# "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move"

The theme for World Mission Sunday today, is 'Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move'. Pope Francis explains in his message for Mission Sunday: "For this year's World Mission Sunday, I have chosen a theme inspired by the story of the disciples on the way to Emmaus, in the Gospel of Luke (cf. 24:13-35): "Hearts on fire, feet on the move". Those two disciples were confused and dismayed, but their encounter with Christ in the word and in the breaking of the bread sparked in them the enthusiastic desire to set out again towards Jerusalem and proclaim that the Lord had truly risen".

I can certainly recall as child meeting various nuns and priests that were "home from the missions" for their holidays which might only have been once every three years or so. I was always very impressed by their faith and commitment as well as their dedication to the third world countries where they worked. Also, in hindsight, they came over as happy, contented and fulfilled in their missionary work despite the sacrifices they had to make.

We had a family friend who worked as a Spiritan missionary in Sierra Leone for 26 years and, on his visits home, he would tell us stories about travelling around to the various out stations of his vast parish on a motor bike or a pick-up truck and the work he did building schools and hospitals often assisting the workers with his own hands. Unfortunately, there was a serious armed conflict in Sierra Leone in the 1990s and he was caught up in an ambush and was killed along with a number of other people while trying to evacuate a hospital.

Pope Francis concludes his message by saying: "Just as the two disciples of Emmaus told the others what had taken place along the way (cf. Lk 24:35), so too our proclamation will be a joyful telling of Christ the Lord".

Let us pray this weekend for all missionaries whose vocation it is to spread the Gospel far from home. May we be inspired by their example of selfless service and hard work. And let is also reflect on the example of their lives as we try our best to support their work and spread the Gospel in our own parish community.

#### **BUDGET 2024**

#### Help with energy costs

All domestic electricity customers will get €450 off their electricity bills. The energy credit will be paid in 3 instalments of €150. The first payment will be made in December 2023, the second will be made in January 2024 and the third will be made in March 2024.

A €300 once-off lump sum will be paid to people getting Fuel Allowance in November 2023. See 'Social welfare' above.

The reduced 9% VAT rate for gas and electricity will be extended for 12 months to 31 October 2024.

The temporary excise rate reductions on auto diesel, petrol and marked gas oil due to expire on 31 October 2023 will be extended until 31 March 2024.

#### Parent's Benefit

Parent's Benefit will increase from 7 weeks to 9 weeks from August 2024.

#### Carer's Allowance

The Carer's Allowance income disregard will increase to €450 for a single person and €900 for a couple from June 2024.

#### **Domiciliary Care Allowance**

Domiciliary Care Allowance will increase by  $\in 10$  to  $\in 340$  per month from January 2024.

#### **Employment programmes**

People on Community Employment (CE), Tús, Rural Social Scheme or the Work Placement Experience Programme will get an increase of €12 per week from January 2024.

#### Free Travel Scheme

From July 2024, the Free Travel Scheme will be extended to people who are medically certified unfit to drive.

#### Employer and employee PRSI rates

All PRSI contribution rates will increase by 0.1% from 1 October 2024.

#### Minimum wage

The national minimum wage will increase by  $\in 1.40$  to  $\in 12.70$  per hour from 1 January 2024.

Workers not entitled to minimum wage You are not entitled to receive the national minimum wage if you are:

Employed by a close relative (for example, a spouse, civil partner or parent)

In a statutory apprenticeship Aged under 20.

Junior Cycle Results: Congratulations to our students who received their Junior Cycle results on Wednesday 17th October. The students met in the canteen for a lovely breakfast before receiving their results sheet from the principal Mr. Geraghty and Mr. Lyons, who was their Year Head for three years.

Overall, the results were excellent this year with lots of high grades in all subjects. The impressive results reflect very well on the hard work put in by the students over the course of three years that were severely disrupted by Covid regulations. Distinctions (90-100%) were achieved across virtually all subjects, in many cases exceeding the national average.



Joel Emmanuel was our top performer with an outstanding achieved 7 Distinctions (90-100%) and two Higher Merits (75-89%) so well done to him. There were lots of students with numerous Distinctions, which was testament to their application and diligence throughout the past three years.

All students that worked with the Learning Support team all passed their Junior Cycle exams so well done to them also.

Congratulations to all of our students on reaching a significant milestone in their education journey.

1st yr news: Our 1st yr students completed their six-week "Subject Taster" module last Friday which involved them trying out all six subject options available for a week each. The subjects involved are: Metalwork, Wood Technology, French, German, Technical Graphics and Visual Art. Making the decision to study unfamiliar subjects can be daunting at times for our young

students so the taster module allowed them to experience in class the type of learning and skills involved in these subject areas. The students then had to make informed decisions based on their aptitudes and interests by choosing the two subjects that appealed to them the most.

