the coming weeks.

English: Our 6<sup>th</sup> yr HL students went to the Gate Theatre last week to see a fantastic production of William Shakespeare's "King Lear", which they are studying as their single text, worth 60marks, in their Leaving Cert English course. The students were extremely impressed with the fully immersive production, which really brought the play to life for them. The production did a good job of communicating the plot and character relationships to the young audience in a clear and accessible manner, and seeing the play being performed on stage should definitely help the students write more informed and insightful answers in their exam in June.



# St. Mary's Camera Soirée

This week there is a watery theme to many of the photographs submitted by members of the Camera Soirée.

But first a couple of spring flowers. Brendan submitted a photo of the wild flour, the Common Fumitory which he describes as one of the most beautiful and overlooked wild flowers. Historically, herbalists have used Common fumitory to treat skin diseases, and to cleanse the kidneys. However, the plant is actually poisonous, so this should not be tried at home. Kay submitted a photo of an early flowering Cowslip which is a member of the primrose family. This plant also has a very long history of medicinal use.







Donal was in the vicinity of Vicarstown in County Laois and submitted some photos of house boats on the Grand Canal and bridges over the canal.

The canal was built in stages with the portion from Sallins to Dublin opening in 1779. After that attention was turned to completing the link to the Shannon.at Ballinasloe. In all it took 47 years to build the entire route. The official opening took place in April 1804.

Paddy was out early in Howth where he caught a fisherman competing with seagulls for his catch. Finally, he caught a beautiful sunrise over Dublin Bay from Clontarf.
