## Mind your language!

The words which we say and those which we don't say make a difference on our own experience of life, our own effect on life and on how smoothly relationships work. Our thoughts are part of what causes our feelings with our words (expressed or living on our heads!) the bridge directing our next steps from the thoughts and feelings.

My own father refused, and refuses, to acknowledge that there was such a word as 'problem'! Instead he would say that there is a 'solution to be found' right now! Infirmities of old age have taken the gift of speech away from him along with the ability to talk out the journey towards solutions. However, he continues to function in such a manner, daily, that works to find how to live well with his disabilities and to live well with everyone whom he encounters. Carers leave his room with a smile on their faces. He uses determined resilience to make the best of every single day, experience and even infirmity. He walks quietly and sits quietly working out this phase of life to its' best form of lived experience.

Words are frequently used with brutal force on social media platforms. Often there is no regard for the possible vulnerabilities of the human being about which they are written. Such postings are also a reflection of the person of the sender! Harsh judgments are delivered outside of boundaries and context concerned. We also beat ourselves up with an inner voice whereby we condemn ourselves for an action, failure, word or behaviour that we wish had been different. We may walk with body language that nearly draws us into the ground rather than reaches up into growth and possibility!

The circumstances in which we find ourselves are sometimes beyond our control, but how we deal with them are within our control for as long as we have the capacity to think. If we can't use words, the nature of touch, a smile, our gratitude and respect for self and others can be delivered in such a manner that we and the person whom we are encountering can engage well and part company in better form. We know what it is like to receive bad news and know how important the words and expression of delivery can make all the difference to how we start the next moment onwards.

The solutions that we need to find for today, may not be the solution that bring us on a long journey, but may be part of a crazy paving that will make a link that we can't yet see! If there is one word or attitude that builds walls to sight of a way forward, or to a solution which could make today a better day, let's be conscious of them and place them down when they bounce up in front of us!

## The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance (BSCFA) is an annual once-off

payment that can help with the costs of books and uniforms for school children. You may qualify for the BSCFA if you meet the income requirements. Information is on our website.

## Part-time fee scheme for certain Undergraduate Courses

I'm starting a part-time course in September. Can I get a student grant?

The Student Grant Scheme is only available to students studying full-time courses.

However, if you're starting an eligible part-time undergraduate course, you may get financial support with fees under the part-time fee scheme.

The scheme is new for the 2024-2025 academic year and applies to students studying approved part-time undergraduate courses. It only offers support with fees and is not a maintenance grant.

The scheme is awarded by Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI), the same body that awards the Student Grant Scheme.

#### *How do I qualify for the part-time fee scheme?*

Like the Student Grant Scheme, you must be studying an approved course, be progressing in education, and you can't have exceeded the maximum period of grant assistance available to you. You must also pass a means test and meet conditions around nationality and residence.

## How much can I get from the part-time fee scheme?

You get a fee contribution based on the number of credits you take during the academic year. SUSI pays the contribution directly to your college, so if your course costs more than what you're eligible for, you will have to pay the difference.

For example, if you're doing a course worth 16 credits which costs  $\in$  3,000, SUSI will pay your college  $\in$  2,250 (as this is what you would be eligible for), and you will pay the balance of  $\in$  750.

If your course costs less than the amount you're eligible for, SUSI will pay your college directly and you don't need to do anything else. You do not receive the balance in this scenario.

#### How do I apply?

You must create an account in the SUSI student portal to apply. You can read SUSI's new application form guide for help with creating an account and completing the application form.

You may receive a letter from SUSI asking you to submit documents as part of your application. You should send photocopies (not originals) of your documents to P.O. Box 869, Little Island, Cork.

Applications for the part-time fee scheme opened on 1 August 2024. The closing date for SUSI grant applications is usually early November. More information is available on our website.

## Has your package holiday been cancelled?

A replacement holiday of the same or better quality

A lower grade holiday, with a refund of the price difference

A full refund within 14 days


## **Bethany Bereavement Support Group:**

## **Lucan Planning Council**

Metro for Lucan campaign- a very successful launch last Sunday on village green Our campaign for rail link direct to Dublin Airport and to all areas with rail got off to a great start at Lucan Festival with almost 100% support for the project from those who visited our stand. For our plan to be successful it just needs a new rail line from existing rail lines at Glasnevin to Donabate via Dublin Airport and Swords, a Metro Dart. This short rail connection (less than 20 kms) will allow all areas of Ireland both north and south with rail to have direct access to Dublin Airport. Lucan will benefit hugely because our rail line will connect up at and go directly to Dublin Airport from Adamstown and Kishogue and Clondalkin (Fonthill). As this benefits the whole country we expect great support from all areas, it is a win win for all. We want to thank the Lucan Festival for giving us the opportunity to get the campaign up and running. We want to thank those who took screen shots of the map and undertook to spread it on social media. We are taking this campaign a lot further as its a huge return on investment of less than twenty kilometers of rail along a route already approved by the NTA.

#### Traffic issues locally:

1 Thanks to all who are contacting Cllrs and SDCC re Griffeen Ave roundabout solution. We are also on the doors promoting this currently and appreciate the positive response. We ask local people to use their voice and promote the solution which is in last week's Newsletter and available on line.

2 The village traffic is a hot topic at the moment and a traffic survey is needed to confirm the large numbers of vehicles avoiding the toll and making life difficult for Lucan residents. Moving the toll past the Castleknock exit where road networks have been built to take traffic volumes could be put to local politicians. 

## St. Mary's Camera Soirée

All going well the members of St. Mary's Camera Soiree will mount their 12<sup>th</sup> Photography Exhibition in the Parish Centre on the weekend of 23<sup>rd</sup>/24<sup>th</sup> November 2024.

Lots of photos taken at the Lucan Festival last weekend were submitted and I particularly liked the one of the multitude of colourful balloons submitted by Frances.





Autumn has suddenly arrived and has been captured in photographs submitted by Kay. Even as the cool weather creeps in Josie managed to photograph a bee on one of the flowers in her garden. I for one have not seen many bees this summer but maybe I have the wrong flowering plants in my garden to attract them. There are apparently over 20,000 known species of bee in seven recognised biological families but less than 10% of them live in colonies. Surprisingly the vast majority of them are solitary creatures.

Frances submitted a photograph of Fore Abbey, the ruins of a Benedictine and Early Gaelic 7th century Abbey associated with St. Feichin who founded the Abbev in the 7<sup>th</sup> century. In the 13<sup>th</sup> century Hugh de Lacy, Lord of Meath built a Benedictine monastery near the Gaelic monastery. Many of the ruins that remain today are from the 13th and 15th century and the 13th century church still has some painted plaster decorations in the church. The ruins are situated to the north of Lough Lene in County Westmeath, adjacent to Fore village. Fore Abbey and



environs are one of the largest group of Benedictine and other ecclesiastical ruins remaining in Ireland.
