There's a Hurricane Coming!

As I write this the news about the forthcoming (will be past as you read this) hurricane in Tampa. I consider ourselves lucky to live in a climate which is generally mild. Without doubt, from our small experience here of hurricanes, there is now a calm in anticipation of the hurricane before the energy explodes to destroy much in it's path. Nothing can be done to stop the hurricane, but there is choice with regard to how people react, with due respect for resources.

Stories abound about people clinging to property that will be at the eye of the storm or delay departure from places of extreme forecasted danger!

A hurricane is extreme in energy and experience and in the unhoped-for-category. However, while we don't experience too many overly challenging hurricanes here, we experience hurricanes of a figurative nature regularly! Life is a constant movement through challenges, some of which feel like they have the high energy of a hurricane with the energy to destroy what we treasure most in life. As none of us live in protective bubbles we all bob up and down on the waters when they are both calm and stormy. We take respite in the calm and move with the storms and challenges when they come. We build resilience.

I walk regularly in a park in Palmerstown and enjoy the down-hill perambulation. I often hesitate on the climb uphill if it happens to be a hot day. However, I have choices with regard to which incline I take – I usually take the longer route with the more gentle climb! If my energy matches the more steep route, I take it! The same analogy works with any challenge, but is not necessarily as simplistic – is usually not as simplistic! It's best to take the situation, for better or worse, and deal with it as pragmatically as possible finding the route out of the storm or challenge that is most realistic for self or family.

We have everything we need within ourselves or those around us to deal with anything that might come our way. The result may not be a desired one, but how we journey towards the destination might be made more tolerable, or even fruitful, if we choose the right route with the right companions. I'm hoping that those who are traveling out of Tampa will do so as a supportive community, sharing knowledge and resources until they find a place of security. I'm hoping that those who are inevitably heading for disasters there will have the caring support to exist in that situation as well as possible. I'm hoping that anyone who is reading this and struggling with a confounding challenge will trust in themselves and in others. I'm hoping that we are all available for one another when the storms hit!

BUDGET 2025

Some of the changes announced in the Budget come into effect immediately or before the end of 2024. Others take effect from the beginning of January 2025 or later in 2025. Many others have to be finalised before coming into effect. Some elements of these measures may change when the legislation required to bring them into effect is enacted.

Carers

The Carer's Allowance income disregard will increase to €625 for a single person and €1,250 for a couple (July 2025).

Carer's Allowance will become a qualifying payment for Fuel Allowance (January 2025). Carer's Benefit will be extended to people who are self-employed (January 2025).

The Carer's Support Grant will increase by \in 150 from \in 1,850 to \in 2,000 (June 2025).

Domiciliary Care Allowance will increase by \in 20 from \in 340 to \in 360 per month (January 2025).

Means test

If you are getting the State Pension (Non-Contributory), Disability Allowance or Blind Pension, the amount not taken into account when you sell your home to move into care will increase from $\[\in \] 190,500 \]$ to $\[\in \] 337,500 \]$ (January 2025).

Employment programmes

People on Community Employment (CE), Tús and the Rural Social Scheme will get an increase of €12 per week (January 2025). People on the Work Placement Experience Programme will get an increase of €24 per week (January 2025).

Free Travel Scheme

The Free Travel Scheme Companion Pass will be extended to all people aged over 70 (September 2025).

Fuel Allowance

The Fuel Allowance means test disregard for people aged 66 and over will be \in 524 for a single person and \in 1,048 for a couple (January 2025). Carer's Allowance will be a qualifying payment for Fuel Allowance (January 2025).

New Pay-Related Benefit Scheme

The introduction of Jobseeker's Pay-Related Benefit will start from 31 March 2025. Under the scheme, a person will get a jobseeker's payment rate linked to their previous employment income.

Pension auto-enrolment

The introduction of the auto-enrolment retirement savings scheme will start from 30 September 2025.

