## It's Really, Really, Really Not Fair!

Life will never be experienced as fair no matter where we are or who we are. However, what not being fair means varies enormously!

We live in a wealthy country, even though that wealth is not evenly distributed. We live in a materialistic society where what we consider as basics, are sheer luxuries in some of our homes locally and in many of our countries all over the world. For the most part, we can flick a switch for electricity, hot water and the most modern of communication methods. All levels of education are available to us, with steps up for those who struggle, while we allow for the influence of the reality of particular homes. Education gives ultimate freedom and access to all that is available to us in all realms of life.

We have welcomed Bishop Francis Kibiri among us from Kasese Diocese in Uganda, the same diocese as our own Fr Ubaldo Muhindo. Bishop Kibiri has spoken of the endemic poverty which exists in his country where the infrastructure concerning roads, schools, hospital, etc lags behind what is needed to reach most basic needs. However, as in Ireland when poverty was endemic in pre and post Second World War periods up to the sixties, the people are generous in their support of one another and communities, giving from what they have in terms of material support and sharing of skills.

The cost of supporting a young person through a year at college (or education leading to priesthood) is the equivalent of  $\in$ 500 per year. The cost in Ireland is probably  $\in$ 10000 to include accommodation. However, the value of that  $\in$ 500 in Uganda is incomparably prohibitive as it relates to approximately half a year's earnings for an average worker. Many depend on their farming produce, so that barter operates more than cash exchange, with the opportunity to have money for a more than basic education being unlikely for most.

Many generous people, in Lucan, have made contribution to the collection for money to support the education of men who are studying for the priesthood in Kasese diocese. This will make a huge difference to their families and to their communities. The collection is taking place in St Mary's Parish.

While considering the differences between subsistence levels in Uganda (as one of many countries) and in Ireland, the most striking aspect to reflect on is about what resources we actually have in our country, free to all! I certainly don't often notice how fortunate I am and take much for granted.

Anything that we can do to level the gap between those who have and those who have not in our community, locally and our community internationally, can transform the lives of many. Thank God for what we have! May we keep our hearts and eyes open for our brothers and sisters no matter where they live!

This year's theme for Fire Safety Week is: "We didn't start the Fire" – But what did?!"

National Fire Safety Week will kick off on Monday September 30th. This year #24FSW aims to enhance fire safety, particularly in the home. In the new blended working world many of us are spending more time at home so it is more important than ever that we are all informed as to the steps we can take to protect ourselves and our homes from fire. This year, for Fire Safety Week, our focus will be on preventing fires in the home by understanding their common causes and taking steps to stop them before they start. Once a fire starts, it can be relentless, so it's crucial to do everything possible to prevent one.

## **Together We Can STOP Fire**

**STOP** stands for:

**S** – is for Smoke alarms. Make sure you have at least one on every level/floor.

**T** – is for Test your smoke alarms weekly or ask someone to check it for you.

O – is for Obvious dangers. Look out for fire risks like overloaded sockets, candles and unattended appliances.

**P** – is for Plan your escape route. Keep access routes clear and have your keys at the ready.

Avoid:

Smoking when tired
Leaving burning candles unattended
Leaving young children unattended
Leaving matches and lighters where children can
get them

Leaving chip pans, frying pans, etc. unattended Standing too close to fires, heaters, etc. Using faulty electrical appliances Overloading sockets

Make sure to:

Have your chimney cleaned at least once a year Use a spark guard with open fires Use proper holders when burning candles Keep ashtrays empty when not in use Have a suitable fire extinguisher and fire blanket in your kitchen

Have faulty electrical appliances repaired or replaced immediately

Close all doors at night time

Carry out a routine fire safety check before going

to bed



They have already demonstrated excellent initiative, organisational skills and leadership.

**Pool:** A pool table was set up in room 4 during lunchtime for  $6^{th}$  yr students on Tuesday. The table will be available throughout the year for the students and provides them with a nice space to unwind and socialise with their friends. There are plenty of talented pool players in  $6^{th}$  yr so the standard has already been very good. There will

be a competition organised for the  $6^{th}$  yrs later in the year.

Home Economics: Our 1<sup>st</sup> yr students are really enjoying their Home Economics subject options week, where they are being introduced to the subject with fun, engaging lessons that cover the basics of food safety, kitchen organisation and simple, healthy recipes. The state-of-the-art Home Economics room provides a modern, welcoming space where the students can develop their culinary skills, from basic meal preparation to advanced cooking techniques.

Meanwhile, our Transition Year students are loving their Home Economics module where they are learning to cook dishes with Ms. Woulfe and explore the broader aspects of the subject, such as sustainability, budgeting and nutrition. The students are enjoying picking up numerous practical skills that will benefit them throughout their lives. They are learning how to organise and be responsible for their own preparation for the cooking lessons. They are also learning how to work in an efficient, hygienic and safe manner when demonstrating practical culinary skills. This week they learned how to cook a chicken and choriza pasta. Some covered their finished product in a velvety, super flavourful tomato and

cream sauce, making for an absolutely delicious meal! They are all looking forward to shocking their families somewhat by showing off their impressive new cooking skills at home!

Wood Technology: In Wood Technology, our 1st yr students are learning how to make pencil holders during their subject options week. They are getting a brief introduction from Mr. Flynn to the practical side of the subject at Junior Cycle. The students are learning basic marking out skills to mark out their piece before then using a hard plane to shape the wood to the desired design. They are also being introduced to the pillar drill, as they will learn to drill three holes in the wood to hold the pencils, as well as the Pyrography Machine, which allows them to burn in their name, favourite football team, their favourite hobby or other interesting designs, into the wood. They are, of course, learning the essential safety skills involved in the operation of the machines. The students are then free to add some colour to their pencil holders using colouring pencils. The final stage involves adding a coat of varnish to protect the pencil holder to ensure that their final practical and elegant product looks good for many years ahead in Coláiste Phádraig.



The minimum purchase price for a lower duplex is €286,940. The minimum purchase price for a 3bed terrace is €306,940. The prices are about 20% less than the market value. Typical gross household income limits for purchasers have been estimated as between €69.221 and €73.046 based on the purchase prices. Note also that the Help to Buy Scheme can be used towards the deposit and the Local Authority Homeloan can be availed of by those who meet the criteria for the loan. This is a very small Affordable Housing scheme, and many applicants for it may not be successful this time around but there will be more like this, including at Clonburris, so keep an eye out on the 'Affordable Homes' section of sdcc.ie for future schemes.




