A Pilgrims Tale

50 pilgrims from the parishes of St. Mary's and St. Patrick's spent a beautiful week from April 22nd to 29th in northern Italy. Our trip began with a late-night arrival in Assisi, a beautiful hilltop town in the province of Umbria. Assisi is known world over because it was the birthplace of St. Francis the renowned reforming friar of the 12th century. Our first full day entailed a fair amount of walking the streets of the ancient town. We visited the tomb of St. Francis himself and also the tomb of St. Clare, his first female follower. The atmosphere in those special places is difficult to describe, you certainly come away with the feeling that you have been in the presence of something profoundly sacred.



While in Assisi we also visited the shrine of a very modern shining example of holiness, Blessed Carlo Acutis. Carlo was just 16 years old when he died of leukaemia. He was born in London in 1991, where his parents were working at the time. Shortly after his birth they returned to Italy where Carlo grew up. Throughout his short life Carlo exhibited a deep faith and was instrumental in bringing his non-practicing family back to the practice of their faith.

His mother testifies that apart from her wedding and funerals she rarely attended church until her young son pleaded with her to bring him to regular Mass. Carlo was a child of

his times and was a keen computer gamer. He also established a website dedicated to documenting the many Eucharistic miracles from around the world. He had a deep faith in the Lord and expressed the wish to be laid to rest in Assisi, a favourite place of his. His shrine contains his mortal remains, dressed in contemporary jeans and casual jacket in Nike runners. It attracts pilgrims from all over Italy and far beyond. Our group had the opportunity to pray there.

From Assisi we journey to the small Tuscan town of Montecatini which was our base for the next five nights. From here we made a day trip to the beautiful town of Lucca. Here in the 7th Century, an Irishman, Freddiano by name, was elected bishop and his mortal remains are displayed under the main altar of the Cathedral. The local priest was delighted to welcome pilgrims from Ireland and made us very welcome. The cathedral also contains the mortal remains of a local girl, St. Zita whose feast day occurred on our visit.

Our other excursions included Pisa, home of the famous leaning tower, and its magnificent Cathedral as well as Florence with its awe-inspiring Duomo.

On a less religious note, our pilgrimage brought us to a nearby vineyard for a wonderful lunch and a wine tasting experience. We all came away rosy cheeked and in good form!

En route to the Airport our final port-of-call was to the beautiful town of Orvieto and to the shrine of a Eucharistic Miracle in the Magnificent Cathedral there. We spend a pleasant couple of hours exploring another character filled historic town.

In summation, I think it's accurate to say that a good time was had by all!

If you want to vote in these elections, you must be registered to vote by Monday, 20 May 2024.

If you are eligible, you can apply to be included on the Postal Voters List or the Special Voters List up to 11 May 2024.

How to vote in a local election

You do not have to be an Irish citizen to vote in a local election. However, you must be ordinarily resident in the State to register on the Register of Electors. You may not vote in both a county council and a city council election.

To vote in a local election, you must: Be over 18 years of age Live in the local electoral area Be listed on the Register of Electors

To find out if your name is on the Electoral Register you can:

Check online at checktheregister.ie, or Your local authority office

If you want to be added to the Electoral Register, you can complete an application form and return it to your local authority. Application forms are available online at checktheregister.ie or at your local authority office.

Send your completed application form by freepost to your local authority. There is no need to put a stamp on the envelope.

You can also register to vote online at checktheregister.ie. If you are registering for Dublin, you can register at voter.ie.

European Parliament election in 2024

Voting in the European Parliament election will be held on Friday, 7 June 2024. Polling stations will open from 7am to 10pm.

Check if you are registered to vote.

If you want to vote in this election you must be registered to vote by Monday, 20 May 2024.

If you are eligible, you can apply to be included on the Postal Voters List or the Special Voters List up to 11 May 2024.

Who can vote in a European election?

To be eligible to vote in European elections in Ireland, you must be:

A citizen of the European Union

18 years of age

Listed in the Register of Electors If you are an EU citizen and you were not registered to vote in previous European elections in Ireland, you must apply for registration and complete a statutory declaration form (EP1) which is available from City and County Councils.

The forms are sent to your home Member State to prevent double voting.

You can find more information on our website about registering to vote and how to check if you are registered to vote in Ireland.

Living in another EU country You cannot vote in more than one country or constituency.





And guess what – two of those poisonous books are Irish. All four books have emerald green covers, and the pigment was likely laced with arsenic, to get that particular colour.


The Irish books were two volumes of *The Ballads* of *Ireland"* by *Edward Hayes published in 1855*. The Library has been testing for such books since 2019

Although the students missed out on the main awards, they all performed superbly and represented the school with tremendous distinction.

English: As part of the English Department's literacy programme, a *Drop Everything And Read* (DEAR) week was held in the school last week. All Junior Cycle students took part and the principal announced the 20 minute periods every day where the students stopped working in their classroom and took the time to read quietly a book that they had brought in. The library fully opened its doors on Monday to students and the English teachers took their classes over for a few periods during the week.

Some of the more popular tiles read by students this year included *The Outsiders, The Boy in the Smoke, Wings of Fire, The Lost Heir, Once, Artemis Fowl and the Artic Incident.* The sports books were very popular with the students of course while some others preferred such literature classics as *Fahrenheit 451, Lord of the Flies, To Kill a Mockingbird, The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* and *The Three Musketeers* so it was great to see such an eclectic mix of reading material in the different classes.

Geography: Our 5th yr Geography students travelled to Glendalough on Tuesday to carry out a fluvial study of the Luggduff Brook River. The students spent a lot of time in the river studying various geographical features relevant to their Leaving Cert course such as erosion, deposition, gradient and river discharge. Once the hard work was done, they had some free time for lunch in the great outdoors and a scenic stroll back to the bus while viewing the beautiful geographical features that Glendalough has to offer.

The students now must follow up by completing a research project for their LC Geographical Investigation worth 20% of their overall marks. The teachers were delighted with the behaviour, co-operation and active participation of the students throughout.



Josie sent in some photographs from the recent pilgrimage to Italy including one of the Leaning Tower of Pisa, the free-standing bell tower of Pisa Cathedral which was constructed between 1173 and 1372. It was built on soft ground that could not properly support the tower's weight and by 1990 it had reached a tilt of 5.5 degrees.

Remedial work done between 1993 and 2001 brought the tilt back to 3.97 degrees, resulting in a lean of 4.1 metres, which is where it was at in 1838. It has been declared stable for at least another 200 years!
