
Exploring the Scriptures

In our tradition, people can sometimes maintain a distance from the Bible because they are unsure of how it might be relevant in the everchanging world we live in, or simply find the Scriptures too large and daunting to approach by oneself. Therefore, the focus of this year's Scripture Summer School is Unlocking the Bible: Kevs for Understanding Today. This course will aim to offer keys with which to understand, read, and interpret the Bible for life, for change, for liberation, for personal praver, and for discipleship.

The final day of the course will also feature a Lectio Divina session led by Professor Séamus O'Connell, and an in-person launch of the Tarsus Scripture School by Archbishop Dermot Farrell.

Course Structure

The course this year will take place in-person, but also be available online via live-streaming. Each session will also be recorded and made



available afterwards in a similar way to past online courses. For those who plan to come to Maynooth, there will be the option to attend daily Eucharist, and there will be time each day for you to study, reflect, or simply explore the beautiful campus grounds and surrounding town. If you require accommodation, there are options on campus - details are found further below.

Continued from last week:

There are 3 different types of social welfare agency arrangements.

Temporary agent arrangement

If you are unable to collect your payment at a post office for a short period of time a temporary agent can be appointed by completing an Appointment of Temporary Agent Form (pdf) which is available at the post office. When collecting your payment the agent presents and signs this form along with their photo identification and your social services card or Public Services Card.

Nominating an agent to collect your payment If you are unable to collect your payment at a post office, due to an illness or loss of mobility for example, you can nominate a person to do this on your behalf by completing and returning the form Authority to Appoint an Agent form (pdf).

Arrangements are made with the post office to facilitate the agent collecting the payment and you are notified of this.

If you are not able to manage your financial affairs If you are not able to manage your financial affairs, an agent may be appointed to collect your payment and act on your behalf. In this case a medical practitioner must certify that you do not have the capacity to manage your financial affairs. There is a section for this certification on the Authority to Appoint an Agent form (pdf).

The agent nominated is often a family member, a care representative or a representative of a nursing home or hospital.

The payment is made electronically to a nominated bank account. It is recommended that a separate account be set up for this purpose. In the case of a Ward of Court or an attorney appointed under an enduring power of attorney (see below), the DSP will make payments directly to the Committee of the Ward or to the attorney by nominating them as agent for the social welfare recipient. All such payments will be made electronically to a nominated bank account. Appointed agents have a legal duty to ensure the money is used for your benefit and they must also deal with other aspects of your social welfare payment. This includes notifying the DSP of changes to your circumstances.

Read the DSP information on appointing someone else to act on your behalf.

Power of Attorney

A power of attorney is a document in which you (the donor) authorise another person (the donee or attorney) to act for you in certain matters – on your behalf and in your name – in accordance with the terms set out in the document. A power of attorney can be specific (limited to a particular purpose, for example, sale of your house in your absence) or general (entitling the attorney to do almost everything that you yourself could do). A power of attorney must always be in writing. *There are two kinds of power of attorney:* Power of attorney which gives either a specific or a general power and ceases as soon as the donor becomes incapacitated; Enduring power of attorney which takes effect on the incapacity of the donor

Trusts

Property, including money assets, may be held in trust on behalf of another person or to achieve a particular purpose. A trust exists when a person (the trustee) holds the property of another (the settlor) for the benefit of named people. The beneficiaries may be the settlor or may be other people.

By creating a trust you can ensure that, should you subsequently become mentally incompetent, your affairs will be managed in a particular manner. The trust continues to be administered by the trustee for your benefit without the necessity to have you made a ward of court.

A trust is also a useful tool if you have a child with a disability and you want to ensure that they will be cared for if you become incapable or after your death.

Trusts are legally complex and have tax implications so you should take legal and tax advice. There are different kinds of trusts of which the most usual are express trusts and discretionary trusts. Discretionary trusts are especially useful if you want to provide for an incapacitated child without affecting their entitlement to State benefits. Certain trust funds for permanently incapacitated people may have tax exemptions.

Basketball: Congratulations to our 2nd yr basketball team who claimed the All-Ireland Junior Boys League "B" title after defeating Le Chéile, Tyrellstown by 2 points in a dramatic and enthralling Final held at the National Basketball Arena in Tallaght last Wednesday, 3rd May. Le Chéile started the game well and led 12-8 at the end of a tight 1st 1-4. They soon extended their lead to 19-10 but our 2nd yrs kept their composure to close the gap to 3 points by half-time. Point Guard Lewis Adjinakou scored a brilliant three pointer plus two baskets while Cian Kelly got two important baskets for the team.

Le Chéile started the 3rd 1-4 really well and quickly went 27-19 up. Two superb 3 pointers from the influential Ciarán O' Sullivan plus baskets from Lewis and Aaron closed the gap slightly but Le Chéile still lead by 5 at the end of the 3rd 1-4. Two baskets from Aaron plus one from Noah reduced the deficit to 1 point (35-36) before Le Chéile scored two baskets of their own to stretch their advantage to 5 points with just 2 mins remaining. Noah Dolan broke Lucan's run of missed free throws to make it 36-40 before a three pointer from Lewis reduced the deficit to one point with 42 seconds left of the clock.

Lucan desperately needed a score but with 9 seconds left on the clock their opponents had an in-bound throw right on the end line next to Lucan's basket. Thankfully Lucan's inspirational captain Lewis made a great steal from Le Chéile's throw and was immediately fouled by a panicked opponent. As they had already committed 5 team fouls in the final 1-4, this meant that Lucan were awarded two free throws with just 6.5 seconds left on the clock! His 1st free throw was perfect as it went straight into the basket without touching the rim to level the scores at 40-40. 
On the Saturday we are holding three 18 hole

Joe was in the city centre and submitted photos taken in the 14 Henrietta Street Museum, a social history museum of Dublin life that traces the history of one building's Georgian beginnings to its tenement times.





According to the Museum's website Henrietta Street is the most intact collection of early to mid-18th century houses in Ireland. Work began on the street in the 1720s when houses were built as homes

for Dublin's most wealthy families. Over the years houses such as 14 Henrietta Street underwent significant change in use. In the first half of the 19th century they became offices while from the 1870s 14 Henrietta Street was filled with families. By 1911 there were over 100 people in the house sharing one outside tap and lavatory. The last tenement residents of number 14 left in the late 1970s by which time the building was virtually abandoned by its owners. The museum is open Wednesdays to Sundays from 10am to 4pm.