Transition Year: A large group of our Transition Year students enjoyed an adventurous day excursion to Ticknock Forest last Wednesday. They were there to experience their famous Mountain Bike Trail, a network of purpose-built single track trails and forest roads that are designated for use by mountain bikes on a way-marked circular route of approximately 13km in length.

Under the guidance of two experienced instructors, the students went cycling through beautiful forest and heathland with spectacular views over Dublin City, Dublin Bay, Bray Head and the stunning Wicklow Mountains. The students cycled up challenging rocky forest road climbs that tested their leg power, fitness and stamina, before reaching tight, twisty single tracks with loads of adrenaline fuelled descents, tight turns and technical rocky bits.

Unfortunately, the weather was not favourable, with wind and rain throughout the day, but the students till enjoyed being out of class, cycling in the (very fresh!) air getting plenty of exercise. At the end of the cycle, the students rested their somewhat aching muscles and enjoyed some well-earned cappuccinos, hot chocolate and sweet treats at a spectacularly located café, with some sheltered outdoor seating and beautiful views of the coast.

Restart a Heart Day 2023 was held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> October. Ms. Smith is keen to encourage students and staff to participate in CPR training and become equipped with the knowledge and skills needed to respond to emergencies promptly and effectively. To this end, she has set up the Transition Year CPR team of seven students, which aims to train all students in the school on how to carry out CPR. The team is planning a fundraiser in the coming weeks to purchase further CPR manikins. The school currently has five of these but the TY CPR team would like to purchase five more this year.

## **Tidy Towns Competition Results 2023**

(Report continued from last week)

The etrance landscaping (on western / Dodsboro approach) at the welcome sign opposite the car park has a wonderful variety of plant species that include hydrangea, black eyed susan's, wallflowers, sage, agapanthus and hebe. The shrubbery at the entrance to Ardeevin also looked great and it was pleasing to see an emphasis on plant species here that are more likely to occur in the wild – such as buddleia, montbretia, yarrow, blackberry and lambs ear. The newly planted (or recently revamped?) bark based bed at the welcome stone to the north (at the Barnhill Crossroads) is another fine example of entrance landscaping with its black eyed susan's, Russian sage, agapanthus and ladies glove. The large timber planters which were positioned on each corner of the Liffey bridge looked very well and we were glad to note that they were stocked with pollinator friendly varieties such as shrubs, lavender, ladys glove and what appeared to be common hedgenettle. We would also like to commend your committee for the hard work undertaken on the landscaping carried out on the open spaces in Lucan.

We were very impressed with the size of some of the schemes as the long linear beds (such as the shrubberies beside St Edmundsbury Hospital and opposite Ballydowd Grove) offer the potential to become pollinator corridors. We are pleased to read that your committee is also taking a more responsible approach to grass mowing by leaving many areas uncut to promote the growth of pollen rich dandelions and other natural plants.

We were interested to read in your entry form that your committee and volunteers are now responsible for up to 30 planted schemes in your area and that the workload involved in their maintenance is increasing. Given that there are now such a high number of schemes in your care (many of which are extensive in size), we recommend that you take stock of all of your landscaping projects in the year ahead and assess if the maintenance of any of these projects can be delegated to other community-based groups or schools or keen gardeners in your area - as this exercise will enable you to move to a more sustainable work load in the years ahead

A high standard of litter control was visible in Lucan on adjudication day. This is a very good performance and it demonstrates that your regular litter patrols are working well and keeping litter levels down. We also applaud your ongoing collaborations on litter with your junior tidy towns group, Lucan Spring Clean and individual residents and residents groups - as the heightened awareness is also likely to be having a positive influence. The standard of tidiness is generally high with the many public areas, road sides and pathways appearing weed free and neatly swept. However, issues were spotted with signs and signpoles in a number of locations.

We were delighted to see such a wide diversity of residential areas in Lucan - as many different types of residential streets and housing areas could be found. We also enjoyed seeing the numerous mature residential areas in Lucan that included Sarsfield Close (with its attractive and well maintained central amenity area), Sarsfield Park with its entrance planting, linear green area and mature trees while Esker Lane also looked very well with its name stone, entrance green and tree planting. Both Chalet Gardens and Ballydowd Grove impressed with their name stones, trimmed grass verges and mature trees while Lucan Heights also stood out. The high quality landscaping schemes to be seen at the entrance to Ardeevin (with its large entrance shrubbery and rose bed) are also eye catching features – so well done to all concerned.

The approach roads into Lucan generally achieve a high standard of presentation. The eastern entrance (past Edmondsbury Hospital) forms a lovely approach to your area with its name stone, entrance planting, abundant shrubberies and landscaping – all of which create a very positive impression for the visitor. The approach from the north (via the historic single span Liffey Bridge) is similarly impressive with its entrance name stone, planters, mature trees and views of the Weir and the river Liffey.


