Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance (BTSCFA)

On 20 June 2022, the BTSCFA opens for online applications. Parents who qualify for the payment will automatically receive a confirmation letter before 20 June 2022. If you do not get confirmation, you can apply for the BTSCFA payment online until 30 September 2022. More information later ...

Public Services Card - The following is a reply to Parliamentary Question No 21774/22 given by Minister Heather Humphrey on 4 May 2022 "Since its inception in the late 1990s, the Public Services Card (PSC) has always been intended as a physical token of identity to be used in transactions between the citizens and the State, not just between citizens and my Department...

Once a person has successfully authenticated their identity in one of my offices, they are issued with a PSC which can be used as proof of identity when transacting with certain public bodies ("specified bodies") listed in that Act. The list of specified bodies includes the Department of Foreign Affairs and Road Safety Authority, responsible for the issuing of passports and driving licences, respectively.

This fact was recognised and acknowledged by the Data Protection Commission (DPC) in the Agreement of December last which settled my Department's appeal of an Enforcement Notice issued by the DPC.

The DPC acknowledged in that Agreement that any specified body may use the PSC as a means of verifying the identity of the people they deal with, provided that they also accept other proofs of identity. The question of whether a specified body seeks production of a PSC as proof of identity is a matter for those bodies."

Active Retirement Ireland's positive ageing audio series launches on community radio stations- The first

episode will be broadcast on Liffey Sound 96.4FM on Monday the 30th of May at 3pm.

A new audio series 'The Old Country', which explores healthy ageing in Ireland, is to begin broadcasting on community radio stations around Ireland in partnership with CRAOL. It is produced by Active Retirement Ireland, the country's largest representative body for older people. The Old Country' was first launched as a podcast last July and was previously only available to stream through internet listening services, such as Spotify and iTunes, as well as on the Active Retirement Ireland website.

Commenting on the announcement, CEO of Active Retirement Ireland, Maureen Kavanagh, said: "I am delighted to announce our partnership with CRAOL Community Radio Ireland and the launch of our podcast series 'The Old Country' on community radio stations around Ireland. Across the 12 podcast episodes, our guest speakers from older people to experts in fields of gerontology, human rights and inclusion — give a picture of ageing in Ireland that is both a reflection and a yearning to create a country that is a better place to grow old, now and into the future. The podcast was recorded during the pandemic and during a time when we saw older people lose their agency and their voice and really struggle to get it back. While we can reflect on this and the impact that Covid-19 had on older people's lives, we also need to take this opportunity to learn from it, to move forward and recreate an Ireland where everyone is valued and respected. This message is not just for older people. Ireland's population is getting older, it is in everybody's interest for our country to be a better place to be an older person."
