I Want to be Happy!

There is much being written currently about how to attain happiness, with happiness as the core goal! Happiness is the unplanned result of a particular experience of love, of the beauty of the world around us, of an experience of attainment... The current unconnected drive for the happiness buzz reminds me of the Jungian concept of the inner child which allow us to understand how we might wish to remain in the comfort zone of life to avoid pain. Jung's concept and consequent theory and therapy is about understanding what is at our core so that we may get on with a healthy way of life.

The comfort zone is fine when sitting with a dry nappy in the cot, but the world is a bigger place than the baby's cot. Also, the nappy won't stay dry! It's good to get out of the cot to experience the world even if we are going to get lost, fall over things and crash at times! It's good to outgrow the nappy and gain freedom. Happiness may then come as a result of stepping onto the reality of the journey rather than waiting for it to come to us. Few condone putting a soother in a baby's mouth, never mind into our own adult mouths as desired in seeking the happiness fix! We all need some respite, at times, but not regression back to the cot.

Happiness will not pop up in a mine field of unresolved anger, resentment, blame, draining relationships or self-flagellation. We all drop into this mine field, at times, but we need to learn to step back and take a look at the bigger picture to find the safe stepping stones — usually not far away. Happiness will tap us on the shoulder when we least expect it, not when planned. How often do we plan what seems like a great happy event and sometimes then wonder what it was all really about if the desired level of happiness was not attained!

Happiness is the by-product of efforts, encounters and experiences. When we merely aim for happiness, we may miss the road that will take us there. Shaking off an attitude of it being all-about-me is the first key to get us out of the cot that is too small and looking into the many nooks and crannies of life from which happiness might pop!

The Regulation of Elections

Who regulates elections in Ireland?

An Coimisiún Toghcháin (the Electoral Commission) is the independent statutory body that oversees elections in Ireland.

Established on 9 February 2023, the make-up and functions of the Commission are set out in The Electoral Reform Act 2022.

An Coimisiún Toghcháin has replaced the Referendum Commission.

Functions of An Coimisiún Toghcháin

The functions of the Commission are set out in the Electoral Reform Act 2022, and include: Informing the public about referendums. Reviewing constituencies and constituency boundaries for general, European and local elections.

Telling people about how they can vote and encouraging people to vote in elections and referendums.

Maintaining the Register of Political Parties Overseeing the management of Registers of Electors by local authorities.

Regulating online political advertising.

What is the State Pension (Contributory)?

You can get the State Pension (Contributory) from the age of 66 if you have enough social insurance (PRSI) contributions. It is sometimes called the old-age pension.

The State Pension (Contributory) is not means tested. You can get it even if you have other income, such as an occupational pension.

As the social insurance (PRSI) conditions are very complex, you should apply for a State Pension (Contributory) if you have ever worked in Ireland and have paid PRSI contributions (stamps) at any time.

If you retire early, make sure you continue paying PRSI contributions, or that you are getting credited contributions (if you are eligible). This can help you get a contributory pension when you reach pension age.

How to qualify for a State Pension (Contributory)

To qualify for a State Pension (Contributory), you must be aged 66 or over, and have enough Class A, E, F, G, H, N, or S social insurance contributions (PRSI). These are also called full-rate PRSI contributions.

You must meet 3 conditions, including:

- 1. You have paid PRSI contributions before a certain age
- 2. You have a certain number of paid PRSI contributions
- 3. You have a 'yearly average' or total number of contributions

Changes to the State Pension (Contributory) 2025

From 1 January 2025, if you were born on or after 1 January 1959, your pension rate will be calculated using either:

Only the 'Total Contribution Approach (TCA)' A combination of the 'yearly average method' and 'Total Contribution Approach (TCA)'. You will get whichever rate is greater. Read about these methods under 'How your pension application is assessed' on our website.

Over the following 10 years (from 2025 to 2034), the 'yearly average method' will be phased out. By 2034, all pensions for people born on or after 1 January 1968, will be calculated using only the TCA.

Irish Garden Bird Survey

This year's Irish Garden Bird survey will commence on Monday, November 25th and run until Sunday, February 23rd 2025,

The simple survey asks people to spend a short amount of time each week watching their garden birds and recording what they see. By gathering information from members of the public about the birds visiting gardens and other outdoor spaces such as balconies and schoolyards, BirdWatch Ireland can get a better understanding of how bird populations are faring in Ireland. Up to 2,000 households in Ireland take part annually and this year marks the 36th year of the survey.


Participating in the Irish Garden Bird Survey each winter is a simple and effective way of contributing to a crucial body of data that will help to guide conservation, while also increasing your bird knowledge. The survey is open to individuals, families, schools and local community groups.




dedication throughout the year. Also, they want to thank the 6th years who played their last game in the green Joeys jersey for all their service to camogie in the school over the last six years.



plumes for the decoration of hats. It became locally extinct in northwestern Europe as a result. Thanks to conservation laws, by the beginning of the

21st century the bird was breeding again in France, the Netherlands, Ireland and Britain. Brendan tells me that the bird is a beautiful sight along the river Liffey, particularly in Lucan Demesne which provides ideal nesting and foraging grounds for the bird.
