Living with the Pain of Grief!

During this month there will be services taking place in our churches at which those who have died will be remembered. The loved ones of the deceased arrive in this month in as wide a variety of states as they are in number. While we honour those who have died during the year, we also honour and respect those who are bereaved and may be struggling to live with a whole maelstrom of feelings while trying to live a normal life again.

I spoke with a lady who is grieving as her mother died recently. She described grief as an unexpected shower of hailstones that come out of the blue when most unexpected. Her feelings were of guilt for sometimes feeling normal, sometimes a wrenching sense of loss, sometimes a sense of sheer exhaustion. She often felt the loss as a great feeling of pain.

Everyone's experience of grief is different, sometimes with commonalities between people. It certainly doesn't happen in a step-by-step stage process as it skids on the moving tracks of the feeling world. There are some feelings that we like to have and some which we would like to avoid. However, no feeling is either right or wrong. Feelings just are! Rational, decided thought can be used to hide feelings, dismiss them, or park them without due care, so that they end up hurting us more rather than less!

We sometimes want to fix those who are hurting and to push them out of the way of grief. However, it needs to happen in the way that works for the individual with respect to how they might need to process the loss. Listening is the greatest gift for anyone who needs to talk their way along the journey of grief! Talking is a valuable therapy with silent listening the greatest balm and expression of respect and value for the person concerned.

If anyone reading this needs to talk to someone who will listen objectively and non-judgmentally, there is a Bethany Group in St Mary's Parish which is open to all who are grieving and want some support along the journey. Humanitarian Assistance Scheme

My home was damaged in Storm Ashley and I can't afford to fix it. Can I get any financial help?

The Humanitarian Assistance Scheme provides emergency financial assistance to households if you cannot meet the costs for essential needs and repair to your home after a severe weather event such as flooding.

What does the scheme cover?

The scheme covers:

Emergency income support payments such as food, clothing and personal items

Damage to your home and essential contents, such as carpets, flooring, furniture, household appliances and bedding

Structural damage

How do I qualify for the scheme?

Your household income will be assessed to decide if you can afford to fix your home to make it habitable. All your household income will be considered. You do not need to be getting a social welfare payment. The amount awarded by the scheme depends on how severe the damage is and your ability to meet the costs.

You can get 100% of the amount allowable if you are:

Single with an income of €50,000 or less

A couple - married, civil partnership or cohabiting — with a combined household income of €90,000 or less

For each whole €1000 over your qualifying amount, you must make a 1% contribution to the amount allowable. Your income limits increase for each qualified child if you get a social welfare payment. If you have an adult non-dependent child in your household, 20% of their gross income is added to the household income.

How do I apply for the scheme?

To apply, you should complete the Humanitarian Assistance Scheme application form (pdf).

Your application should include:

Evidence of your household income (pay slips etc)

Estimates for repairs or replacement A copy of your insurance policy (if you have a policy)

Paid invoices/receipts

Any other information to support your claim Send your completed form to the Community Welfare Officer (CWO) at your local Community Welfare Service.

Auto-enrolment Pension Scheme

Auto-enrolment is a new pension savings scheme for certain employees who are not paying into a pension. They will be automatically included in the scheme but can opt out after 6 months. The introduction of the Auto-Enrolment Retirement Savings Scheme, called My Future Fund, will start from 30 September 2025. Under the scheme, the employee, employer, and Government all pay a certain amount into the employee's pension fund.

A new public body, the National Automatic Enrolment Retirement Savings Authority, will be set up to administer the Auto-enrolment scheme. The scheme will be supervised by the Pensions Authority.

The rules for auto-enrolment are set out in the Automatic Enrolment Retirement Savings System Act 2024.



Wells for Zoe just grows and grows

Just home after our 49th working trip to Malawi: As (Sean Keane might sing) "Our home away from home, and we're already making plans to go again!

Two years ago in a little flash of madness I decided that we could convert a disused building into a rural health clinic. This flash from somewhere **above** has seen us open our 12th such facility this week. It is our first with the Southern Region Health Board, who had 28 of these running until Government funding stopped a few months ago. Devaluation of the Malawian currency by over 50% has been a disaster.

This monthly clinic will be linked to our tree nurseries and tree planting projects in this new area for us.

The official opening was on Monday last in a disused building we refurbished for the job. The people came from everywhere. All the Chiefs and community groups came together for the big occasion.

They hired (or borrowed) two tents, got 100 chairs and set everything up for the big day. They had the head of District Nursing and Midwifery 12 chiefs, 5 Community Nurses, 1 Doctor and 5 Area health officers. We would love to have been there but (Dr) Eamonn was lucky enough to attend and be part of the action

Family planning / Contraceptives, Weighing to test the malnourished, HIV Testing, Antenatal care.

Outpatient Department Care; For under - 5s, Immunisations.

Malaria testing, Consultations, Drug administration

Undernourished children with Nutritional Assessments.

If anyone needs Hospital treatment we just whizz them off in a taxi to the nearest hospital where they can be treated and regularly returned on the day.

Many of the children are malnourished so we have recently started to develop model gardens, at all our 12 Clinics without fertilizers, but instead inter-planting with nitrogen fixing species, like Sesbania, Velvet bean and Sunn Hemp. These will be used for research and demonstration purposes and will be managed by some of our more experienced forestry workers and worked on by the community. The aim will be twofold, to demonstrate easier ways of growing nutritious food and to provide food for the malnourished children who attend the clinics. We also have two clinics for men who don't attend with women!!

