Many of you might or might not be familiar with Community Radio or the fact that there is a radio station dedicated to the community of Lucan. We are all familiar with our national broadcaster RTÉ radio and television and commercial stations like 98FM and Newstalk. Householders pay a tv and radio licence which funds the national broadcaster and commercial stations who also sell advertising to fund their operations.

Community radio does not receive anything from the licence fee nor sells advertising to run its operations. Community radio is licenced by Coimisiún na Meán (formerly BAI) to serve the community it broadcasts from which in our case is Lucan and its environs. We have been broadcasting in Lucan since 2006 from our studios in Ballyowen with 35/40 volunteers 68 hours per week irrespective of class, colour, or creed and is a non-profit organisation. We organise training courses through QQI in media expression level 3 and 4.

We support all community organisations in our area through mentions on the station and interviews. In order to keep on air, we need you our community to help us by putting a donation into our fund raising buckets outside our churches at all Masses-Sunday 1st October St. Patricks, Esker. 

# St. Therese of Lisieux

Today October 1<sup>st</sup> is the feast day of St. Therese of the Child Jesus which is not officially celebrated this year as it occurs on a Sunday. There are wonderful stories of cures and spiritual assistance which have come about through the intercession of St. Therese.

Marie Francoise Therese Martin was born in 1873 and became a Carmelite nun at the young age of only 15. She did not have a long life and passed away at the age of only 24 having written a remarkable autobiography *The Story of a Soul* which has been translated into many languages. St. Therese of Lisieux was canonised in 1925 and was declared a Doctor of the Church by Saint John Paul II, one of only four women to receive this honour. The others are her fellow Carmelite, St. Teresa of Avila, St. Catherine of Siena and St. Hildegard of Bingen.

For a lot of people, I think it is the simplicity of St. Therese's message that is most attractive and accessible. She recognised that God is present in the "bits and pieces of life" as the poet Patrick Kavanagh put it, and there is great importance in doing little things well. Not everyone is capable of great works and, even if we are, they will only be for a very small part of our lives. Instead, we should focus as Christian people in offering the simple work of our daily lives to God and realise that this is immensely important to him.

In the context of parish life, this may simply be our morning and evening prayers, attending mass when it's possible for us to so whether that's in person or online. It is also about helping people in need, whether spiritual or material, and reaching out to those in our parish community who may require assistance.

Let us pray in the coming week that we may be inspired by the example of St. Therese of Lisieux and maybe take a simpler approach to life focusing on the smaller things that really matter to God and to those we can assist.





**Basketball:** Our u19s and u16 basketball teams played their opening games of their Eastern League A campaign last week. Having won the 2<sup>nd</sup> yr All Ireland B title last yr, our school was obliged to enter all teams in the "A" competitions this yr. The seniors unfortunately faced perhaps the strongest school team in Ireland in Colaiste Eanna (who won the u16 and u19 All Ireland "A" titles last yr) in their 1<sup>st</sup> match. With several Irish internationals and a 6ft 10inch forward, the Rathfarnham side were just on another level as they cruised to an emphatic 88-15 victory against a game but somewhat shell-shocked Lucan team. Our 16s also faced an exceptional Colaiste Eanna team in what was a very high standard encounter. An unfortunate injury to key man Aaron McCormack early in the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1-4 was a devastating blow to the Lucan team who were just 7 points behind at this stage. Colaiste Éanna dominated the remainder of the match eventually winning 66-37. Aaron (6 points), Noah Dolan (6), Lewis Ajinakou (10), Cian Kelly (4), Joel Mananga (4), Ciaran O' Sullivan (5) and McKenzie Knowles (2) scored the Lucan points.

Both teams were in action again on Tuesday as they faced Moyle Park in another double-header. Our senior team were involved in a much more competitive game but a disappointing 1<sup>st</sup> 1-4, which saw they down 21-9, proved crucial as Moyle Park won by 14 points in the end on a score-line of 60-46. Alseny Bah (12), Paisley Amadasun (14) and Precious Ameke (4) were among the Lucan point scorers. With two more games to play, the team are determined to finish the group stage strongly and see where it leaves them.

# St. Mary's Camera Soirée

The Soiree's plans for their next exhibition have been put on hold until the issue around the availability of suitable stands in the Parish Centre has been resolved.

This week Paddy submitted photos of views taken along the banks of the river Liffey and Josie submitted photos of the Mansion House, St. Mary's Church in Leixlip and the Royal Hospital Kilmainham gardens (now the Irish Museum of Modern Art).





The Royal Hospital Kilmainham is the oldest classical building in Ireland and was based on Les Invalides in Paris. It was erected between 1680 and 1684 by charter of King Charles II as a home for old, sick and disabled soldiers. The beautiful gardens were originally used for medicinal purposes but over time they became the private gardens of the Master of the RHK. In recent years, the OPW has carried out works in the Gardens to restore them as formal gardens appropriate to bygone times.

According to the Discover Ireland website St. Mary's Church in Leixlip has been a site of Christian worship for more than 800 years. The present tower dates from the 12th century. The rest of the building dates from the 18th and 19th centuries.

The then Dublin Corporation purchased the Mansion House in 1715 as the official residence of the Lord Mayor. It retains this purpose to this day. The First Dáil assembled in the Round Room in January 1919 to proclaim the Irish Declaration of Independence. Two years later, in 1921, the Anglo-Irish Treaty



was ratified in the same location.
