No one chooses to exist in a difficult situation but as we all do at some stage. The value of the fact that we are all part of a world, local, family community calls us to action, compassion and connection with one another at the most vulnerable points as well as the most celebratory points.

If we have the good fortune to be facing a significant moment happily, we are truly fortunate. Some will not have arrived at the same point with the gift of life, or good health, or the means to engage as they truly would wish. Life is not a competition! It's a journey shared with every other human being. It's not a competition!

Child Benefit and the New Baby Grant Who gets Child Benefit?

You can get Child Benefit if you are a parent or guardian of a child under 16.

You can also get Child Benefit for children aged 16, 17 and 18 if they:

Are in full-time education or full-time training, or Have a disability and cannot support themselves

Child Benefit is normally paid to the child's mother or stepmother. However, if you are the child's father or stepfather, you can get the payment if the child lives with you.

What counts as full-time education or training?

Full-time education includes primary and postprimary school, further education and training courses, and third-level courses.

However, full-time education does not include courses:

That are part of an employment, apprenticeship, or work experience programme.

That arise from employment.

Where the period of paid work experience is more than the time spent in the classroom.

Run by Teagasc where, in an academic year, the period of work experience is more than the time spent in the classroom.

How much is Child Benefit?

Child Benefit is €140 a month for each child. It is a universal payment, so you can get it regardless of your income and social insurance (PRSI) record.

If you have twins, you get one-and-a-half times the normal monthly rate of Child Benefit for each child. For triplets and other multiple births, Child Benefit is paid at double the normal monthly rate for each child.

What is the New Baby Grant?

If your child is born or adopted on or after 1 December 2024, you get a New Baby Grant as well as the first month of Child Benefit. The New Baby Grant is €280. If you have twins, you get €280 for each child.

When should I apply for Child Benefit?

Depending on your situation, you should apply for Child Benefit within 12 months of:

Your baby being born.

The child becoming a member of your family. Your family coming to live in Ireland.

Starting work in Ireland (if your children are living in another EU country).



School tour: 40 students, from TY and 5th yr, and 6 teachers travelled to the popular ski resort of Bansko in Bulgaria during the mid-term break. They spent six days there where they got 4 hours of fun ski lessons from highly qualified instructors each day. The resort has an excellent network of downhill runs, ideal for beginners and intermediates alike, with over 50km of piste in the resort. On the last day, the students were gracefully cruising down the more daunting slopes like seasoned Olympic skiers! They group also enjoyed numerous fun evening "apres-ski" activities such as swimming, karaoke, quizzes, board games, ice-skating and shopping. They returned home on Saturday 22nd February, tired but exhilarated after a memorable school tour.



This was a once in a lifetime trip and the students were very grateful to the teachers who travelled with them. The group have created wonderful memories for themselves and some have even been bitten by the skiing bug so it won't be the last time on the slopes for some of them! All of the students are to be commended on their maturity, good manners and exemplary behaviour throughout. The students' fantastic co-operation made life easier for the remaining teachers. They really were excellent ambassadors for the school throughout the entire trip.

Soccer: Well done to our 1st yr soccer team, who advanced to the Dublin West Regional League Final after defeating local rivals Lucan CC 2-1, in a frantic, frenetic, feisty and ferocious local derby held on Friday 14th February. Finn O' Sullivan

and Daniel Abbott got the crucial goals to secure a hard-fought win for the team.

They will now face Salesian College, Celbridge in the Final, which will be held on the astro in Ballyoulster United FC next Thursday. The winners will advance to the Dublin Metropolitan League semi-finals, along with the Dublin North and Dublin South Regional Winners. The three regional runners-up will then play off for the one remaining semi-final place.

Athletics: Our athletes were in action again recently at the Cross Country Leinster Finals, held in the Phoenix Park on Wednesday 12th February. 1st yrs Daniel Abbott and Max Henleywillis ran in the Minor Boys 2km race, which involved 1 full lap of the challenging course. Daniel finished in a respectable 38th place (out of 110 runners) in a time 7:13, while Max placed 66th in a time of 7:37. Both students gave their all in a highly competitive field, packed with experienced cross-country athletes. There were just 10 secs separating 16 athletes in Daniel's finishing group, with about 20 athletes separated by a similar time in Max's group, so they were both very close to much higher finishes.

We also had a team of four 3rd yrs, Conor Abbot, Paddy McGonigle, Conor Gilmore and Harry O' Connor, competing in the 4.5km Inter Boys race, which involved three full laps of course A. Conor finished in 18th place (out of 102 runners) in a time of 16:17, but unfortunately he just missed out on qualification for the All Ireland Finals (only the top 15 qualified). It was a typically gutsy, brave, determined run from Conor who was with the leading pack throughout the fast race. He left plenty in the tank for a strong finish but agonisingly missed out by a few seconds. Senan, Conor and Harry also completed the extremely tough course in respectable times, as they finished among the pack just behind the elite athletes. We are very proud to have such talented and committed cross-country runners represent the school, with such great distinction, in these prestigious competitions.

Fundraising: Coláiste Phádraig recently held a Valentine's Day Coffee Morning, which was a heart-warming event that brought staff together in support of Pieta House, raising an impressive €314 to aid their vital work in mental health and suicide prevention. The atmosphere was filled with warmth and generosity as everyone came together to enjoy delicious treats, great conversation, and a shared commitment to making a difference.

1-4s as well, to eventually win 60-20, to advance to the semi-finals at Lucan's expense. Simon scored all 20 of the team's points while Elliott Reilly, Liam Whelan and Matthew Mackey impressed for Lucan with energetic, committed and whole-hearted performances.



Defibrillator Expansion:



St. Mary's Camera Soirée

Conor has produced the first photographs of the subject for the month of March with his photograph of the gates at the back entrance to Luttrellstown Castle.

The Camera Soirée has chosen the subject of "gates" for the month of March but we still have some Spring flowers from February, in particular a photograph of the first Wood Anemone spotted by Brendan along the Strawberry Beds. The flower is part of the buttercup family and blooms from March to May in this part of the world.



The castle dates from the early 15th century. The demesne and adjoining lands had been granted to Sir Geoffrey de Luttrell about 1210 by King John of England and the castle was in the hands of the Luttrell family until the beginning of the 19th century. Victoria Adams married David Beckham there in 1999.



We got some nice monochrome photos from Donal which captured the light and shade beautifully.

Brendan got quite excited that Donal had managed to photograph a bumble bee and remarked that he had seen his first tortoiseshell butterfly, both surely signs that Spring is here. Ireland has 21 native Bumblebee species. Four are endangered, 2 are vulnerable and the Great Yellow Bumble bee is on the verge of extinction.

Conor spotted some Cormorants on the Liffey just above the weir. Cormorants are generally sociable birds that nest in colonies, gather in flocks and often hunt

together in groups.