Education of girls has always been a big interest of ours, remembering the Ireland long ago (or even in my own time)

We fund over 334 girls in secondary school and over 30 in University. We run about 60 preschools for boys and girls where we have about a hectare of land where the parents come together to produce food to feed them. Then we fund over 30 girls in University.

One of our girls has come back, to work for us recently, after getting 3, A's in her degree. This is great news for St Patricks Parish, (Lucan) who funded her education over the years and for which we are so thankful, more so maybe because very little of our funding is local or Irish. The pumps go on and on, Manufacturing, Installing and Maintaining.

Forestry is our major project these days. Over the years Malawi like everywhere cut down its trees without replacing any, leaving hillsides without any soil and all the negatives that involves.

We plant only local species, follow their progress with cameras on two huge drones and have record reproduction and growth rates. Our funders observe everything very closely and value how we treat communities, with healthcare, education food production. This means they are less likely to cut down or burn the trees.

Of course the project employs up to 2000 workers in busy times, mainly women, who never had an income before.

We are panning our 50th visit in March and no doubt a little celebration.



Lucan Newsletter Editorial 17th October 1982: Fifteen Years

There is a legend about St Brigid of Kildare. She asked of a local chieftain what land she could cover with her cloak as a site for a monastery. It is such a miracle of architectural arrangement that marks the blessing yesterday by Bishop Murray of the completed building programme of St. Joseph's College. A modern college for 550 pupils has come to full growth on a compact site, very much in the heart of residential Lucan.


The Presentation Sisters have been involved in Primary Education in Lucan since 1867. In 1955 there was a need for Secondary Top – a type of free education scheme. The numbers attending increased rapidly until in 1967, the Centenary


Year, the Sisters decided to establish a formal Secondary School under the Free Education Scheme introduced by the Department of Education in 1966.

The first stage of the new building opened in 1969, the second stage in 1971. St. Joseph's College was formally opened in 1972. The increased facilities now provided by the 4th and last stage are welcomed by staff and students alike. The high educational standards achieved in such difficult conditions will continue to be stimulating challenge to those who now enjoy the facilities so longed for and so hardly won.

St. Joseph's College has good cause for celebration this week.

Recently, teacher Catherine Blythe discovered the above programme in storage, and thought it might be of interest to our readers. The front cover reads: "St. Joseph's College Grand Opening Concert in College Hall", and it cost just 10p.

The inside pages list the many and varied acts, and was quite a feat given that this concert took place in October, a month after all had returned to school. It's also interesting to look at the advertisements of the day – we count only two that we know of, still in business – Gannon Office & School Supplies (*now in Celbridge*), and Kenny's Vesey Arms.

Note: Before it was known as St. Joseph's College, it was simply **Presentation Convent Lucan Secondary School**, and the school crest bore the intertwined letters **PCL**, embroidered in blue and silver.

I'm pleased to share that my motion to bring the HSE to an upcoming local committee meeting has passed. We'll now be issuing a formal letter requesting a HSE representative to join us, where they'll provide updates and address healthcare concerns directly with the committee. Many of you have shared frustrations about GP shortages, long waiting lists, and other healthcare access issues here in Lucan. As our community grows, the demand on local health services keeps increasing, making it even harder for residents to get timely care. Having the HSE attend our meeting will give us a chance to understand the challenges from their perspective and to explore possible solutions to improve local healthcare access. I'll keep you updated on any response from the HSE and will continue pushing for better access to health services for our community.

Lucan Planning Council

The Metro for Lucan campaign giving access to Dublin Airport from Adamstown, Kishogue, and Clondalkin continues with huge support on the doors in Lucan. We will temporarily hold back during the GE campaigns to give the space to election candidates.

To put in context, this is the third leg of an overall transport solution for Greater Dublin Area and for access to Dublin Airport from all parts of Ireland without changing in Dublin city centre. Critical to this is that the NTA don't go ahead with a different rail gauge making link up impossible. We have made a submission to ABP on this vital point.

Existing rail network needs to be extended from Glasnevin, about 7kms to Dublin Airport, a short distance for such a great benefit. The route we propose was previously given planning permission, so there should be no issues there. Linking to the Belfast line provides an all Ireland service that speaks to the aspiration of shared island. Cork to Belfast without changing is possible, and NI can access Dublin Airport by rail.

Lucan Luas is also a vital part of the overall plan. We will explain the route and how it fits in with a Greater Dublin Orbital Luas shortly. Its all about linking and using what's there and using resources wisely.

This week the emphasis has been on mushrooms with Conor, Brendan, Joe and Kay entering the discussion as to what the mushrooms photographed are called. Brendan found a Blue Roundhead mushroom (a common species found throughout Europe, where it fruits from July to November) in Mount Andrew's Estate Park. Not to be outdone Joe found some Scarlet Waxcaps in the Curragh, the only place in Ireland where they are widespread



apparently! Conor found what Kay thinks is a Blackening Wax Cap but others think is a Silky Pinkgill. They are both found in grassy locations until late autumn.

By the way the study of fungi is called Mycology! Only a tiny percentage of the world's mushroom species have been identified and currently mycologists have described about 20,000 species around the globe. The one cardinal rule if anyone decides to go foraging for wild mushrooms is – if in doubt throw it out. Remember you can eat any mushroom once and that there are old mushroom hunters and bold mushroom hunters but there are no old, bold mushroom hunters!
