A Welcome Visitor to Lucan

We are delighted to welcome Bishop Francis Kibira, Bishop of the diocese of Kasese in Uganda, on a visit to Lucan. Bishop Francis heads the home diocese of Fr. Ubaldo Muhindo and Fr. Dominic Kwikiriza (who now ministers in Beaumont parish).

Kasese Diocese is located in the western part of Uganda. It falls under the ecclesiastical province of Mbarara. The diocese was established on March 6, 1989, and covers a total area of approximately 3,205 square kilometers. Bishop Francis is the second Bishop to serve there and was appointed on April 15th 2014. Many of the parishes in Kasese are in a remote mountainous region where access poses something of a challenge.

While Ireland is experiencing something of a 'vocations famine' at present, the church in many parts of the developing work is

flourishing, and Uganda is no exception. Seminaries are full, and there are many young women entering religious life. Uganda is a developing nation and the per capita income is low, so money is in short supply.

The annual cost of supporting a student for the priesthood in Uganda is, in Irish terms, quite low, just €500, but even this relatively small amount poses a significant challenge for a developing church.

Could you help?

If you would be willing to support a student for the priesthood in the Diocese of Kasese it would be of great help. On the week-end of September 21st and 22nd we will make available in our parishes some pre-printed envelopes for that purpose. Your support would be a great expression of gratitude to Bishop Francis for his generosity in allowing Fr. Ubaldo and Fr. Dominic to minister among us, and a significant gesture of solidarity with a developing church.

Fruits of Irish missionary endeavour

For many years past, Irish Missionaries were instrumental in bringing the faith to many parts of the world. The Irish missionary tradition goes back centuries, and we can be rightly proud of the many women and men who spent their lives so that others might come to faith in Jesus.

Perhaps what we see in recent times represents the fruits of the Irish missionary thrust. Priests from Africa, India and many other places where our missionaries laboured have come to minister among us. They bring with them the vibrancy and commitment of a young church, and we have much to learn from them. Any support you can offer will be of great help.

Working with a Disability - New Supports

What is the Work and Access Programme? Work and Access is an employment programme that helps people with disabilities find or keep a job. It offers funding to adjust workplaces and make them more accessible. This new programme replaces the old Reasonable Accommodation Fund and the Disability Awareness Support Scheme.

Who can apply?

Funding is available to qualifying job candidates, employees, self-employed people, and employers. To be eligible, you must be over 18 and: Have the right to work in Ireland Be working, looking for work, or self-employed in Ireland (specific criteria apply) Have a disability or long-term health condition expected to last over 12 months Employers in the private, community, voluntary, and not-for-profit sectors can apply.

What supports are available?

There are 7 categories of Work and Access support:

Workplace Needs Assessment: Up to €2,500 for hiring a specialist to assess workplace needs and up to 10 hours of communication support.

Communication Support: Assistance during job interviews and induction, with up to 24 hours of in-work support a year.

In-Work Support: Up to €12,500 a year for hiring a specialist support worker and up to 30 hours of communication support.

Personal Reader: Up to €12,500 a year for work-related reading assistance for the visually impaired.

Work Equipment: Up to €12,000 for assistive equipment or technology, including training if needed.

Workplace Adaptation: Up to €25,000 for adapting business premises or equipment. Disability Equality and Inclusion Training: Up to €20,000 a year for training costs, covering 90% for certified courses and 80% for non-certified courses.

How to apply

The Department of Social Protection (DSP) is developing an online application process. In the meantime, applicants can request forms from their local Intreo Office or download them from gov.ie. *Individuals*: Complete the WA1 form and submit it by post or email it to

WorkandAccess@welfare.ie.

Employers: Complete the WA2 form and follow the same submission process.

Your pharmacist can now extend your prescription

From 1 September 2024, if you have a 6-month prescription, you may be able to get your pharmacist to extend your prescription for a 12-month period in total.

Your 6-month prescription must be dated 1 March 2024 or later. Prescriptions that are written after 1 March 2024 for other periods cannot be extended by a pharmacist.

An extension will not be automatic and certain medications will not be eligible.

The change means you won't always need to see your GP to get your prescription extended.



Magic Roundabout problem

The area that has been nicknamed the Magic Roundabout is a section of roadway from where Griffeen Ave and Griffeen Road meet at a roundabout to entrance of a new school about 200 metres from the outer ring road R 136.

This small section (200 metres) causes major traffic congestion especially during school terms. There is a simple solution that we put to the local councillors and South Dublin County Council planning officials.

The solution is to allow existing road space of the two lanes from the roundabout at school entrance where Griffeen Ave and Griffeen Road meet the Outer Ring Road R136 to operate both lanes towards R136. Leave the trees in the centre and construct at least one new road traffic lane from R136 to this roundabout. The land is undeveloped and sitting there.

