Mammy! Everyone's Says.....!

It was stunning to watch the huge crowd of people that gathered in O'Connell Street on Hallowe'en night in anticipation of a parade which had been announced on social media! This was on a night when the gardai and emergency services were more than overly occupied on the outskirts of the city! How could anyone have considered that there was any sense or sensibility in bringing families, with children, into an environment that would have such potential to be unsafe without proper policing and safeguards! Where was the reliable source!

I belong to a few WhatsApp groups which, thankfully, are for the sole purpose of sharing factual information for working groups. It works to very good effect. However, I am aware of WhatsApp groups that become hijacked by individuals who shout loudly and frequently and may then become the seemingly considered voice of true source and reason! Sometimes such information arrives from third or fourth party rumouring, or from the pit of personal angst, rather than an objective source!

It's not a bad idea to ask if the content is actual fact, or if it could be fiction before jumping on a passing band wagon. Anyone who is a parent or teacher has heard: '*everyone says... or everyone is doing....*' and when we dig down and ask **WHO** is everyone, the everyone is the fabricated crowd that a child might build up to back a wish! (Shh! I did this as a teenager myself!) We need to dig down into the source of our own information with regard to what is important ourselves also.

The growing shape of our families, local communities, nation... depends on each one of us ensuring that we inform ourselves as we build our values and beliefs. Values and beliefs grow from our experience and evolve with deliberate consideration. When we vote, we do so as individuals – the gift of democracy. In the same way, it is important to take time to consider our own values and beliefs in the context of our own lives and as part of wider community, while standing in an objective space considering all information. Sheep and cows are beautiful creatures that live in herds and follow one another for physical protection! We are not sheep or cattle!

We have the most highly educated population in our country than ever before. We know how to do objective research and engage in objective debate with respect for all, including ourselves. Objective research requires the courage to stand apart and follow the correct path of enquiry and respect for those who do so, without the backing of unchecked 'influencers'! We need to check: Is this a reliable source? Is it a source that I trust? Are the underpinning values ones that I embrace?

Current Scam Warning - 'quishing'

Be careful about a current scam (called 'quishing') involving fake QR codes attached to parking meters. Once you scan the code you are directed towards a website which requests credit card information and other personal data. The Garda National Cyber Crime Bureau

(GNCCB) has these tips:

Avoid using QR codes for payments

Never download apps directly from QR codes Always check where a QR code leads to before scanning

Use multi-factor authentication (MFA) on your accounts for extra security

Only scan QR code from sources you trust and recognise

Keep your computer and phone software updated regularly to protect against security threats

Current scam warning - Electricity Account Credit scam texts

A scam alert has been issued to warn people about receiving text messages that tell you to click on a link to claim an energy credit. These texts link to a site that looks like gov.ie.

The Government is not offering any such scheme and people are warned not to click on the link or enter any personal details.

Irish Council for Prisoners Overseas

The Irish Council for Prisoners Overseas (ICPO) is a charitable organisation that works to provide information and support to Irish people imprisoned overseas and their families.

ICPO services include:

Providing information and support to prisoners and their families on a wide range of issues, including repatriation, deportation, health, legal matters, discrimination and ill-treatment Representing prisoners' interests to relevant parties (Irish embassies and consulates, welfare agencies, probation and legal officers) Monitoring repatriation applications with the Department of Justice

Providing help to prisoners in preparation for their release

Visiting prisoners and helping families with travel and accommodation for prison visits

The ICPO holds a Family Information Day each year to provide families with information and support and to give them the opportunity to meet other people who have a relative in prison overseas.

Consular Assistance

Irish embassies and consulates ensure that the rights of Irish citizens who are arrested or imprisoned abroad are fully respected. In many cases the local authorities will only contact the Irish embassy or consulate if requested to do so. Among other things, a consular officer can: Help with getting information about prison arrangements

Provide information about local lawyers Provide families with information about the prison and legal arrangements in the country where their family member is detained Help prisoners to maintain contact with friends and family and arrange for the safe transfer of funds they provide

Put the detained person in touch with relevant agencies such as ICPO

To those reading this, maybe you might think twice about your personal safety when out walking or perhaps consider how you would respond if it was you or your loved one that was assaulted?



Hazaradous Footpath

Dear Newsletter,

I had a nasty fall on the footpath on my walk to the village last Monday afternoon. It was daylight about 3pm. I was walking from St. Joseph's college down to the village on the right hand side of the road, the Sarsfield Park side. I accidently stepped into a pothole that was hidden in the autumn leaves. I twisted my ankle and but for the fact that I was linking my husband my injury could have been a lot worse.

The potholes on that particular section of footpath have been there for years but the leaves and the pine needles are recent arrivals, deposited after storm Ashley on 21 /22 October.

Why, I ask myself have the council made no attempt to clear the footpath and the drain channels of these leaves. It can't be because they don't have the money.

It must be a great source of annoyance to the teams of volunteer workers who do sterling work, cleaning, planting, and tidying throughout our village when they see what can only be construed as the councils disregard for their effort.

As for the potholes in the footpath, what can I say, only that their repair is long overdue.

Coláiste Phádraig CBS

School tour: 22 students and three teachers, Ms. Winters, Mr. Moran and Mr. Rafter, travelled to Iceland over the mid-term for a memorable fourday educational school tour. The group flew out to Reykjavik on Monday 28th Oct and arrived at the Cabin Hotel, which was to be their base for the tour, after a short transfer.

On Tuesday, the group began their tour with a visit to the Secret Lagoon, the oldest swimming pool in Iceland, located in the village of Fludir in the Golden Circle, which contains the most popular natural wonders of Iceland. The swimming pool was surrounded by several natural hot springs, including a little geyser, which made for a lovely refreshing swim for the students! They then learned about Iceland's interesting geological history with a walk visited the pingvellir National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site since 2004. They then visited the famous Geysir geothermal area in the Haukadulur Valley, with its bubbling hot springs and hot mud pots. The students were awestruck by the area's most active geyser, Strokkur, which erupts up to 30m every 10mins or so. It really was a sight to behold close up with the spring shooting up vast jets of boiling water up to 100ft high! The group then moved on to visit Gullfoss Falls,

one of Iceland's most iconic natural attractions and undoubtedly one of the most impressive waterfalls in Europe.

Next up was a trip to the Blue Lagoon, a Geothermal Spa located in a sprawling 800 yr old lava field in the heart of the Reykjanes Penisula-a UNESCO Geopark. The pleasantly warm, geothermal seawater is rich in minerals such as silica which does wonders for the skin so the students all felt refreshed and invigorated after another enjoyable swim.

After dinner back in the hotel the group managed to catch a short glimpse of the incredible Northern Lights on the South West Coast. The students were taken aback by the eerie, spine tingling beauty of this spectacular natural phenomenon. The following day the group visited the South Shore region where they discovered more about how volcanic activity shaped the Land of Fire and Ice. They visited the lava fields around Hengill mountain and then took the Hellisheioi pass, where they enjoyed great views over the southern plains and small towns. They also visited the Skogafoss Waterfall, one of the largest and most photographed in Iceland, and the "Black Sand Beach" where they witnessed examples of coastal erosion and extrusive volcanic features (similar to the Giants Causeway). The group got to walk along the beach and listen to the thunderous

Atlantic waves that have shaped Iceland's landscape over millions of years.


Junior Camogie: Well done to the junior camogie team who beat Mountsackville in their last championship group game. They now progress to the knockout stages of the competition.




St. Mary's Camera Soirée