Carbon tax

From 9 October, the rate of carbon tax for petrol and diesel will increase from €56 to £63.50 per tonne. The increase will apply to all other fuels from 1 May 2025.

Value Added Tax (VAT)

The VAT rate on heat pumps will reduce to 9%. The reduced VAT rate of 9% on gas and electricity will be extended to 30 April 2025.

Excise duty

There is an increase of $\in 1$ (including VAT) on a packet of 20 cigarettes from 2 October 2024, with a pro-rata increase on other tobacco products. Excise duty will be introduced for e-cigarettes in mid-2025. The rate will be $\in 0.50$ per ml of e-liquid.

Minimum wage

The national minimum wage will increase by 80 cents to €13.50 per hour from 1 January 2025.






Well done also to the class tutor student of the month winners who each received a 5euro voucher for the school canteen.

Our Village Green:

Disappointing to see trees apparently earmarked for retention being cut down.

During the 2022 consultation, most of the 461 submissions focused on plans to remove essential parking spaces between Centra and GP surgery. My motion to overturn this part of the scheme thankfully passed. There was less unanimity on the village green aspect, however, with mixed opinions on the plaza-type proposal aimed at opening the area up and making it safer and more user-friendly.

There were few objections to plans to create access to the riverbank. This requires the installation of wider, graduated steps, for safety reasons, necessitating the removal of trees adjacent. Some trees earmarked for retention appear to be gone also, including the Christmas tree, which is meant to be replanted. Five new ones are earmarked. I am querying this plan with SDCC. The Council needs to replace these trees ASAP and facilitate more greenery overall.

Village Green:

Lucan residents are devastated at what has been done to the Village Green; the destruction, devastation and sacrilege of such a vital picturesque park that was the heart of Lucan for centuries is causing consternation and decent people are wondering what type of planners could do this to a beautiful small village like Lucan. The hacking down of such beautiful trees that were admired by many has left both environmentalists and ordinary people numbed.

The fact that the Italian Residence came into the hands of the Council gave them an opportunity to do something good for Lucan instead of spending public money destroying the very heart of Lucan. There is a feeling the Lucan Cllrs let us down on this issue, they may believe they have a good reason for doing so.

We in Lucan Planning Council did a survey when this plan was proposed two years ago, almost 100 % of Lucan people that we surveyed wanted the village Green left as it was. We found nobody in favour of the trees been removed, but it happened at the same time as a proposal to take parking from the Medical Centre and many focused on that

Now that the harm is done, and some residents left in tears, would the planners and Cllrs please listen to the people of Lucan to help find a solution? The day of good representation could be on the way out if the planners continue to ignore the views of local residents. We sought access from the Dodsboro side for pedestrians over a footbridge, but instead the whole Village Green has been demolished. It is an appalling misuse of public money in our view.

St. Mary's Camera Soirée

Only six more weeks to the Soiree's annual exhibition in the Parish Centre!

While in France, apart from submitting photos of UNESCO Heritage sites, Donal also sent us some cheerful and colourful photographs of Jazz musicians and I particularly like the ones involving the quartet of Trombonists.

These photos reminded me of the short-lived Irish Jazz controversy that occurred on New Year's Day 1934 in Mohill Co. Leitrim. About 3,000 people gathered there to protest about jazz and



especially about the amount of time given to it on Radio Éireann. The event was organised by the parish priest of the village of Cloone who, while admitting he knew nothing about it, described the music as worse than drunkenness or Landlordism. He wasn't alone. In the 1920s and 30s in many countries in the western world Jazz was acquiring a reputation as being immoral amongst the older generations. The New York Time in this era intimated that jazz was responsible for, amongst other things, (a) the decline of western civilization and the quality of Italian tenors, (b) a classical musician's fatal heart attack and (c) a poor trade balance with Hungary. Some American writer considered that Jazz put the "sin" into "syncopation"!



But back to the photos. Conor, as well as submitting photos of beautiful birds that are around Lucan at the moment, was down around Dublin Port and submitted photos reflecting the Port's industrial activity.