The answer we continual get is we can't do anything until this land has been developed. This land is now in the process of development and action must be taken now to ensure this major traffic congestion is addressed.

It doesn't require much land from this development as the existing ditch is quite wide. This is a wonderful opportunity to solve this major traffic problem.

Lucan Planning Council are now asking residents to contact SDCC and their local Cllrs offering this solution and demanding action while development is taking place. This impacts hundreds of households who are delayed at rush hour at the Magic Roundabout.



The Wade family's Amy 17, Ryan 15 and Abbie 12) from Lucan have just returned from the WAKO World Kickboxing Championships in Hungary held in Budapest.

They train in the well renowned Cabra club - KKC (Korean Kickboxing Club Cabra) under the guidance of some great coaches there.



Amazingly they managed to get to 3 semi-finals and 2 finals, culminating in 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 3 Bronze medals making them the talk of the tournament.

To put it into perspective there were 77 Irish fighters in total for the Irish Squad (KBI - KickBoxing Ireland) in all divisions and weight classes, with an impressive 34 medals that the Irish Squad came home with, 5 of them from the Wade Trio alone.

Abbie the youngest of the siblings, became a World Champion!!!!

They all trained very hard over the summer and sacrificed a lot to first of all make the Irish team and second to do so well.

An extraordinary accomplishment from 3 siblings from the same World Championship which is a very rare achievement.

They receive no funding from the Irish Government unlike the other National teams they are up against and still managed to not only compete with the best in the World but also beat them.



Leaving Cert Results: Congratulations to all of our Leaving Cert students who received their exam results on Friday 23rd August. In total, eight of our students attained over 600 points. This represented 8% of the total number of our students, which was impressively higher than the National Average of 5%. Two of our students, Ahmad Hassan and Yeldo Joseph Saji, achieved the maximum of 625 points (6 H1s plus 25 bonus points for a H1 in Higher Level Maths). A further 14 students got over 500 points, (representing 14% of our total) and another 25 students got over 400points. So, 47% of our students got between 400 and 625 points, which was a fantastic return.

Of course, it was not all about the high achievers on Results Day. The Learning Support Department are especially proud of the achievements of the students who they worked with over the years. Every student that availed of Learning Support passed their Leaving Cert in style this year so well done to each and every one of the students involved.

School news: Our new Home Economics Room is finally officially open, after the water, electricity and heating were completed over the summer months, and it is already proving to be a huge hit with students! Home Economics combines aspects of Science, Nutrition, Consumer and Social Studies as well as practical culinary and textile skills. Currently it is being offered as an option subject for 1st yrs and a module for Transition Year. When the current 1st yrs are in 3rd yr, they will sit a practical food skills exam, which will be worth 50% of the marks, and a written exam (worth the other 50%) for their Junior Cycle. If they wish, they can also then select Home Economics as a Leaving Cert subject when they reach 5th yr.

The room looks fantastic with its individual work benches, group work zones, state-of-the-art cookers, fridges, microwaves, washing machines, presses, store areas, bespoke furniture, kitchen and cooking equipment etc. Clearly, Home Economics is a very hands-on, practical subject where students can learn so many essential lifeskills that can serve them well for the rest of their lives.

It promises to be a wonderful addition to the school and it is sure to be a very popular choice for students selecting their options.

Staff news: We would like to congratulate Tom O' Meara on his appointment as principal of Coláiste Phádraig. We have no doubt that the school will continue to thrive and develop under

his leadership in the months and years ahead. The students and staff look forward to seeing the positive impact that he will undoubtedly make in his new role. Former principal Mr. Brady (2014-2023) was briefly on the school grounds last Friday morning and it was great (and a little nostalgic!) to see him deep in conversation with our new principal, no doubt offering some helpful words of advice and guidance on the 1st day of regular school for all students.

Our new principal was also particularly struck by the inclusive school environment in Coláiste Phádraig and how every single student is valued and respected for who they are. Over the past few years



especially, our students have learned to embrace diversity, acknowledge and celebrate differences, dismantle barriers and to prioritise tolerance, empathy and inclusivity. 



St. Mary's Camera Soirée

The Camera Soiree resumed its Friday morning sessions this weekend and are beginning preparations for their exhibition scheduled for a weekend in November.

This week we have a photograph of a rose, maybe the "last rose of summer" from Kay. The poem of the same name is by Thomas Moore and was set to a traditional tune called "Aisling an Óigfhear" which had been transcribed by the Belfast folk collector Edward Bunting in 1792. The tune has been used by many composers including Beethoven, Mendelssohn and Flotow in his opera "Martha".
